When families transfer property from generation to generation they should not lose their rights under existing grandfathered vegetative permits. Also, dock modifications may need to be made to accommodate new users, uses and equipment. A 5 year limit on requests would severely hamper the owners rightful use of their property.

My wife and I are writing to you regarding the proposed Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan (TRL SMP). We were unable to use the Corps Comment Form on the Corps web site, [swl.usace.army.mil](http://swl.usace.army.mil), therefore, we are submitting this letter.

We have a boat slip in a 12-slip community boat dock operated by the Peach Orchard Dock Association on Table Rock Lake. Our dock is located in Peach Orchard Cove at the North end of the lake and our dock has been issued Corps Permit No. 7958 since 1995.

It is our understanding that the Corps is now proposing that all **private** boat docks will be required to convert from regular electricity to alternative energy such as solar power in 10 years. **My wife and I are strongly opposed to this Corps mandate for private docks and our comments follow:**

- 1) We currently have electricity at our dock that meets National and Corps Electrical standards.
- 2) We pay for it including a periodic Corps electrical easement charge and a Corps electrical safety inspection.
- 3) Cost. The costs for conversion to solar are unknown. If solar becomes a legal mandate, the costs for conversion to solar will dramatically increase.
- 4) Power availability. If solar becomes a legal mandate regular electricity will be eliminated. Current Corps solar policy requires written approval from 100% of the slip owners. If one of our 12 slip owners declined to give written approval for whatever reason our dock would be without power for lights and boat lifts.
- 5) We wonder why if solar is such a good thing, why doesn't the solar conversion mandate also applied to commercial docks?

- 6) We also wonder why the Corps is proposing this ultimatum. Why can't the Corps encourage solar but let the private dock owners/associations decide for themselves when they want to convert to solar on their privately owned property. It seems like this is the "old" American way.

It is also our understanding that the Corps draft proposal would also require that existing no-wake buoys for private docks must be removed by the end of 2020. **We are also strongly opposed to this Corps mandate for private docks and our comments follow:**

- 1) We have been boaters for over 50 years on public waters in four different States. The Missouri no-wake buoy is a standard. It is widely recognized for promoting safety and to prevent damage to property including private boat docks caused by excessive boat wakes.
- 2) To our knowledge, no-wake buoys are managed and regulated by the Missouri State Highway Patrol, Water Patrol Division and prior to 2011, it was the Missouri State Water Patrol.
- 3) Since 1995, I (Russell) have personally observed that no-wake regulations were rarely if ever enforced. Even complaints brought no enforcement action and no follow up.
- 4) We wonder if a Corps or Water Patrol Division employee ever stood on a private dock when a boater passed the no-wake buoy and dock within 30 feet dragging a 3 foot plus wake. The boats moored in the slips and those on boat lifts bounce around and cause untold damage.
- 5) Chief Coburn, you have stated to the media "We're having a lot of problems with these buoys. They are not maintained". Good Grief, whatever happened to enforcement of Corps and Highway Patrol regulations?

The Corps proposals for solar on private docks and the elimination of no-wake buoys are not being made in the best interests of the public. They are being made in the interest of the Corps and the Patrol to lessen their responsibilities to the public they are supposed to serve. All of the Corps public meetings regarding the TRL MSP are nothing more than fluff for the public. The Corps will do what they want to do!!!!

We have reviewed the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers' (the Corps) proposed revised Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan (the 2017 SMP) and related material, including the current Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan (the 1996 SMP). To follow are our specific comments and recommendations in connection with the 2017 SMP.

### Executive Summary

We strongly support the Corps' efforts to keep Table Rock Lake clean, uncongested and enjoyable for all parties involved. We have enjoyed a good working relationship with Corps personnel over the years and have found the officers and office personnel to be generally reasonable in their approach to managing the lake. However, there have been (and continue to be) documented instances of arbitrary, inconsistent application of the rules by individual officers and personnel, sometimes applied in a very draconian manner (explained in more detail below). It is incumbent upon the Corps to be consistent in its application of the applicable rules and regulations. It is also imperative that the 2017 SMP contains the totality of the rules. Application of rules or interpretive positions by the Corps that are not clearly articulated in the 2017 SMP serves to undermine the integrity and legitimacy of the process, and will serve to alienate the public.

