- I object to the carrying capacity as it limits the right to use the lake.
- I object to tighter restrictions placed upon vegetative management permits.
- I object to the new non-transferable grandfathered vegetative management permit rule.
- I object to financial hardships of removing electricity from the lake.
- I object to only one request every five years for dock modification.
- I object to the 8' depth requirement for any new docks.

This is in reference to the upcoming changes to the Shoreline Management Plan as proposed. I completely disagree with the need to remove wake buoys from the lake. It seems this is a safety concern and well as it offers limited help with keeping damaging wake from reaching the dock. There are lots of people that swim near the docks. My biggest concern is the buoys do remind boaters to slow down. Also the solar power requirement for the dock is a concern. I own a grid tied system at my primary residence in Willard, Missouri. I think it is the greatest thing since applesauce, however, it is grid tied. Removing the grid tie leaves batteries as the only way to power the dock at night. The electrical load seems to be growing, with the need for security, lighting and lift power- there would need to be considerable battery backup to maintain power. I may be missing something but I believe an incorrectly maintained Solar DC powered system is just as dangerous as a traditional shore powered AC system if that is the intention for requiring solar. Thanks for reconsidering these requirements.

units is in opposition of their desire to reduce storage items on docks. I also fail to understand the reasoning behind removing parking of ATV's and vehicles in front of public or private docks. Many times, I have guests with an inability to walk for any distance. In that instance, I find taking them directly to the boat dock to be a necessity. I do not understand why I would want to take them to the boat dock, then return home only to turn around and walk back to the boat dock. That seems a bit ridiculous and would require better explanation. The removal of No Wake Buoys seems in opposition of efforts to protect shoreline from erosion and while I understand the basics regarding vegetative permits, I feel it worth mentioning the multiple trips experienced due to vegetation covering dock steps. Maintaining a natural environment must balance with the safety of the consumer and the ability of the homeowner to care for their property so they can enjoy it.

First I want to thank the Corp for all the hard work they put into Table Rock! It's a beautiful place to call home and I know the Corp's goal is to keep it that way. My comments are regarding the No Wake buoy restriction and change to Solar power.

I'm a bit surprised that the Corp would suggest removing buoys especially with the increased boat traffic on the lake. We have seen a huge uptick in boats in the James arm the last three years, and a lot bigger boats than ever before. I have had to repair my dock beams twice (older dock) in five years and put longer stabilizing arms (3) to help with the bigger waves that pound my dock on busy days. With all the new boaters on the lake that don't know the "ways of the water" the buoys are a must. Without them I'm afraid we will have boats running into our dock. I do believe that they should have to go through the approval process to get one though like we did for ours.

Regarding solar, I don't think existing docks should have to switch although we probably will within five years. I'm concerned that some people won't have the financial resources to change and how will the Corp enforce that?

Thanks for taking our comments and considering them before a final decision is made.

Table Rock Lake SMP/MP/EA Project Manager,

There are several items of concern in the Shoreline Management Plan under review. I would like to communicate my areas of concern.

I am opposed to the following proposed change - "Only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) will be allowed. Existing licenses for overhead and underground electric service to private floating facilities will not be renewed after December 31, 2027."

I am opposed to the following proposed change - "New permits will be issued for new docks containing a range of 1 to 20 slips." Single boat slips should NOT be allowed as it will litter the lake shoreline and take away natural beauty.

I am opposed to the following proposed change - "Requests to modify docks can only be submitted by the permittee and only 1 request will be considered in the 5-year permit period." It is unrealistic to only allow one request over a 5 year period.

I am opposed to the following proposed change - "No-Wake buoys for private docks will not be allowed. Approved no wake signs may be placed on the dock. Existing no-wake buoys for private docks must be removed by December 31, 2020."

I am opposed to any change that tightens restrictions placed upon vegetative management permits.

I am opposed to any change that restricts storage for fishing and water sports equipment in a dock box or on a dock locker.

I am opposed to limitation or the banning golf carts from designated paths. That restriction will be a hardship for older folks and others with limitations. What's more, an immense amount of lake gear not to mention people are hauled via golf cart close to dock. Carts by design are low impact. I'd like to see no further restrictions on low impact golf carts as long as they're used on a dock's designated path.

Please consider Table Rock Lake lakefront property owners as you, the US Army Corps of Engineers, propose and ultimately decide what is "best" for Table Rock Lake's future.

