Taking no wake buoys off our lake is a HUGE safety concern for me, as boaters unfamiliar with TRL may not realize they have to stay 100 feet away from docks. These buoys not only keep people on or near the dock safe, but also these buoys help to keep excessive waves from rolling in which could potentially damage boats on docks. What about the buoys in areas of the lake that have potential underwater hazards? Are you wanting to pull those too? Or the ones in marina areas?

We purchased property near TRL rather than Lake of the Ozarks because the USACOE does an EXCELLENT job keeping TRL clean, safe and less commercialized than LOTO. This is what drew us to TRL. I am concerned what will happen to lake area property values if you put all these rules in.

I think TRL is perfect just the way it is. I appreciate that there aren't a lot of docks in the lake (unlike LOTO) and that the commercialization on the lake is low. The current vegetation rules are perfect the way they are as they insure the shoreline looks natural, yet allows property owners to keep their lakefront nicely groomed.

First of all I would like to say we are full time residents and love our lake. We want to see it preserved for the enjoyment and benefit of all. The Corp is currently doing a good job, and I personally don't think any changes are necessary, but also understand that times are changing and some changes may be needed.

My comments & concerns regarding the current proposed Shoreline Management Plan:

Solar/Alternative Power - The cost to convert to alternative power is prohibitive and electricity should continue to be allowed on the docks where it is currently the source of power. If you must make a change - change it so that newly constructed docks (not replacement or expanded docks) be required to use alternative energy. An additional issue to consider - how do you propose dock construction requirements be changed to accommodate the additional weight of the solar panels and batteries on a dock. Also - what would be the requirements concerning batteries for solar, i.e. where can they be placed, what special requirements for housing of the batteries to prevent acid leakage into the lake, what type of backup power would be allowed during an extended period of clouds that does not allow for battery recharging, etc, etc.

Buoy elimination - There are already too many people ignorant to the law regarding throttle speed within 100' of a dock, or that choose to ignore the law. If the Buoys are eliminated it will get much worse. At least with the buoys present, they are either a reminder or educator of what the law is.

Dock modification limit - I believe once every 5 years is too restrictive. With dock ownership changes, new owners could potentially have a long wait before for a modification request. I understand your reasoning for a limit, but I believe once every 2 years makes more sense.

I'm discouraged by the restriction on boats equipped with MSDs in private docks.

I don't believe there is a significant difference between the ability to properly maintain/service an MSD for a boat moored in a private dock verses a commercial dock. There are businesses in place around the lake that provide pump-out service making it convenient for any boat to pull up and deal with the MSD and usually purchase fuel at the same time.

Many boats in the 25' to 30' range are equipped with a Coastguard certified MSD that is designed to prevent overboard discharge and properly deal with sewage. To allow a private dock but not allow a boat with a bathroom on board to be moored in it is unnecessarily oppressive.

While we have submitted our generally-supportive feedback via the Master Plan Comment Form relative to the draft revised Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan and the draft Environmental Assessment, I wanted to take a moment to try to find the proper contact with whom we may speak about the subject noted above.

In the spirit of full transparency, while my wife & I both feel we were treated with respect and professionalism by the Park Rangers who came by our home to educate us on the Vegetation Permit after we notified the Corps of our purchase of the property, it is disheartening as both a taxpayer and a property owner to find the U.S. Army Corps of Engineers telling us... far-after our purchase of the lake-front property... of the significant restrictions of the Vegetation Permit. We purchased the home & property from its original owners/builders, and have confirmed from multiple sources that when they acquired the property back in 1976, the family spent several months clearing away scrub-brush and sumac from the shoreline well-onto the platted property. We've also confirmed with several in our small community there that the family had been allowed until only recently to keep the sumac from returning to the shoreline's point, but for some inexplicable reason, this practice was either discouraged or prohibited by the Corps. Given the rocky terrain, there is very-little to no reason to suspect the removal of this brush would result in any erosion of any significance at all.

As anyone from rural America can attest, sumac (*Ailanthus altissima*) is an invasive plant, serving no positive benefit to man or the wildlife in/around Table Rock Lake. Aesthetically, as a property owner, watching this pointless, ugly and invasive plant grow and begin to obscure our view of the lake - a view we've paid a significant amount of money to enjoy - is tragic. We love to watch the bald eagle(s),

heron, geese, ducks, deer, fox, and the many (many!) other wildlife that frequent our part of the lake, but none benefit from or utilize this invasive plant. (At best, as I found personally last summer in a very close call, they serve as a great place for water moccasins to hang out; yet another reason to be concerned, as we have a young grandson who could fall victim to this venomous snake, as could any of the other hundreds of boaters who often anchor along the shore by our home to enjoy the beach and swimming.)