The lake is a precious resource that must be protected, but not in an over-zealous manner. Common sense must prevail with any government regulation, and that includes the 2017 SMP. In our review, we have attempted to take a balanced-view of the 2017 SMP, putting emotions aside and looking at the proposals in the context of what makes sense. Some of the proposed changes in the 2017 SMP are logical and appropriate. Other proposed changes are without merit and serve no legitimate purpose. And finally, one proposal is outrageous and would be met with a massive level of outright civil disobedience if implemented as currently written in the 2017 SMP and must be amended.

In summary (and as supported by the detailed discussion contained in this memorandum),

we make the following recommendations to the Corps with respect to the 2017 SMP:

Recommendations:

1. Utilize the full legislatively mandated two-year Shoreline Management Plan update period to carefully consider the public feedback received and the proposed changes, including circulating a final draft reflective of the comments received and changes made.
2. Confirm the required technical correction to the 2017 SMP noted below and consider any changes the correct governing Executive Order has on the proposed position regarding shoreline power.
3. In connection with the maximum carrying capacity of Table Rock Lake, provide for a moratorium on new access opportunities when the lake hits the 26,000 milestone, allowing for the conducting of a new study of the maximum carrying capacity of the lake.
4. Quantify the projected increase in the use of alternative energy sources in the public power grid vis-à-vis the desired benefits of converting all private floating facilities to alternative power sources (the changes occurring in the composition of the sources of power in the public power grid may reduce or eliminate the benefits of switching).
5. Remove the prohibition of no-wake buoys for private docks contained in the 2017 SMP and create an approval process in conjunction with the Missouri State Water Patrol.
6. As outlined below, devise a viable alternative for the permitted continued use of golf carts or other vehicles with low impact turf tires (the proposed alternative in the 2017 SMP is unworkable).
7. Contingent on the outcome of the revised policy around the continued use of golf carts or other vehicles with low impact turf tires, create a fair and reasonable penalty scheme (one that is proportional to the offense and penalizes just the offending party).
8. Eliminate the current practice of threatening permittees (and the associated community docks) with sanctions that are either not in the current Shoreline Management Plan or relate to alleged infractions of Corps rules not related to the management or maintenance of the permitted dock (examples provided below).
9. Provide feedback to the public regarding the activities of the Table Rock Lake Oversight Committee in connection with the drafting of the 2017 SMP.
10. If the Table Rock Lake Oversight Committee has not been convened or involved in a substantive manner in the review and oversight of the 2017 SMP as required by federal law, suspend the issuance of the 2017 SMP until such time that compliance with federal law has occurred.

## **Legislative Authority**

The issuance of the 2017 SMP is mandated by the requirements of the Water Infrastructure Improvements for the Nation Act (WIINS) signed into law by President Obama on December 16, 2016. The relevant section of the WIINS is reprinted in italics below in order to highlight the legislative directive for the issuance of the 2017 SMP:

### ***1185. Table Rock Lake, Arkansas and Missouri***

#### ***(a) In general***

*Notwithstanding any other provision of law, the Secretary—*

*(1) shall include a 60-day public comment period for the Table Rock Lake Master Plan and Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan revision; and*

*(2) shall finalize the revision for the Table Rock Lake Master Plan and Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan during the 2-year period beginning on the date of enactment of this Act.*

#### ***(b) Shoreline use permits***

*During the period described in subsection (a)(2), the Secretary shall lift or suspend the moratorium on the issuance of new, and modifications to existing, shoreline use permits based on the existing Table Rock Lake Master Plan and Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan.*

#### ***(c) Oversight committee***

##### ***(1) In general***

*Not later than 120 days after the date of enactment of this Act, the Secretary shall establish an oversight committee (referred to in this subsection as the “Committee”).*

##### ***(2) Purposes***

*The purposes of the Committee shall be—*

*(A) to review any permit to be issued under the existing Table Rock Lake Master Plan at the recommendation of the District Engineer; and*

*(B) to advise the District Engineer on revisions to the new Table Rock Lake Master Plan and Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan.*

##### ***(3) Membership***

*The membership of the Committee shall not exceed 6 members and shall include—*

*(A) not more than 1 representative each from the State of Missouri and the State of Arkansas;*



(B) *not more than 1 representative each from local economic development organizations with jurisdiction over Table Rock Lake; and*

(C) *not more than 1 representative each representing the boating and conservation interests of Table Rock Lake.*