My wife and I moved to Table Rock Lake because it was our dream to have a lakefront home that we could retire in while enjoying the beauty of Table Rock Lake. Like many others who enjoyed Table Rock Lake adventures as a youngster, it was the only lake we considered.

Now that we've had the good fortune to become lakefront property owners we've become less and less encouraged that you (the US Army Corps of Engineers) are considering what is best for all concerned with regard to the revised *Shore Management Plan and Master Plan*.

Our lakefront home's view of the lake has become more and more obscured by the overgrowth of trees, brush, and debris that gets caught in the brush undergrowth. This leaves the lake looking as if the shoreline that we both proudly boast as "pristine" appear to the public as unkempt, uncared for, and trashy.

After this year's flooding the issues were exacerbated as caring homeowners who volunteer to assist with the shoreline cleanup were unable to access the areas that most need attention; thus, the shoreline and lake was found to be dangerous to boaters and swimmers due to debris, logs, trash, etc. Boat docks and personal property items (i.e., boats) were placed at risk due to the lack of access to the boat dock due to trees and overgrowth of brush impairing the movement of the dock to a safe location. We the homeowners and boat owners are consistently paying for the upkeep and repair of the docks...all with your permission. Unfortunately, the ongoing repair costs continue to escalate far beyond market value of the dock itself. We have no option but to pay the higher prices...ultimately creating lakefront home ownership along with dock/slip ownership as a liability vs. asset.

As I am sure you are aware "lakefront" property is priced at a premium; however, placing more rigid rules and regulations on lake use, imposing additional vegetation clearance restrictions, and overall dismissing public opinion may have a negative impact on property values diminishing the desire for homeowners to upkeep lakefront property. No more pristine Table Rock Lake.

Our expectation is to keep the lake shoreline looking well cared for, inviting, and pristine so future generations will dream of owning and enjoying property and the beauty of Table Rock Lake.

I am seriously considering a property off DD Highway which is waterfront and wanted to inquire about the possibility of placing a new dock. I contacted the Corps office at Little Rock and was informed that this could be a possibility at this location. The Ranger advised that I make a written inquiry about this area. The property is 9 Memory Lane which is a parcel that is triangular and not waterfront. The sale will include the parcel just to the south which is waterfront (Parcel 14-1.0-01-000-000-028.008 Stone County assessor) and is approximately 8 acres.

The slip offered as an additional sale with this property is located several miles to the west and we unfortunately have no access unless we drive down DD and down Lancelot Ln to the end. I would very much appreciate your consideration of the following which addresses primary concerns and objections to 2 provisions outlined in the Table Rock Lake U.S Army Corp of Engineers revision of the Shoreline Management Plan. These provisions address No Wake Buoy Removal and the requirement of Renewable Energy Power in the place of shore power. Your consideration of this information is important to the safety and well-being of citizens who use Table Rock Lake.

No Wake Buoy Removal: One of the new proposed rule changes on Table Rock Lake is the removal of "No Wake Buoys". Idle speeds are much safer for boats to navigate around structures. State law does direct that it is illegal to operate a motorboat or personal watercraft (PWC) at speeds greater than "idle speed" or "slow, no wake speed" within 100 feet of:

- A dock or pier
  - An occupied, anchored vessel
  - A buoyed restricted area no wake zones within 100 feet from any boat docks
- Fortunately there are buoys in place to serve as reminders (much like speed limit signs on roadways). This is particularly important for the occasional, often novice, boater/PWC operator who may not be familiar with the law. Even if a boater is aware of the law, a person's perception of 100 feet is by no means an exact science and signage on docks is often not visible until a boater/PWC operator is well within the 100 feet.

Unfortunately, the U.S Army Corp of Engineers is proposing removing the buoys by year end 2020.

The safety of citizens and property protection is at risk if dock/slip owners are forced to be removed.

- The damage caused by wakes to docks and boats is substantial. Please contact dock and lift builders to verify.
- More importantly, the risk for serious, potentially fatal, injury to swimmers is one the Corp should seriously consider.

I request that you seriously consider the potential risks associated with this proposed rule change. Buoys are placed to protect public safety and property, offering a reminder to boaters to stay a safe distance from docks and maintain safe speeds.

Just as I would not support removal of speed limit signs, despite clear law dictating driving speed on roadways, I do not support the removal of no wake/idle speed buoys on Table Rock Lake.