What would we need to do, or is it something the Corps would even consider, to seek permission to once again clear out the growth of this invasive weed/brush along the point near our home?

Dear Ms Coburn,

Since I wrote my letter to you on August 24, I have had correspondence from **Malcolm Fortson in the Branson** office, who has looked into my question concerning the apparent removal of dock zoning from my property on Table Rock Lake. Malcolm indicated that "In researching this some, it does appear that the zoning at this location may be removed. It was zoning that was added as a rezoning request made years ago and never acted upon. Since the zoning has not been used, it is being considered for removal."

As I have mentioned previously, it was my intent when purchasing this property, to build on it and build a dock. The property was purchased conditional on it having dock zoning. I even had the Corp visit the property to confirm it's acceptability to have a dock on site. That was confirmed. Then, due to personal financial concerns, we were unable to move ahead with our plans, and needed to put this property up for sale. It is currently being marketed as having dock zoning, but due to the recent moratorium, we have not been successful in selling. Now that the moratorium has been lifted on dock building, I'm now faced with the possibility that the Corp is considering removing the zoning which has been in place since 1996. I respectfully request that while my property remains on the market for sale, that the zoning for "limited development area" remain in place. I purchased another property many years ago with the intent to build, but had to change plans due to personal financial reasons. The property purchased (2031-3-3 on the Corp map) was confirmed to have zoning for "limited development area" (163.5 on the Corp map). I had the Corp visit the site, and confirm it was acceptable for a dock. Now, I note the Corp is considering removal of my zoning due to not having had a dock already built on the site. My property is currently on the market, and is listed as having dock zoning. Due to the recent moratorium (recently lifted), there has been little interest in my property. However, if my zoning is removed, there will be virtually no further interest and the value of the property diminishes significantly.

1. Conversion to Solar. This is a significant expense to impose on existing docks. As long as existing docks maintain their electric services then they should grandfathered in. If the goal is to eliminate the potential for electric shock then having people add a shock sensor would provide the safety without the expense of solar.
2. Elimination Of No Buoy. The majority of boaters do not seem to understand that they can't go near a dock at speed and not cause a damaging wake. Without the No Wake Buoy to remind them I am concerned about them coming to close. I do not think that a sign on the dock will deter them.
3. Limits on Slip Size. We support the proposed max slip size proposal. This limit should help to limit the overall boat sizes on the lake and prevent the kind of unacceptable traffic and wave formation that can be seen at Lake Of The Ozarks which render that lake unsafe for the recreational boater.

Nor have they considered how limited those options are to provide reliable electrical power for typical dock needs. Any system dependent on batteries is a finite system and current state of

the art dock solar systems are only designed/recommended for brief intermittent power usage. Battery chargers, associated with any engine powered watercraft, are considered a continuous power usage item by dock solar power system providers and are typically not designed to support because of the exponential increase in the cost and size of the solar power system that would be required is prohibitive in most real world situations. There are numerous other shortcomings with solar systems as well. On dock wind power suggestion is a joke for this lake location. If reason is reducing the carbon foot print where is that requirement in the authorizing legislation? If it is restoring the natural look of the shoreline how is that possible when electric lines are buried? If it is safety there are better solutions such as 1.] 2017 NEC GFIC protection specifications for commercial marina and private docks which has been in use in Australia for 30 years has resulted in zero Electric Shock Drowning's (ESD), 2.] Isolation transformers used at marinas with shore power service to vessels with onboard AC systems and also on those same type of vessels which provides the same floating ground as solar systems 'safety' claim to fame. Isolation transformer(s) could be installed on the dock with GFIC protection added to the shore power line to the dock or Isolation transformer(s) could be installed at the shore power pole that supplies the dock. Either of these would provide CONTINUOUS power (not intermittent power) capability, are significantly more robust/reliable and at better at significantly lower cost/better cost benefit ratio.

#2. Removal of 'NO WAKE' buoys is a degradation to the safety of people on and swimming near docks and the docks and boats moored there in or attempting to moor or leave slip . On dock signs as a replacement do not work as well do to basic human nature. People do not diligently scan for signs to read while boating or focus on staying 100' away. Rookie boat renters generally do not have clue. The buoy provides an ever present in your face reminder/red flag of no wake beyond this point. Boats used on lake keep getting bigger and bigger so wakes are bigger and boats now often are designed deliberately to make bigger and bigger waves for wake boarding and surfing. Boat operators generally seek out quieter coves for their tubing and water sport activities which is where most docks are located. Whatever the COE has against no wake buoys there must be a better way to deal with it.