(4) *Study*

*The Secretary shall—*

(A) *carry out a study on the need to revise permit fees relating to Table Rock Lake to better reflect the cost of issuing those permits and achieve cost savings;*

(B) *submit to Congress a report on the results of the study described in subparagraph (A); and*

(C) *begin implementation of a new permit fee structure based on the findings of the study described in subparagraph (A).*

The deadline for issuance of the final 2017 SMP is December 16, 2018. Accordingly, there is no “burning-platform” to issue final regulations immediately subsequent to the end of the current public comment period. **We strongly advise the Corps to consider all matters of concern expressed by the public, and produce a revised draft for further public comment. We want the Corps to get this right, even if that means using the full duration of the two-year period allotted by Congress and the President. We also request a public statement from the Corps regarding the activities of the Table Rock Lake Oversight Committee in connection with issuance of the proposed 2017 SMP.**

#### **Technical Correction**

We have not undertaken a legal review of the 2017 SMP. However, it is worth noting that one of the key authoritative references listed in the 2017 SMP has been revoked. Specifically, Executive Order 13514 “Federal Leadership in Environmental Energy and Economic Performance” signed by President Obama on October 5, 2009 was revoked by Executive Order 13693 “Planning for Federal Sustainability in the Next Decade”, signed by President Obama on March 19, 2015.

Given that one of the most substantive changes proposed in the 2017 SMP is the conversion of all shoreline power to alternative sources for all private floating facilities (which encompasses private and community docks) by December 31, 2027, it is imperative that the applicable authoritative guidance be the current mandate (Executive Order 13693) and not the revoked mandate (Executive Order 13514). **The proposed change to the permitted power source for private floating facilities must be evaluated in the context of Executive Order 13693 and not the revoked order.**

## **Recommended Changes to the 2017 SMP**

To follow are our specific recommendations with respect to the 2017 SMP. If we do not comment on a specific change we are in general agreement with the change as proposed in the 2017 SMP.

### **1. Increase to 30,806 access opportunities:**

We suggest strengthening the language on page 38 of the 2017 SMP to stipulate that when the total access opportunities reaches 26,000 a new study be completed prior to the issuance of any new access opportunities to determine the continued appropriateness of the proposed 30,806 limit. Out of an abundance of caution, we believe it is prudent at that level of activity (26,000) to take another formal look at the lake traffic and density. Our inclination is that an increase to a maximum of 30,806 access opportunities makes sense, but we encourage caution in managing the increase.

### **2. Migration to Alternative Power Sources:**

We support the proposed change to alternative power sources for private floating facilities as defined in the 2017 SMP, but with some conditions. First of all, it is not clear why the Corps is intent on making this change. Reference to the above-mentioned revoked Executive Order appears to be the primary reason. However, we have heard Corps personnel discuss safety concerns with current shoreline power arrangements. Unlike at Lake of the Ozarks (with credit due to the Corps for invoking prudent electrical system requirements at the outset of the development of Table Rock Lake), there is not a public concern of any systematic issues with accidental electrical shocks from docks on Table Rock Lake. A statement as to why the Corps believes this very significant change is warranted would help to clarify its regulatory intent.

We also want to reinforce that this proposed change is only for private and community docks. The current solar-powered battery systems would not support commercial and resort dock power needs. The language on pages 9 and 36 of the 2017 SMP specifically indicates that the change to alternative energy sources applies to private floating facilities only. However, the language on page 28 of the 2017 SMP does not indicate the change pertains only to private floating facilities.

Additionally, there may be a longer-term flaw in the Corps logic in mandating the conversion to alternative energy sources if the sole reason is to comply with the aforementioned Executive Order. Specifically, the electric utilities that provide service to the Table Rock Lake area are already moving forward with their own renewable energy strategies. For example, today, according to the Electric Cooperatives of Arkansas, 20% of the energy being supplied to its members (which includes a significant number of the docks on Table Rock Lake) comes from non-carbon emitting sources (wind, hydro, solar and biomass). By 2037, these cooperatives have publicly stated that they expect the majority of the energy they provide will be derived from such sources. Additionally, solar-powered “microgrids” may develop into a significant portion of the energy being sold into the public grids, thus further expanding the reach of alternative energy. And finally, with the rapid conversion of many coal-fired plants to natural gas, the carbon footprint of more traditional energy plants is much improved.