Below is my concern and objection to renewal energy plans outlined in the Table Rock Lake U.S Army Corp of Engineers revision of the Shoreline Management Plan.

Renewable Energy Plan: the proposed requirement to replace shore power with a renewal energy source (solar/wind) will create safety issues and place an unnecessary financial burden on every dock/slip owner that must convert power. The draft "Finding of No Significant Impact" is not accurate when addressing the costs of solar systems and removal of existing shore power. There may not be an impact or financial burden on the USACOE, but there will be on owners of private/community docks and slips.

Not only is solar expensive, it is unreliable. The difference in dock solar systems and home solar systems is that a home is still tied into the grid in order to rely on power at night and on days with little or no solar power generation. Unless large battery storage capacity is installed, a dock runs the risk of losing lights at night.

The renewable energy clause is unreasonable as it:

- places an undo financial burden on dock/slip owners
- increases the possibility of theft or vandalism to docks or watercraft stored on docks due to inadequate lighting and
- most important, creates a navigation hazard for watercraft operators due to a risk of inadequate illumination

Bottom line... While I do support much of the revised Shoreline Management Plan, I do not, and for safety reasons cannot, support either the removal of no wake/idle speed buoys or the renewable energy provisions in the Table Rock Lake U.S Army Corp of Engineers revision of the Shoreline Management Plan.

Your consideration of these comments and concerns will be greatly appreciated.

When asked by many of my friends that had properties on Lake of the Ozarks why I preferred Table Rock my answer was because it is managed by the U S Corps of engineers. Over the years since 1987, however, I now ponder the wisdom of my decision. Through those years there has been an

endless flow of changes from the Corp. that have not only had use restrictions but large financial costs to conform to those changes. For example, when the community dock that I partially own was constructed in 1989, we wanted our source of electrical power to be underwater to eliminate the hazards of overhead lines susceptible to damage during the storms that frequent our area. The Corp. found that request to be humorous, yet a few years later when one of my neighbors decided to electrify their dock they were required to run the electrical line underwater and would no longer approve overhead lines that we were required to install. Now, in the proposed plan, all docks will eventually be required to be solar powered which will involve significant costs to all dock owners. Since our dock was constructed the permit fees have increased substantially. A major part of that increase is a fee charged for right of way to the dock that previously had not been charged yet none of that fee is used to maintain the right of way. The renewal of our last permit required the replacement of the flotation material to an encapsulated type which involved several thousand dollars in cost. More recently the Corp., during their survey of boundaries around the lake, chose to require unsightly elevated markers adjacent to personal property when all the years prior had ground level markers. It seems that these changes and many more not mentioned come about as changes in personal at the Corp occurs. It is this constant unilateral change that has created a negative relationship between the Corp and the residents that have huge investments in their properties located on Table Rock Lake. As one who chose this Lake because it is managed by the Corp., I do now wonder if my decision was a wise one.

SUBJECT: Proposed draft of Shoreline Management Plan

While we consider most of the proposed changes as unnecessary, we find the proposal to require only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) on our dock to be remarkably egregious. We presently share a single metered power source with dock # 7286. Our electrical charges for power service to both of our docks averaged \$18.15 per month for calendar year 2016. Since we have a total of 19 slips for the two docks this power cost spread over the 19 slips is \$0.96 per slip per month.

We attended the information meeting with the COE representatives during the Shell Knob meeting on August 1<sup>st</sup>. We inquired about the estimated cost of the proposed solar system and were advised by the COE representative that they figured a cost of about \$1,000 per slip. To propose that we spend \$1,000 per slip for a utility that presently costs us \$0.96 per month is patently absurd and only brings great discredit to the environmental staff on your team.

Our electrical power is supplied by Carroll Electric Cooperative which advises us that in 2016 they utilized 9% hydroelectric power and 6% wind power, some of which no doubt comes from Table Rock Dam, and are planning to incorporate additional wind power in the future. Certainly this is a much more practical approach to "Going Green" than the ludicrous scheme being proposed.

I strongly urge you to terminate this proposal and save us all a lot of headaches.

