

AIDS TO NAVIGATION ON THE ARKANSAS RIVER

AS SEEN IN THE DIRECTION OF RIVER FLOW (DESCENDING)

LEFT SIDE
White or Red Lights, Group Flashing (2)

JUNCTION
Marks Junctions and Obstructions, Pass on Either Side, White Red or Green Lights.

RIGHT SIDE
White or Green Lights, Flashing

BUOYS HAVING NO LATERAL SIGNIFICANCE - ALL WATERS

STANDARD WATERWAYS MARKERS USED OUTSIDE MAIN CHANNEL

Boats are Prohibited in Areas so Marked.

Waves of Danger May Appear on a Buoy or on Shore.

Red Buoys Mark Right Side of Channel When Moving Upstream.

Green Buoys Mark Left Side of Channel When Moving Upstream.

This Flag Indicates that a Dredge is Below the Surface in the Area Marked. Proceed with Caution.



ATTENTION SEAPLANE PILOTS
These pools are open to seaplane operations with pilots assuming all risk. Landing and take off maneuvers prohibited within 500 ft. of parks, bridges, causeways and 2,600 ft. of the lock and dam.

FOR YOUR SAFETY, PLEASE READ THESE PRECAUTIONS

Each land or water related activity provides enjoyment and challenges to boaters and other lake users, but there are dangers as well. To prevent accidents, please look over the following list of safety precautions and follow them. They should help you have a safer and more enjoyable visit to Ozark Lake and John Paul Hammerschmidt Lake.

- Boats must not approach closer to the dam than indicated by the warning signs.
- Small craft should yield the right-of-way to barge traffic due to dangerous wake, strong undertow and poor visibility.
- Attempts have been made to show boating hazards (submerged and exposed points); however other hazards may exist. Boaters should watch for unknown hazards resulting from variation in lake levels.
- Be careful when approaching the shoreline because depth of water varies. Never dive into water of unknown depth.
- Supervise children at all times.
- Wear a Personal Flotation Device (life jacket) at all times.
- Never use alcohol while in, on, or around the water.
- File a trip plan with someone so he or she will know where you will be and when you plan to return.
- In all areas except those designated "No Swimming," you may swim at your own risk. No swimming at Springhill, Lee Creek or Fort Smith.
- When recreating downstream of the dam, leave the area immediately when the warning horn sounds and water is released.
- When winds of 25 m.p.h. or more are forecast or blowing, boaters should stay out of the water.