**Has the Corps factored the rapidly evolving movement of our public utilities to alternative renewable energy and natural gas into this policy decision? Has the Corps conducted detailed environmental impact studies weighing the environmental costs/benefits of forcing docks to solar or wind powered battery solutions vs. relying on the public power grid?**

We strongly encourage the Corps to conduct an analysis of the projected sources of energy relied upon by the private and community docks. A quick survey of the handful of electric cooperatives and companies providing power to Table Rock Lake communities should provide you with a view of the future. It would be unfortunate to require nearly 2,000 docks to go through the expense and trouble to convert from shore power to alternative energy only to have the ecological benefits nullified by market forces that are producing profound changes in the sources of energy that power our public power grids. Additionally, the ecological impact of the recycling or disposal of thousands of batteries per year resulting from this policy change cannot be ignored.

The current Administration has begun the process of cancelling certain Obama Administration regulations. Has the Corps been in discussions with officials from the current Administration regarding its intentions with respect to Executive Order 13693? Additionally, current Environmental Protection Agency Administrator Pruitt has challenged the scientific findings regarding the impact of the activities of human beings on the environment. **In light of the current views of the EPA Administrator and by extension, the current Administration, are the Corps plans to force private floating facilities to convert to alternative energy sources in alignment with the Administration?**

### 3. Removal of Private Dock No-Wake Buoys:

On its surface, this proposed change appears to have no logical or viable foundation. As long-term residents of Table Rock Lake and dock owners, we can attest to the need for these buoys, and in particular, for docks on or near the main channel of the lake. Boaters are not respectful of the 100 foot margin required by Missouri law. The problem is particularly acute in narrow passages. For a real example of the issue, we encourage the Corps to visit the Mill Creek cove just west of Farm Road 1255 near Shell Knob, Missouri. Without buoys, boats will speed past the 15 at-risk community and private docks with no regard for the required distance. A no-wake sign posted on the dock is inadequate.

We recommend you implement a process whereby the Missouri State Water Patrol approves the location of the buoys.

### 4. Golf Cart Use

We find the proposed golf cart changes and associated penalties for violation of the rules in the 2017 SMP to be untenable, impractical and unworkable. The proposed rules demonstrate a complete disregard of the geological composition of the areas surrounding Table Rock Lake – namely, extremely rocky and not subject to damage by normal use of a golf cart or similar vehicle. The proposed associated penalties are excessive and are

indicative of an escalating practice of Corps personnel to attempt to bully or intimidate slip owners and permittees.

There is a 50-year history of residents using golf carts and other vehicles to access their dock slips. It is our experience that residents have not abused the land and have been quite respectful in their use of these vehicles. The paths to many of the 2,000 docks on Table Rock Lake are long, meandering, rocky and steep. Regardless of the age, health or physical condition of a slip owner and their family members and guests, there are times when they must utilize a golf cart or vehicle to transport heavy items to and from their slips (i.e, trolling motor batteries, anchors, bimini tops, etc.). There is also a very high percentage of slip owners who are elderly retirees who cannot safely walk on the paths in many situations.

The 2017 SMP does provide the opportunity for individuals with physical impairments to receive a Letter of Permission (LOP) granting them the right to use a golf cart to access their dock. The language of the 2017 SMP does not appear to suggest that the age of the slip owner is a viable factor to consider. Rather, it defaults to requiring either a government-issued document attesting to the individual's "permanent disability" or a letter from a physician attesting to the nature of the disability "explained in detail". It is not clear in the 2017 SMP what safeguards the Corps will take to make certain detailed, private health information in its possession will not be compromised. Will private medical records submitted as part of the LOP approval process be kept in a confidential file with access granted to Corps employees on a "need to know" basis? It is also not clear if the Corps will accept the documentation provided. In other words, will the Corps second-guess a physician's opinion regarding their patient's condition? If so, this places the Corps in the dangerous position of providing medical opinions.

