

# Campground Reminders

## Public Reminders

All campgrounds on Beaver lake are governed by federal law ([Title 36, CHAPTER III, PART 327](#)). These are rules and regulations that govern public use of water resource development projects administered by the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Chief of Engineers. The following rules cited below are partial, but specifically apply to users at Beaver Lake.

327.2 - The operation of any vehicle off established roadways is prohibited.

327.7 - (a) Camping is permitted only at sites and/or areas designated by the District Commander.

(b) Camping at one or more campsites at any one water resource project for a period longer than 14 days during any 30-consecutive-day period is prohibited without the written permission of the District Commander.

(c) The unauthorized placement of camping equipment or other items on a campsite and/or personal appearance at a campsite with daily occupancy for the purpose of reserving that campsite for future occupancy is prohibited.

(d) The digging or leveling of any ground or the construction of any structure without written permission of the District Commander is prohibited.

(e) Occupying or placement of any camping equipment at a campsite which is posted or otherwise marked or indicated as "reserved" without an authorized reservation for that site is prohibited.

327.9 - Garbage, trash, rubbish, litter or waste material must be removed from the project or deposited in trash containers located in each park.

327.10 - Fires shall be confined at designated sites, and contained in fire rings, grills or other facilities designed for that purpose.

327.12 - Quiet hours are between the hours of 10:00 p.m. and 6:00 a.m.

327.13 - Possession of loaded firearms, ammunition, projectile firing devices, bows and arrows, and explosives of any kind is prohibited.

327.14 - Destruction, injury, defacement, or removal of public property, including Natural features, historical and archeological features, and vegetation is prohibited.

## **HANDICAP ACCESSIBILITY**

The Corps of Engineers is committed to providing universal access so that the lake facilities will be available to the wildest possible range of visitors, including people with disabilities. Beaver Lake has the following accessible facilities:

All group picnic shelters are handicap accessible.

### **Dam Site Lake**

Description: Class A park with toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camping sites, trash containers, boat ramp, swim beach, hiking trail, and drinking water. Dam Site Lake's campsites are non-reservable and are occupied on a first-come first-serve basis. The group shelter located at the cut-off wall approximately ¼ mile from the campground is available for reservation April 1 – October 31. Dam Site Lake Park is adjacent to Beaver Dam with most campsites located on an island accessed by a causeway. All campsites are within easy walking distance to the shoreline if not immediately adjacent to the water.

Location: Dam Site Lake is located 9 miles west of Eureka Springs on U.S. Highway 62, then 3 miles south on paved access road State 187 to dam.

Facilities: 48 campsites with electricity. 1 reservable group shelter.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18 and campsites with 50 amp electricity are \$19. one group shelter at \$75 (note: In addition to the \$75 shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Day Use Fee).

Open: Recreation season, April 1 - October 31. Closed, November 1 – March 31.

### **Dam Site River**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets/showers (new 2009), trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramps, trash containers, and drinking water. All 59 campsites

are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov). Dam Site River Park is a part of the Dam Site Park and includes Riverview, Pines and Parker Bottoms Camping loops. The campground loops are adjacent to the White River below Beaver Dam. Visitors have the opportunity to fish for rainbow and brown trout, canoeing and river boating.

Location: Dam Site River is located 9 miles west of Eureka Springs on U.S. Highway 62, then 2.5 miles south on paved access road State 187 to dam.

Facilities: 58 campsites with electricity. Sites 1-12 have 50 amp electric and water to each site.

Fees: Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18 and campsites with 50 amp electricity and water are \$20.

Open: Recreation season, April 1 - October 31. Winter season (limited campsites and amenities available), November 1 – March 31.

## **Hickory Creek**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramps, swim beach, trash containers, playgrounds, and drinking water. Many campsites are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](https://www.recreation.gov). Two group shelters and five multi-family shelters are located in the day use area and are available for reservation year round. A multipurpose field for soccer, football, etc. is located in the day use area. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: Hickory Creek is located 1 mile north of Springdale on U.S. Highway 71, then 7 miles east on State Highway 264, then 1 mile north on Benton County Road 602.

