I realize the above is a standard protest. Therefore, I am adding my personal comments. I retired from the Department of the Interior in 2004 after a career with both the US Fish and Wildlife Service and the Bureau of Land Management (Last Job: National Fisheries Manager). From my personal experience with Table Rock Lake, I do not see any major problems with the current Management Plan. I am particularly

concerned with the provisions for mandatory removal of electricity from the lake; only allowing dock modification once every five years; and the provision that would allow the Corps to unilaterally dictate the number of users on Table Rock Lake at any given time.

I think the proposed changes to the existing Management Plan are draconian with respect to storage of equipment, converting docks to solar power, limitations on the number of dock modification requests, and unilateral decisions on the number of individuals who can use the lake at any given time. I believe the existing plan should either be maintained or, if changed at all, should not include the provisions described in my personal comments.

Gentlemen/Ladies:

Please accept this letter as my comments concerning the Draft Shoreline Management Plan:

SHORELINE USE PERMITS:

1. DRY STORAGE FACILITIES; There appears to be no provision in Draft Shoreline Management Plan for dry storage facilities and in fact the prohibition of future tramways would appear to make it impossible to build a dry facility in the future. I believe that dry storage facilities would allow public access to the lake without the problems associated with both private and community docks. I would suggest that dry storage facilities should be allowed in both in Limited Development Areas and Protected Shorelines areas which would allow large sections of the lake to be accessed with very minimal impact.

2. COMMUNITY DOCKS LESS THAN 12 SLIPS: I am opposed to allowing new docks to be less than 12 slips. I believe the 12 slip minimum size has allowed orderly development of Table Rock Lake and allowed maximum utilization of the available dock zoning. If the Corps of Engineers allows smaller docks, then the development of large areas of Barry County will be limited because small docks will utilize the red zone and the zoning will become a valuable commodity. If an individual has a four slip dock utilizing red zone and someone else wants a slip then the owners of the 4-slip boat dock utilizing the red zone would be able to charge exorbitant amounts to allow additions to their dock. Further I

believe that small docks are not as well maintained and are potentially dangerous because they are not as well maintained as community docks where the cost of maintenance is spread over a number of slip owners. The only exception to that should be to allow smaller community docks in coves which are not wide enough to have a 12 slip perpendicular dock and then maximize the utilization of red zoning should be done and permit the maximum utilization with either horizontal or smaller perpendicular docks.

3. DOCKS PARALELL TO THE SHORELINE: I would suggest that docks parallel to the shoreline should be allowed only where the cove is not wide enough to allow for a perpendicular dock and then an analysis should be done as described in the previous paragraph to maximize the red zone. If docks parallel to the shoreline are allowed they should be required to be 100 feet apart, since there is no reason for that large amount of spacing when the boats are entering straight into the dock.

4. PARKING: The Draft requires “applicants must be able to provide a copy of a land deed showing ownership of private property within 200 feet...” I believe more appropriate language would be “applicants must be able to provide documentation of an easement, license or fee ownership providing the required parking...”

I believe the restriction should be “the applicants should be able to provide documentation of an easement, license or fee ownership of required parking within 200 feet from the 915’ elevation contour of the Limited Development area where the dock is proposed to be situated will be situated.” This would prevent individuals from deliberately placing docks in a location for the purpose of denying their neighbors a location to place a dock in the Limited Development Area. I have represented individuals where a dock owner placed his private dock at the edge of the dock zoning to prevent his neighbors from being able to permit a community dock, even though they were adjoining a dock zone.

5. PARKING ON DEDICATED, PUBLIC AND COUNTY ROADS: In Missouri after a road is dedicated to the Public in a subdivision plat, the road is then a public road. Public roads are under the jurisdiction of the county commission of the County where it is located and amending the subdivision plat would not affect the character of the road. I would suggest page 19, lines 1-3 should be changed to read as follows: “Applicants may use, public or county roads that provide access to the GFTL for access and parking. If such road is utilized for parking purposes, the Applicant must first obtain a license or easement from the County Commission which has jurisdiction over the road.

6. PERIMETER OF PARKING AREA: I would suggest that steel T posts be included with large boulders or barricades around the parking area.

7. LOCATION AND SPACING: I believe the spacing provisions should not apply to docks which are parallel to the shoreline.

VEGETATION MODIFICATION:

NATURAL OR MANMADE BREAKS: The draft does not allow vegetation modification across any natural or manmade break. Carroll Electric has run a number of lines on the lakeside of lots in the Shell Knob area. If this is made the new rule, significant numbers of individuals will not be able to obtain vegetation modification permits. I would suggest this provision be removed.