**The use of carts and other vehicles is so pervasive given their historical usage that compliance with this rule, as currently written in the 2017 SMP, will simply not occur. Enforcement will be haphazard at best. Enforcement of this rule as currently written in the 2017 SMP will undermine the Corps' outreach efforts with the communities it serves, and will create a hostile relationship, undermining the otherwise valuable and respected work provided by the Corps.**

Additionally, the penalties for violating the proposed rules unduly penalize parties not violating the rules. To follow are the penalties as proposed in the 2017 SMP:

*The operation and/or parking of motorized vehicles on Corps property, including but not limited to automobiles, trucks, motorcycles, mini-bikes, all-terrain vehicles (ATV's), golf carts, utility and lawn tractors, etc., are prohibited off authorized roadways with the exception of golf carts or other turf tired vehicle when operated under a LOP, riding lawn mowers used in accordance with a valid Shoreline Use permit for vegetation modification, or other special permit granted by the Table Rock Lake Office.*

*The following enforcements actions will be taken:*

*1st Offense: Citation, loss of LOP, and letter of warning of consequences for future offenses.*

*2nd Offense: Recommendation to the District Commander revocation of the Shoreline*

*Use Permit for vegetation modification, establishment of restoration area, and payment of restitution, if required. Restrict use of boat slip(s), by barricading slip(s) or dock, for a period of two years, regardless of sale of slip(s) or dock.*

*3rd Offense: Recommendation to the District Commander revocation of the Shoreline Use Permit for the private floating facility or removal/permanent barricading of the slip(s), regardless of sale of slip(s) or dock, continuation of the established restoration area, construction of a fence at the Government boundary line adjoining private property, and payment of the restitution, if required.*

**The way these penalties are currently drafted implies that a single slip owner who is found guilty of violating the golf cart rule three times, could result in an entire community dock having its permit revoked. This is frankly an offensive abuse of the Corps regulatory authority and is an example of regulatory over-reach of the highest order.**

In an effort to be helpful to the Corps, we have compiled the following alternatives to consider:

Alternative #1: Allow slip/dock owners the right to utilize golf carts or other vehicles with low impact turf tired vehicles to access their docks on the designated path. This right would extend to family members of the slip/dock owners but to no other parties (including guests). This right would also extend to authorized service personnel who are servicing a dock or a boat within a dock. (This is our recommended alternative and would seem to strike a reasonable balance between the Corps' objective of protecting government property and accommodating the needs of the slip/dock owners)

Alternative #2: Extend the LOP process to include any slip/dock owner the age of 62 or older. (Although not our preferred alternative, this would at least recognize the very large percentage of slip owners who are retirees).

**Regarding the penalties for violating the golf cart rules, we strongly insist that the current proposed penalties be deleted, and more realistic penalties that reflect the nature of the infraction be developed. At a minimum, any penalty that punishes people not associated with the infraction is patently unacceptable (such as revoking a community dock permit because of one non-compliant slip owner).**

The Corps should include in the 2017 SMP a table of monetary fines based upon the severity of the infraction and purge any penalty that has the consequence of collaterally damaging slip owners not associated in any fashion with the infraction. The Corps should also bifurcate penalties into two types – those related to violating vegetation/landscaping/access rules and those related to violating dock rules. **Currently, the Corps has constructed a penalty scheme that allows it to penalize an entire community dock for a vegetation/landscaping/access infraction that has nothing to do with the dock and may not even be in the vicinity of the dock. This is morally wrong.**

## 5. Reported Threats by Corps Personnel for Non-Compliance

In the past several years there has been an escalation in the frequency that Corps personnel have reportedly threatened community docks with permit revocation in retaliation for relatively minor offenses. To follow are discussions of two such instances.

### Reported Corps Incident #1:

A community dock permittee was issued a citation in the instance where a boat lift not in use had been left plugged in by a slip owner. The permittee was also informed that a second such violation would result in a monetary fine and a third violation would result in the revocation of the community dock's permit.

This is a clear case of the punishment not being commensurate with the offense. And more troubling, the nature of the offense is not listed in the 1996 SMP nor in the 2017 SMP. This reported action by the Corps is disturbing and implies that it views itself as having carte blanche authority to devise whatever rule it deems necessary and to enforce that rule in whatever fashion it chooses.

### Reported Corps Incident #2:

A previous homeowner had encroached on Corps property with back yard landscaping. The new homeowner was unaware of this encroachment. The new homeowner became the permittee of the neighborhood community dock. At the time of the renewal of the dock permit of the community dock, the Corps held up the dock permit renewal process until such time that the offending landscaping was removed from the permittee's back yard.