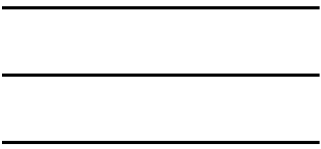

Solar power is unproven and unreliable in the midwest, windmills are extremely unsightly and a substantial danger to flying birds, particularly eagles. Will our lake be dotted with large windmills like we see on interstates? Lovely.... The conversion cost is several thousand dollars with several thousand more in maintenance and battery replacment. Many of us can't keep batteries safe in our boats from theives, let alone solar batteries. Who benefits from these new rules? Solar contractors, politicians, corps management? And maybe the commercial provider, they profit, thus more tax dollars flowing in. Indian point, Bass Pro, Big Cedar and more, why are they exempt?

What are the state tax benefits for electric to solar conversion? How does this effect Jefferson City coffers. It's not for the citizens of Missouri, it's not for River Valley Electric and it's certainly not for the lake betterment. There is no benefit to to the lake or citizens regarding these particular new rules. The only benefit seen is for contractors. Contractors removing electrical, installing wind energy and selling solar. The water remains the same as the shoreline, unchanged.

The additional damage is not only to seniors who require transportation to the docks via carts and atvs, but to families with children and the disabled. Those carrying skis, fishing polls, coolers, lunches and ice bags must be sort of healthy. Those who are not so healthy are being discriminated against. Dock lockers no longer available to fishing polls or even a chair? Really? The disabled are being disenfranchised, they can neither haul batteries nor install solar energy. Heck, many cant even walk down to their dock, they certainly can't walk back up. They depend on atvs or golf carts. I suppose we can also expect damage to golf cart sales and repair companies.

And finally an 8 foot deep dock slip, 8 feet deep when? March or August? 8 feet deep, how often, all year? What if it's a dry spell? Who decides to spend the time and money and resources checking depth.

I know these questions have been posed before, perhaps the answers will come in court.

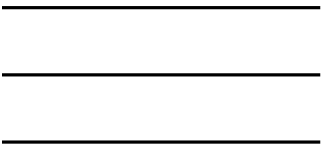

We are sending comments on three issues of great concern to us and we ask that you give them your consideration.

1. Cedar trees not only pose a fire hazard to our area through lightning strikes and household fires but since the flood a few years ago they have become so thick that sunlight is almost totally choked out causing the grass along the shore line to be starved to the point that it is dying out, because the grass can't grow, erosion is taking place at a rapid rate. If the cedar trees could be thinned out the hardwoods that make our shoreline so beautiful would be able to get enough water to survive. The cedar trees choke out the hardwood seedlings and prevent future growth. Most lake front property owners take pride in their property so much so that they take excellent care of Corps property also. Wild life is a primary concern for everyone. The deer, turkeys, and smaller wildlife are loved and encouraged. Without the grass that should be growing along the shoreline we will see less and less of these beautiful animals.
2. Public Boat Ramps are becoming a very large problem because the few available ramps that we have are so limited with places to park vehicles. An ideal place to put a public launching ramp with public parking would be south of the Kimberling Bridge.
3. Solar Power for boat docks: We have lived on the lake since its beginning and have never heard of anyone on Table Rock Lake being electrocuted on a boat lift, not to mention the outrageous expense it would burden dock owners. However, we have known of many drowning and accidents caused by alcohol and drugs. We know that forbidding alcohol and drugs would be an unpopular ruling but it would save many lives. Solar is not a very reliable source and my suggestion is to check into the pros and cons before deciding to promote this option.

Now that we've had the good fortune to become lakefront property owners we've become less and less encouraged that you (the US Army Corps of Engineers) are considering what is best for all concerned with regard to the revised Shore Management Plan and Master Plan.

Our lakefront home's view of the lake has become more and more obscured by the overgrowth of trees, brush, and debris that gets caught in the brush undergrowth. This leaves the lake looking as if the shoreline that we both proudly boast as "pristine" appear to the public as unkempt, uncared for, and trashy.

After this year's flooding the issues were exacerbated as caring homeowners who volunteer to assist with the shoreline cleanup were unable to access the areas that most need attention; thus, the shoreline and lake was found to be dangerous to boaters and swimmers due to debris, logs, trash, etc. Boat docks and personal property items (i.e., boats) were placed at risk due to the lack of access to the boat dock due to trees and overgrowth of brush impairing the movement of the dock to a safe location. We the homeowners and boat owners are consistently paying for the upkeep and repair of the docks...all with your permission. Unfortunately, the ongoing repair costs continue to escalate far beyond market value of the dock itself. We have no option but to pay the higher prices...ultimately creating lakefront home ownership along with dock/slip ownership as a liability vs. asset.