TRANSFERABILITY OF VEGETATION MODIFICATION PERMITS: The draft Shoreline Management Plan provides that grandfathered Vegetation Modification Permits will not be transferrable to a new owner should the properties be sold or transferred. "sold or transferred" is problematic language. What if the owner conveys the property to a trust, that is a transfer under the law? What if the owner dies and the property is inherited by his or her children? That is also a transfer. I would suggest the language be changed to, "however these grandfathered permits will not be transferrable to a new landowner should the properties be sold or transferred to an un-related 3rd party. The grandfathered permits may pass to trusts or entities controlled by the property owner(s) or their lineal descendants.

STAIRS: A large number of the Limited Development Areas are steep and if stairs are not allowed the access to docks will be dangerous and we will have increased erosion on Government lands. I believe not allowing stairs with further restrict handicap access.

INVASIVE SPECIES REMOVAL: Our area gets new invasive species and other species which were not considered invasive are now considered invasive therefore, I think the draft should be clarified to include new invasive species. Examples are twenty years ago Bradford Pear trees were not considered an invasive species and the Missouri Conservation Commission in the 1940s and 50s gave out starts of multi-flower rose. I would suggest that the draft language on page 31, Lines 7-9 be changed to read: "invasive species is defined as those species of plants currently identified and which may be identified in the future by the Missouri Department of Conservation..... "

PLACEMENT OF PERSONAL PROPERTY ON CORPS PROPERTY: In previously shoreline management plans bird houses were allowed. I don't know if leaving bird houses out of the Draft was intentional or not. I would suggest that bird houses and bat houses should be allowed on government property. I think the addition of bat houses would be of benefit as many bats are endangered or threatened species.

SPECIAL ENFORCEMENT STANDARDS: I believe the enforcement provisions are too rigid and do not take into account the intent or lack of intent of an individual in violation.

CEDAR TREES: I believe the PDT research is incorrect. Cedar trees may provide wildlife cover, but their root system does not add in preventing erosion and in fact accelerate erosion because grasses will not grow around them. If you look under a cedar tree there is no vegetation and the ground is bare except for cedar nettles. Removal of cedar trees will allow native grasses to grow it would help restore the environment back to the condition it was when the Corps of Engineers took possession of the government lands.


It is my understanding that in the current draft of the proposed Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan boat dock zoning and Limited Development Areas which were located adjacent to federal lands or were inaccessible for other reasons is being moved and reallocated with the intention that the amount of dock zoning not being reduced. It is also my understanding from the Draft Shoreline Management Plan that requests for shoreline allocation changes will only be considered or accepted during shoreline management revisions, which I believe is the process the Corps of Engineers is in now.

I own an interest in property located in Sections 21 and 16 of Township 22, Range 24, Stone County, Missouri. The property which I own an interest in and the adjacent properties have little or no boat dock zoning. Specifically between Limited Development Area 432 and LDA 434, a distance of approximately 4.3 miles there is 406 only feet of Limited Development Area which allows boat docks.

I would request that the Corps of Engineers consider allocating a portion of the LDA and Dock zoning which is being allocated to the north side of the cove that is located immediately west of Point Marker #19. This cove is long, deep, very wide and well sheltered.

- Red Cedar trees in wildfires flare up like match sticks and spread their hot ambers with wind spreading the flames to other areas • Red Cedar trees usually end up dying after flooding occurs, that spreads dead branches, logs and derbies into Table Rock Lake causing dangerous conditions for boaters and additional clean up for adjacent property owners.

Home owners and property owners having land adjacent to Corp flood control land should be allowed to clear Red Cedar tree to protect their homes and property from wildfires. Home owners and property owners with a current vegetation permit only would be allowed to remove Red Cedar trees. No hardwood trees could be removed without Corp permission. 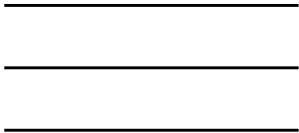

I am in favor of keeping our lake as pristine as possible but I have concerns about some aspects of the SMP. As a slip owner since 2000 in a private multi-slip dock, I have concerns about the parking-space requirement and golf cart access. I live about 1/2 mile from my dock and almost always walk to and from it. However, on occasion, I have family and friends here and need to take refreshments or pull toys to my boat. If the new draft takes effect, I will not have access to take things to my boat. There is no private land available to use for parking adjacent to US gov't property. I could carry things 200+ ft. but not 1/2 mi. This is the case for at least 5 docks in the vicinity of mine and I'm sure is the case in many other areas of the lake. Denying golf cart access (for those of us who are not disabled) or parking on gov't property greatly limits access to our docks. I also note that as I age (71) walking up the steep hill back to my house is getting harder. I was strongly considering buying a golf cart but have put that on hold until I see the final outcome of the SMP.