Facilities: 61 campsites with 50 amp electricity. 2 reservable group shelters and 5 multi-family shelters.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites are \$19. Reservable group shelters are \$75 and reservable multi-family shelters are \$25 (note: In addition to the \$75 or \$25 shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Use Fee).

Open: Recreation season, April 1 - October 31. Winter season (limited campsites and amenities available), November 1 – March 31.

## **Horseshoe Bend**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramps, swim beaches, trash containers, playgrounds, walking trail and drinking water. Several campsites are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](http://Recreation.gov). Two group shelters are located in the day use area and one group shelter is located in the campground. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: Horseshoe Bend is located 5 miles east of Rogers on State Highway 94.

Facilities: 185 campsites with electricity. 3 reservable group shelters.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18, campsites with 50 amp electricity are \$19, campsites with 50 amp electricity and water are \$20, double campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$36; triple campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$45 and primitive campsites with no electricity are \$12. Reservable group shelters are \$75 (note: In addition to the \$75 shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Use Fee).

Open: Recreation season, April 1 – October 31. Winter season (limited campsites and amenities available), November 1 – March 31.

## **Indian Creek**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramps, swim beach, trash containers, playground, hiking trail, sand volleyball, and drinking water. Indian Creek's campsites are non-reservable and are occupied on a first-come first-serve basis. Indian Creek is known for clear water and is a popular area for scuba diving. Many campsites are within view of Beaver Dam.

Location: Indian Creek is located 5 miles east of Gateway, then 4 miles south on Benton County Road 89.

Facilities: 33 campsites with electricity.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18.

Open: Recreation season, May 1 - September 30. Closed, November 1 – April 30.

### **Lost Bridge North**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramp, swim beach, trash containers, hiking trail, and drinking water. All 48 campsites are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](#). There is a primitive youth camping area for use by small groups and is available for reservation year round through the NRRS. A full service marina is located within the park. A six mile hiking trail highlighting rock outcroppings, oak/hickory forest, and historical Ozark home site begins and ends in the park.

Location: Lost Bridge North is located 6 miles southeast of Garfield on State Highway 127.

Facilities: 48 campsites with electricity. Reservable Primitive Camping Area.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18. Reservable primitive camping area are \$40 (includes group shelter).

Open: Recreation season, April 1 - September 30. Winter season (limited campsites and amenities available), October 1 – March 31

### **Lost Bridge South**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets/showers (new 2008), trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramp, swim beach, trash containers, playground, hiking trail and drinking water. Several campsites are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](#). All campsites within this park have a view of the water. Many campsites are adjacent to the water's edge, those that are not are an easy walk from the water.

Location: Lost Bridge South is located 5 miles southeast of Garfield on State Highway 127.

Facilities: 36 campsites with electricity.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 50 amp electricity are \$19 and campsites with 50 amp electric and water are \$20.

Open: Recreation season, May 1 - September 30. Closed, October 1 – April 30.

## **Prairie Creek**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramp, swim beach, trash containers, hiking trail, playgrounds, universal accessible fishing dock, and drinking water. All 112 campsites are available for reservation through the [Recreation.gov](#). Three group shelters and three multi-family shelters are located in the day use area and are available for reservation through [Recreation.gov](#) year round. The Prairie Creek Grand Shelter has a capacity of 300 persons, and is located in the day use area and is available for reservation through the Beaver Lake Project Office year round. Make reservations by calling the Beaver Project Office at (479) 636-1210. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: Prairie Creek is located 4 miles east of Rogers on State Highway 12, then 1 mile on access road.

Facilities: 112 campsites with electricity. 3 group shelters, 3 multi-family shelters, and 1 grand shelter.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18 and campsites with 50 amp electric are \$19 and campsites with 50 amp electricity and water are \$20. reservable group shelters are \$75 or \$60, reservable multi-family shelters are \$25, and the reservable Prairie Creek Grand Shelter is \$200 (note: The 300-person Grand Shelter has a full kitchen, serving station, restrooms, PA system, and stereo. In addition to any shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Use Fee).