**If this reported incident is true, the Corps held the community dock permit issuance process hostage over an issue totally unrelated to the management of the dock. This issue had nothing to do with the state of the dock – it was totally unrelated. This was a personal matter between the individual and the Corps. The fact that the individual was also a permittee on a community dock was irrelevant. If accurately reported, this is an egregious example of regulatory over-reach and clearly demonstrates a level of contempt for the property rights of the slip owners in this community dock.**

We ask the leadership of the Corps to revisit its procedures and the training of its personnel, and to also revisit the depth and breadth of the content of the 2017 SMP. The Corps should not have the ability to enforce rules or regulations not explicitly identified in the 2017 SMP.

### Summary

We appreciate this opportunity to provide comments and suggestions to the Corps with

respect to its management of Table Rock Lake and the 2017 SMP. Table Rock Lake is a precious resource and we support the Corps efforts to both improve and enhance the resource for everyone. We also encourage the Table Rock Lake Oversight Committee to consider our suggestions and analyze the consequences of adopting the 2017 SMP as currently written.

We also request that the Corps respond to the issues we have raised with a public response (a press release that addresses the concerns raised herein accompanied by a town hall meeting with opportunity for the public to ask questions and to provide comments) for the benefit of all parties who have a vested interest in the ultimate outcome of the content of the 2017 SMP.

No-wake buoys serve three important purposes.

Protection of the dock and watercraft from excessive wake damage and people on the docks and preservation of fish spawning areas.

1. Currently, in some locations, the no-wake buoys are the only deterrent for large watercraft entering a smaller cove or observing a safe distance from docks.
2. Smaller watercraft and people are afforded some protection from the wake of speed craft and large boats by use of no-wake buoys. It also reduces the possibility of serious collisions.
3. Fragile spawning areas will be destroyed unless coves are restricted by wake.
4. People just do not observe safety and courtesy in the water. Large watercraft are disruptive to others and to fishing conditions.
5. Lake of the ozarks is an example of too high traffic and unlimited size and speed if water craft. It is a dangerous lake for most.
6. Those of limited expendable income would be excluded from use when the us no respite from excessive shore disturbance.

- 1) The number of new docks seems to be increasing. With this, we are seeing so many dock slips that are unoccupied. Some have sat empty for several years,
- 2) It seems the vegetation removal has become more aggressive in the last five years.
- 3) Some shore line owners have exercised squatters rights and leave their personal belongings on the lakes edge for days on end,
- 4) The issue of being responsible for "your wake" needs to be addressed. With more and more Wake Board type boats, the waves seem to be getting larger and larger. It used to be the cruisers were the boats that threw out the big wakes, now it is the Wake Boats that are moving slowly yet throwing gigantic waves that pose more of a problem. They seem to have no problem driving very close to the docks.
- 5) The above point really needs to be taken into consideration when the proposition to remove the No Wake buoys is considered. Currently boats come within just a few feet of the buoys, I can only imagine how they behave when a small sign is posted at the end of a dock.

I am a home and boat slip owner on Tablerock Lake (116 Little Dove Circle, Reeds Spring, Mo 65737) and have concerns and are opposed to two items with the current proposed plan as listed below.

1. Only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) will be allowed.

Existing licenses for overhead and underground electric service to private floating facilities will not be renewed after December 31, 2027.

2. No-Wake buoys for private docks will not be

allowed. Approved no wake signs may be placed on the dock. Existing no-wake buoys for private docks must be removed by December

31, 2020.

Alternative Power Source

My concerns with this possible revision are cost and reliability. The cost to switch would place a huge financial burden on a number of home and dock owners located around the lake for minimal benefit. This plus the reliability problems of only having current when the sun shines to recharge the batteries

and in busy lake times when many boat lifts in a dock may be used numerous times a day placing a huge drain on the stored electrical current.

The current plan provides for the use of power generated electrical current with the facilities requiring an inspection every 5 years. This has been a safe and reliable source of energy and does not dictate that any changes be made.

#### Removal of No Wake Buoys

The desire to remove the no-wake buoys is difficult for me to understand. The buoys do their job in terms of providing safety for lake users and reducing damage to the docks. Placing a no-wake sign on the side of a dock would not be near as effective as a buoy. We have boat owners in our cove that currently "push the limit" associated with the no-wake buoy and I can only imagine how they would respond to a no-wake sign located on the dock.

