# **PROHIBITED ACTIVITIES**

To assure your outing is enjoyable and safe, please remember it is <u>your responsibility to be aware</u> of hunting and public use regulations and private property boundaries. Activities <u>not permitted</u> on Corps of Engineers land include:

- Littering
- Off road motorized vehicles
- Operating vehicles through, around or beyond a restrictive sign, barricade, fence, or traffic control barrier
- Offsite camping
- Open campfires
- Tree cutting
- Removing artifacts
- Improper disposal of lighted smoking materials, matches or other burning material
- Hunting in violation of any State regulation
- Trespassing on adjacent private lands

# HUNTING REGULATIONS GUIDE



## U.S. Army Corps of Engineers, Dierks Lake Project Office

This hunting regulations guide only covers the basic regulations. For detailed regulations please refer to the Arkansas Hunting Guidebook or the official Arkansas Game and Fish Commission Code of Regulations available at http://www.agfc.com/rules-regulations.

All persons are required to hunt in accordance with all applicable State and Federal regulations.

Dierks Lake, located in Howard and Sevier Counties in Arkansas, began construction in 1968 for flood control. The public land around the lake includes approximately 1200 acres of forest that serves as excellent habitat for wildlife. Most of the area is open to hunting, fishing, wildlife viewing, and nature photography; however, hunting is not allowed within recreational park boundaries and service areas.

### Hunting Regulations

**Important**: For your safety and the safety of others, No hunting is allowed within 100 feet from the center of any city, county, state, or federally maintained road and you may not shoot across such roads. Hunting is not allowed within 300yds of any developed recreational area or other structure.

Motorized Vehicles: All motorized vehicles must remain on maintained roads and parking areas. The use of off-road vehicles is not permitted.

<u>Deer/Turkey Stands</u>: Permanent blinds may not be constructed on the area. Portable blinds such as lock-on stands, climbing stands and lean to ladder stands may be left standing from one week prior to the first day of archery season to one week after the last day of archery season, but must be labeled with name and phone number. No nails, spikes, screws, or other objects may be driven into trees. A safety belt or harness is required.

Feral Hog Hunting: Feral hog hunting is allowed on Dierks Lake. Hogs may be harvested year round but the use of dogs is strictly prohibited. Traps may be utilized once a permit is received from the Dierks Lake Office. All hogs trapped must be harvested on site prior to removal from project lands. Rabbit: Dogs allowed except
during firearms deer season.
Squirrel: Dogs allowed except
during firearms deer season.
Waterfowl: Shooting hours are 30
minutes before sunrise until
sunset.

Refer to the Arkansas Hunting Guidebook for **WMA Furbearer** regulations.

Note: Much of Dierks Lake consist of narrow strips of government property. It is suggested that hunters pay close attention to government boundary lines marked by red paint to avoid trespassing onto adjacent landowners.

#### Additional Area Regulations

DEER NOTES: No dogs allowed. Seasonal bag limit 4, no more than 2 legal bucks (Three Point Rule) or up to 4 does may be taken. Spring Turkey: - Set annually by AGFC.