I do not disagree with replacing electricity to the docks with alternative power sources. However, sole use of solar or wind are not viable sources. Using solar and or wind to supply electricity would require huge -expensive storage battery facilities, still requiring the electrical cables to the docks, accomplishing nothing in eliminating the hazards incumbent with shore power. Solar and wind generated electricity requires storing the power generated in storage batteries. It would require large land based battery banks to supply the necessary electrical power to light the docks and operate the boat lifts. This still poses the current dangers of electricity and adds the major potential environmental and personal physical damage from a failure at a storage battery complex, which can be catastrophic!!!! I would gladly support pneumatic lines routed to the boat docks to operate the boat lifts. Leaks in an air line are easily identified and pose no harm. A leakage of electricity into the water is not detectable until 1 or more unknowing swimmers are electrocuted.--An occurrence we see every year on our lakes and rivers. Replacing electricity to operate the lifts with air is in my mind a no-brainer. I also support the use of "local" self contained solar lighting for the docks. Each light connected to its own local solar cell. These would obviously be low voltage. With piped air and with no electrical cable to provide shore power the safety hazard of electrocution would be completely eliminated. Moreover these two alternatives can be implemented immediately with far less cost impact than building a highly complex solar/wind power storage networks to support the existing format for lighting and boat lifts.

I disagree with banning golf carts, atv's and utv's from the dock area. I think they should be restricted to paved surfaces only. There are many many boaters who would not have access to the recreation and beauty of our lake if they were banned. I see many dock access roads that are not paved and these lead to unnecessary erosion. These should be paved along with parking areas around the docks.

I offer my experience and knowledge of D.O.D. and Corps contracting to make these alternatives I have suggested happen. I do appreciate the Corps efforts to solicit input from the public. I have always found the Corps receptive and cooperative during my many contractual encounters with the Corps during my career.

1. **First, the requirement that all existing private/community docks be converted to solar/alternative power and the current land based electric service be phased out within ten years.**
  - a. **This is impractical and would be very costly to install.** The calculation is that we would need at least 6 Kw for a total of \$30,000 plus another \$8,000 to \$10,000 for storage batteries. Net metering would help to offset some of this enormous cost but would require a dock to still be connected to the land based service system. Would this be allowed?
  - b. According to the Missouri Department of Energy, in our area there is an expected 200 days of sunny weather per year. **We are concerned with the ability to generate sufficient power from solar** on those remaining 165 days that have only partial sunlight or no sunlight at all. Our dock is located on hilly terrain and the afternoon sunlight is limited.
  - c. The **weight of several solar panels** being installed on the roof of a dock that was not designed or structurally built to hold the additional weight of these panels. This could cause collapse. The extra weight from panels on the roof might also raise the center of gravity of a dock that could make them unstable and increase the risk of turning over due to ice or snow accumulation.
  - d. **Would solar power wired through an inverter to change to AC be any safer?** We understand the safety issue with electricity and water but each dock is inspected every five years during the permit renewal process and we regularly check all our GFI circuits for proper operation.
  
2. **The second proposed revision we disagree with is the requirement that all boats with Marine Sanitation Devices (MSD) be moored in commercial marinas.**
  - a. Our understanding is that overboard discharge is **already illegal** so there is no reason for this change.
  - b. When our holding tank is close to being full we **motor to a commercial marina**. Forcing all boats with MSD systems into only commercial marinas seems extreme and unfair.
  - c. The proposal indicates boats in existing docks would be grandfathered however what happens should a boat owner sell and buy a different boat or sell their slip to another person with a different boat? Discussion with a Corps representative at the public workshop indicated that an existing dock would be grandfathered as a whole not just an existing boat but that is not how the proposed revision reads in your literature. **This needs to be clarified.**

3. **The final proposed change I disapprove of is the elimination of grants for stairs/steps.**
- a. Many docks are located along shorelines that are **very steep with unstable footing** that creates a safety concern for persons accessing private docks.
  - b. Our dock has both elderly and young children and persons with physical limitations. We have already had **falls due to steep and slippery paths.**
  - c. It is dangerous for people **carrying heavy and/or bulky items** to and from their dock.