Open: Recreation season, April 1 - October 31. Winter season (limited campsites and amenities), November 1 – March 31.

## **Rocky Branch**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramps, swim beach, trash containers, hiking trail, playground and drinking water. Rocky Branch's campsites are non-reservable and are occupied on a first-

come first-serve basis. Two group shelters are available for reservation year round. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: Rocky Branch is located 11 miles east of Rogers on State Highway 12, then 4.5 miles northeast on State Highway 303.

Facilities: 44 campsites with electricity. 2 group shelters.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18 and campsites with 50 amp electricity are \$19. Reservable group shelters is \$75 (note: In addition to the \$75 shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Use Fee.

Open: Recreation season, May 1 - October 31. Closed, October 1 – April 30.

## **Starkey**

Description: Class A park with toilets, shower, trailer dump station, designated camp sites, boat ramp, trash containers, playground and drinking water. Starkey's campsites are non-reservable and are occupied on a first-come first-serve basis. The group shelter is available for reservation year round. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: Starkey is located 4 miles west of Eureka Springs on U.S. Highway 62, then 4 miles southwest on State Highway 187, then 4 miles southwest on Carroll County Road 2176.

Facilities: 16 campsites with 30 amp electricity. 7 campsites with 30 amp electric, water and sewer. 1 group shelter.

Fees: Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18. Campsites with 30 amp electricity, water and sewer are \$21. Reservable group shelter is \$75. There are no area fees. The launch fee is \$3.

Open: Recreation season, May 1 - September 8. Closed, September 9 – April 31.

## **War Eagle**

Description: Class A park with flush toilets, showers, trailer dump station, designated

camp sites, boat ramp, swim beach, trash containers, playground, and drinking water. War Eagle's campsites are non-reservable and are occupied on a first-come first-serve basis. The group shelter is located near the campground and is available for reservation year round. War Eagle Park is located on the upper end of Beaver Lake and is a popular campground for those wanting boat, fish, and view the War Eagle and upper White River arms of Beaver Lake. A full service marina is located within the park.

Location: War Eagle is located 10 miles east of Springdale on State Highway 412, then 3 miles north on Washington County Road 95.

Facilities: 26 campsites with electricity. 1 group shelter.

Fees: Day use fee applies. Campsites with 30 amp electricity are \$18. Reservable group shelter is \$75 (note: In addition to the \$75 shelter reservation fee, each vehicle is required to pay a \$4 Area Use Fee.

Open: Fee season, May 1 - September 8. Winter season, November 1 – April 31.

## **Park Attendant Contracts**

Park Attendant contracts are a vital part of the Corps of Engineers recreation program. These are private individuals who work under contract for the Corps of Engineers. Contracts at Beaver Lake require a two-person team.

Some of the responsibilities include registering campers and visitors, posting campsite reservations, providing information to the visiting public, or cleaning the park. Park attendants are provided a camp site free of charge by the Corps of Engineers. The camping site includes electrical, water, private phone line, and sewer service. Park attendants who are interested in bidding on contracts should first visit the Little Rock District Contracting homepage (<http://www.swl.usace.army.mil/contracting/index.html>) for information on how to register and receive requests for bids.

Prospective bidders are required to supply a DUNS number (obtained from Duns and Bradstreet at 1-800-335-0505 or on their website. After receipt of the DUNS number, contractors must be registered in the Central Contractor Registration (CCR) Database prior to any award. Lack of registration in the CCR database will make an offeror ineligible for award. The CCR Web site may be accessed at <http://www.ccr.gov>. A paper form for registration may be obtained from the DoD Electronic Commerce Information Center at (800) 334-3414 or email [dodedi@acq.osd.mil](mailto:dodedi@acq.osd.mil). Contracts will not be awarded to bidders who are not registered. Once you are registered with CCR, you will receive a Trading Partner Identification Number (TPIN) and issued a Commercial and Government Entity (CAGE). The CAGE code is required when the bid is submitted. The TPIN is proof that you are registered.