Another concern I have is the renewable energy requirement. At first, I thought it sounded like a good idea but after further thought, I'm not so sure it makes much sense. The power company is already slowly using a more significant amount of energy from renewable sources: wind from OK and KS as well as hydro-electric. The energy usage on our docks is negligible compared to what we use in our homes. On top of the cost of converting over, there is the expense of maintaining the system especially battery replacement periodically. Making space for the storage batteries would be a problem in itself not to mention the contamination of the lake if batteries were to leak or be deposited in the lake by storm damage.

The last concern I will address is that of tables or chairs on the swim decks or even anything not necessary to the operation of the boat in our dock lockers. It seems that if we can have a swim deck, we should be able to be comfortable on it.

I have discussed the SMP with friends and neighbors and we all share these and other concerns. None of us wants another Lake of the Ozarks and we all want to keep our lake as pristine as possible but we all want to be able to enjoy it as well.



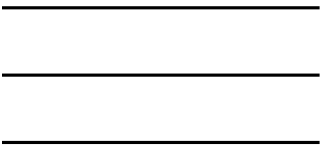

To Whom It May Concern,

I have read over the proposed Table Rock Shoreline Management Plan and have concerns.

- I know it has been a long time since the previous plans were updated but these new proposed plans seem to be very restrictive for a lake that already has a restrictive set of rules that work for the landowners and Corps alike.
- Changing the request to modify docks to only 1 request per 5 years seems pretty drastic because no body can predict what specific needs will be 5 years from now.
- Allowing for only alternative power sources on docks seems like a plan that will not only cost homeowners a lot of money but may not provide the power they need at times its needed. A lot of times when a homeowner has solar power on their home it can also receive power from a utility company in times when their solar power does not generate enough to cover their needs. If solar power is required on docks there may be times when a person lowers their boat lift and goes out on the lake and returns to discover they cannot raise their lift due to not enough solar power available. I realize the dangers of electric lines going to the docks but in the case of our association dock, we have it inspected every Spring to try and prevent any issues.
- Not allowing new licenses for stairs & steps may create hazards for individuals trying to access the lake from the shoreline that has a ledge or a steep grade. As it is, steps and stairs require approval from the Corps so I don't see a need to eliminate these licenses altogether.
- Not allowing No-Wake buoys for private docks seems like an unnecessary and dangerous proposal. Our community dock is located on a main channel of the lake and I'm afraid that without our permitted no-wake buoy it would put people swimming and recreating near our dock in danger of being hit by boaters that would come too close to the dock. As it is now even with our no-wake buoy we sometimes have boaters that don't pay attention or disregard the buoy. I don't think boaters will pay attention to any type of sign that is merely posted on the dock. I think removing the no-wake buoys is a very dangerous proposal and I hope you reconsider this proposed item on the SMP.

- The proposed restrictions for golf cart use are very prohibitive for people other than those who have a permanent disability. There are a lot of people that are handicapped or elderly but not permanently disabled who like to enjoy recreational activities on Table Rock. Without being able to use a cart of some sort those people may not be able to use the lake because of the inability to walk to the lake due to distance, terrain, personal limitation etc..

- We Love Table Rock Lake as do Many other people! The lake currently has plenty of restrictions that make it a beautiful lake for people to live and play. Please don't make the rules governing the lake more restrictive for all of us whose money and taxes help support the surrounding communities economies.

No Wake Buoys – the proposed ban on private No Wake markers is completely without merit. No wake markers serve several important functions, including providing a “safe zone” for persons swimming near docks. Furthermore, it provides notice to inexperienced boat operators (especially rental boat operators) to slow down near boat docks.

Requirement for Alternative Electric Power for Docks – the proposal to require alternative (presumably solar) power for docks should be abandoned. For the small amount of power used by most docks, the pay-back period for recovering the initial cost of installation is never. The Corp already requires electrical inspections as a condition of permit renewal. I believe a requirement for more frequent electrical inspections would be a better option rather than forcing all dock owners to spend a significant amount of money installing solar power. In addition to the cost, the weight of solar panels added to the roof of existing docks will increase the likelihood of roof failures, especially in the event of a snow or ice storm. Finally, since the docks were not designed for battery storage, the location and weight of those batteries may also present problems.

Also related to the issue of docks is the proposed requirement that requests for modification would only be considered once during the 5-year permit period. A more common-sense approach would be to allow for one free request during a 5-year permit period and charge a user fee for review of additional requests.

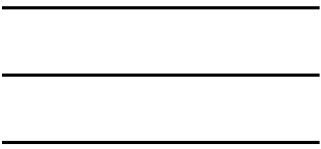