The idea of solar power for all of the docks is what I believe is the main flaw in the plan. I am a stall owner on a 14 stall dock. And dock issues are taken care of by each stall owner paying his or her part of the cost of the issue. Unless there is major improvement in the solar panels and equipment this is not a feasible arrangement. Solar power was and still is a supplement to regular electric power. On a large doc with 12 or 14 slips, the solar panels and installation along with the battery backup and converters would cost around \$25,000 or more. Most dock slip owners do not have that kind of money to do this. As that would be an extra \$2500 per slip owner on a 10 stall dock on top of normal dock dues for upkeep and such. Each dock would need to have enough battery backup so that they could still have functions before sun rise and after sun set and for extended days of overcast skies as in Boat lifts and lights and if you are fortunate to have a locker lights in there and for battery charging of equipment/ batteries on you boat. Then there would need to be a place to house the batteries for the storage of the power. On the Docks that you have told us that we can't put storage cabinets on since they were not part of the original plan where do you all propose we place these items. As you all know we do not live on Walton's mountain, so if it is not under lock and key then it will be stolen. On docks that have storage places for the individual slip owners for their personal items, will the Corp allow the addition of a separate area or storage for just the solar equipment? As you all know we have had several docks in the past that tip over when we get a major snow fall due to the weight of the snow on the roof of the dock. The amount of weight that would be added to the top of the docks with the addition of solar panels would make it so even a small snow fall would put docks at risk. Will the Corp subsidize the cost of purchasing the Solar panels and the installation? Sounds to me that the Corp is just wanting commercial dock owners and not any private citizens to have docks/stalls on the water. I do not believe that you all have thought this through.

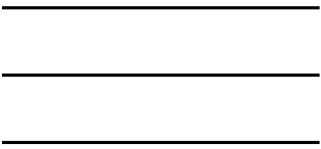

To Whom It May Concern:

My wife and I have owned a boat slip in a dock off Point 21 on Table Rock Lake for the past 15 years. Over that time, we have seen significant changes in lake use which have a direct impact on our property and on the shoreline. Two changes are noteworthy. First, the number of wakeboarders has dramatically increased. Second, areas on the lake have been designated "party coves," on social media sites, encouraging unsafe conditions which need monitoring.

While we appreciate the mission of the Corps of Engineers to preserve and maintain the lake shoreline for present and future generations, we believe some of the proposals are misguided and will have an effect opposite that which is intended. Conversely, some issues are not addressed at all.

1. Removal of "No Wake" buoys. The inlet off Point 21 has become a favorite spot for wakeboarders. These boats, by design, throw enormous wakes which cause continuous white-capped waves to crash into all the docks along the cove and onto the shoreline. The No Wake buoys provide the only buffer between the boats and the docks/shoreline. Too, our grandchildren love to swim off our dock. The buoys are a safety net of sorts, marking an area where they may swim without fear of being in proximity to boats. If we have to remove those buoys, the dozens of boats cruising the cove will be able to come even closer to the docks. As it is, each boat's wake violently rocks the docks along the shoreline. Without the buoys, boats can come within feet of the docks, potentially causing peril to those who are in the water and wreaking even more damage to private property and further erosion of the shore. To compensate for our removing the buoys, could the Corps require that those who use wakeboards for recreation be restricted to the main channel where the width of the lake would dissipate the wakes? This would help protect private property and mitigate the damage to the shoreline.
2. If the Corps is concerned about the safety of those who spend time on the lake, could something be done about the "Party Cove" designations which appear on sites like Google Maps? These user-

submitted designations describe the cove as a “public beach.” Consequently, on any given weekend, as many as three dozen boats speed down the cove off point 21 and tether themselves to one another, causing dangerously congested conditions and effectively blocking access to the length of the cove. Those dock owners who own private docks near where these flotillas congregate don’t even use their docks when this “invasion” happens. I am sure this is a difficult situation to patrol, but the very nature of the congestion and lack of monitoring most certainly will end in tragedy. I would think notification from the Corps to sites like Google Maps asking them to remove such “Party Cove” designations would carry far more weight than the protests we individuals have lodged. Simultaneously, more frequent monitoring by the authorities would be invaluable.

I appreciate the opportunity to make my voice heard.

