

Lake Level Update

Lately, we've started getting quite a few questions about the lake levels.

We've heard that it's still high and we've had concerns that it's low. The truth is it's right where it is supposed to be for this time of year. Seasonal conservation pool is 917 feet above mean sea level and today we are at 916.68.

Table Rock Lake Levels from September 1, 2016 to October 1, 2017. A couple of fun facts... The lake is now approximately 6 feet higher than this time in 2016 and 10 feet higher than mid-February of 2017. However, it is almost 18 feet lower than it's 2017 peak of 934.5.

Night at the Museum Returns

October Programs and Events at Dewey Short Visitor Center


The US Army Corps of Engineers will be offering the following interpretive programs and events at Dewey Short Visitor Center during the month of October. All programs are free of charge. Registration is required only for the Night at the Museum event. No registration is required for other programs

1 pm on October 1st, 8th, 9th, 17th, 21st, 22nd and 27th. Join a ranger for this fascinating program on the animals, birds, snakes, and Hwy 165. Just across the highway/dam insects found in the wild Ozarks. We will talk about where they live, what they do, and how they survive. The program will last 30-45 minutes and is appropriate for all ages.

Table Rock Dam Talk will be offered at 1 pm on October 2nd, 10th, 20th, 28th, and 29th. Seen the movie but have more questions? Want to know more facts and figures? Confused about how something works? Then join us for a talk about the building and operating of Table Rock Dam and find the answers to those elusive questions. This program will last 30-45 minutes and is appropriate for all ages.

Nature Tales will be offered at 10:30 on October 3rd, 12th, 18th, and 31st. It's time for fun and education as we read a nature

themed story in our reading area. After the story we will have a special activity. This program will last 20-40 minutes and



A Fall Garden Tour will be offered on October 4th at 11 am. Take a walk as we talk about our native landscaping and the flowers, trees, and insects that inhabit the beds. Learn why we have features such as pollinator beds, bio-swales, and noninvasive plants. This walking tour will last 20-30 minutes and is open to all ages.

Visit with a Park Ranger at the overlook on October 5th at 9 am, October 11th at 1 pm, October 19th at 11 am, and October 26th at 9 am. The ranger will be available to Wild Things in the Ozarks will be offered at answer questions and point out features of the dam and powerhouse. Visitors can come and go. Meet at the overlook off from Dewey Short Visitor Center. The ranger will be on-site for 30 minutes and this is appropriate for all ages.

> Ranger Walk will be conducted at 10:30 am on October 6th, 14th, 15th, 24th, and 30th. A park ranger will join you on the Lakeshore trail to talk about the plants, animals, insects, birds, and ecology of Table Rock Lake. The trail is an asphalt surface trail that follows the shoreline of Table Rock Lake. Difficulty is easy and we will be walking about ½ - 1 mile total (varies by audience). Meet at the Lakeshore trailhead. This walk lasts 30-40 minutes and is appropriate for all ages.

A presentation on hydropower will be offered at 1 pm on October 5th and 18th. Learn about hydropower and how it is

> made by examining construction photos that show the essential components at Table Rock Dam. This program will last 20-30 minutes and is recommended for ages 10 and to adult.