To Whom It May Concern,

As a general statement, we are happy with the current shoreline regulations. We have a cabin in Jackson Hollow and enjoy the lake by boating and swimming. We would like to express our opinion about the newspaper article which lists eight issues that a group (SaveTableRock) considers a threat to dock owners.

**1. “Requiring dock owners to convert to solar energy and remove electric lines.”**

Considering the recent flooding this year and in years past, we observed some docks nearly underwater. That could mean stretching the electric lines beyond their normal limits. The sudden drop of a power line could charge the water and injure human life and wildlife.

Solar energy would be a much safer source of energy for lights and charging batteries. We do not oppose the change of rule to solar energy.

**2. “Creating a restrictive rule on vegetative management and non-transferability.”**

The beauty of the lake is its wealth of vegetation. It is true that some cleared vegetation at launch ramps is necessary but to allow every individual home on the shore line to clear vegetation would limit places for water fowl and wildlife drinking sites.

We oppose any change in the vegetation regulations.

**3. “Limits on how often docks may be modified.”**

Most docks on the lake that we see are kept up and in good repair. It would appear that regular maintenance on docks would be a positive action.

**4. “Outlawing fishing equipment, tubes, wake boards, and chairs from being stored on a dock or in a dock box”.**

Different people have different standards for the control of their toys. Some “drop and run”. Others are careful custodians of all equipment. Again, during flooding time, items not stowed correctly will fall into the water and can get caught in boat motors as they may float submerged. It may be prudent to require all items to be stored in dock boxes or removed from the dock when not in use. No boater wants to spend their holiday unwinding a rope around their prop.

**5. “Outlaws all boats with porta-potties or holding tanks on private or community docks.”**

A community would not allow buildings with “Holding tanks” to leave them unattended. Spills would be an outrage to the neighbor’s sight and smell. It is reasonable to regulate that these conveniences be controlled for boats so that the water at docks and bathing areas near docks remains free of septic waste.

**6. “Outlaws No Wake Buoys and mandates their removal from in front of all private and community docks.”**

We obey “No Wake Buoys” when they are an obvious safety measure for swimmers and small water craft like canoes. However, if every dock on the lake is allowed to create no wake zones, we would soon have no passage way for passing fishermen, and water sports. There needs to be a more defined regulation that takes both needs into consideration.

**7. “Outlaws driving or parking golf carts, ATV’s, etc anywhere on Corps property which includes in front of community or private docks.”**


As senior citizens, we need to use our Golf cart for mobility to and from the dock.

A compromise of some kind should be negotiated so that those with low mobility can access the docks and swimming places. We urge accommodation in the new rules that allows the use of carts for the handicapped, and mothers with small children.

**8. “Arbitrary lake carrying capacity giving the Corps the ability to limit who uses the lake and when.”**

We live in a Country that created the Corps of Engineers which created the lake and keeps it free of hazards. It already limits the use of the lake with regulations that conserve the fish, wildlife and human safety. The Corps manages the water purity by ensuring that sewage is not drained into the water. It ensures that commercial fishing companies are not allowed to catch “all” of the fish to sell at a profit. It created a beautiful lake with beautiful trees and clean water. Yes, they must controlling engine emissions, people dumping trash into the water, wild boat drivers, and abandoned docks from floating out into the middle of the lake. We approve of their ability to make limits on the behavior of the public.

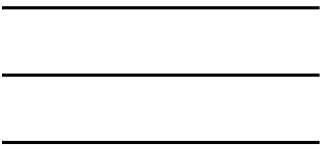

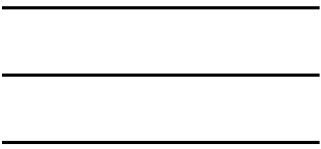

considerable portion of our retirement savings on buying our house and boat and boat slip. Now we are told that we will be incurring addition costs to maintain this life. I have done some research into solar power and it seems to me that it is not only expensive up front but the cost of maintenance and additional insurance we will never see the day that it will be cost effective. Even discounting the the maintenance and insurance the the life expectancy of a system is less than the break even point. So in effect we will be saddled with an expense that may be as much as 5 times the cost of electricity that we are presently paying. As a retired county employee and my wife, a retired teacher, living on a fixed income these costs could well mean we would have to sell our boat and slip because we simply couldn't afford the extra expense. And thus what we worked for all these years will be just a pipe dream.