  - a. Solar Power.  
**Solar power is preferred/recommended option** for providing electrical service to private docks. Requires engineer certified plans, must meet all national Electric Code (NEC) provisions. Solar power does not require a separate License, will be inspected during the **annual dock inspections by the Project Office**, and owner must have written approval prior to installation.
  - b. Line Power.  
Line power is the extension of an overhead or underground electrical line which provides electrical service from an existing line. Requires engineer certified plans, must meet all National Electric Code (NEC) provisions, **and will be tested during the annual dock inspections**. Requests for line power must have written approval prior to installation. Request for line power will only be authorized in locations that require a minimal removal of trees or disturbance of the area. Installation of line power will require a separate Real Estate License issued through the Kansas City District Real Estate Division, the cost for this license is determined by the Real Estate Division.

In your video on your website you characterize your mission is to keep "maintaining current facilities and recreational opportunities on the lake." You mention that there is widespread support for the balance that has been struck at TRL. Therefore, your recommendations in the Shoreline Management Plan seem inconsistent with the 2014 TRL Master Plan.

The plan as it is being administered now seems to be working to protect the lake and allow for responsible growth and access. Since no reasons are given for each new change proposed, it is often difficult to even understand your goals. But let me add some concerns to those above, which are real.

Golf carts and ATVs have helped a decidedly older than average age population access the lake by allowing them to get nearer the dock. I have not noticed them as a problem, nor did residents note them as a problem/concern in the Master Plan Public Hearings. Therefore, I see no reason to crack down on their responsible use. By the way, many are electric vehicles which lower emissions in the lake area.

No Wake buoys serve a real safety purpose. They are much easier to spot than a single swimmer in front of a dock. They protect permitted docks from wake damage and safeguard swimmers. They should not be removed.

What is wrong with storing fishing or water sports equipment on a dock or in a dock box? These may be non-essential items to operate a boat, but they are essential elements for the full enjoyment of the lake by many citizens.

If a vegetative, road, etc. permit has been in effect for many years, and the Master Plan found no major problems caused by the same on the lake, then I recommend you continue to extend grandfather status to all these, even when changing hands on ownership (which does not change impact).

I see no reason for the provision on marine holding facilities/porta-potties being banned from private docks. If they need pumped out, they can go to a commercial dock for that purpose.

If the largest use is in the months when the level is 917', why is that not used as the level for lake capacity?

In your Special Enforcement Standards section, I am concerned about the process. It may be as now, but surely we can work through this in a better way. Management 101 is to always grant authority when giving responsibility. If an individual slip owner is in violation. the process runs. Ultimately, as I read the plan all the other slips will be punished with the loss of their slips even though they have no enforcement ability. Seems we could just take slip from guilty party.

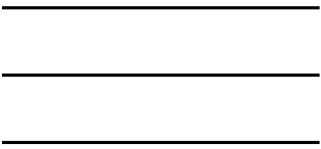

We have reviewed your 2017 Management Plan and we strongly disagree with the following changes:

1. Private docks must use an alternative power source. This would be a great financial hardship with little benefit.
2. All "No Wake Buoys" must be removed from area in front of docks. These buoys help to protect docks, boats, and persons on the dock. Particularly, the wakes from wake-board boats have severely damaged our dock. The Corps should consider a restricted area for wake-boarding away from private and community docks.
3. No allowance for driving or parking of golf carts and ATV's on Corps property including area in front of dock. Our large community dock has a grandfathered, small parking lot that we maintain. Would you rather we ride horses to our dock area and tether them on Corps property?
4. No fishing equipment, tubes, chairs, etc., can be stored on docks or dock storage bins. The storage bins are private property and can be properly used to store personal items related to boating, fishing, swimming.
5. An arbitrary lake carrying capacity limit will allow the Corps to determine who can use the lake and when. Does this also determine how many occupants are allowed on board, a factor already determined by the manufacturer?
6. All boats with porta-potties will not be allowed on docks. By definition, these items are portable and are used responsibly to keep the lake cleaner and more sanitary. Many newer boats come equipped with portable potties; it would be non-sensible not to use them.

We ask that you avoid regulation over reach and give greater consideration to the effects your Plan Update will have on all the residents of Table Rock Lake and the surrounding areas.

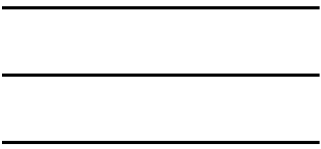
