Solar : battery tech not there yet. Our dock is already solar and battery replacement is very expensive, and often. Electric companies may loose to much revenue all at once ?

No wake bouies: may be hard to enforce during Holiday weekends but raised lifts will suffer to much damage with constant pounding of waves. Leave old bouies in place, and not replace if missing or damaged. Try new docks without bouies and see how it goes.

Within the next five years, my husband and I plan to retire to our property at Table Rock Lake. We chose the area nine years ago, because of it's wonderful natural beauty and because it's quiet and well regulated. However, there is a difference between being well regulated and unusable. For example, if docks get inspected every year, but can only be maintained/modified every five years, then it potentially

becomes impossible for a property owner to meet requirements. On another point, the vegetative permits are strict already, making them even stricter prohibits basic use of the lake. We humbly plead with the Corps to consider the above objections and how these additional restrictions potentially make Table Rock Lake unusable. Thank you for your consideration. Orla Bourque

I would like for you to reconsider a couple of items on your agenda. The Power to the docks is very important for those of us who enjoy the lake daily. Solar Power is not feasible for our situation and will be very costly for us with limited incomes. I have not heard of any injuries or deaths caused by the electrical power used to supply the docks. Please consider more strict guidelines and codes rather than making all docks change their power supply. Also please allow the docks to use "No Wake" Bouys. We manage our dock very well and make adjustments to the rising/lowering water constantly as we would a Bouy. As a homeowner in the Shell Knob area I have concerns with the recommended changes.

The corps has strict limitations on mowing and trimming and no need to further restrictions.

The Corps does not want to allow grandfathered permits. My uncle has been a shoreline owner since the lake was developed. It would be a travesty if the land and permits could not be passed on to his children and grandchildren or if we could not pass our Shell knob home onto our family.

Dock modifications and repairs should be allowed if needed more than one time every five years. The one time every five years is unreasonable. Mandating solar power for every dock is also unreasonable. Docks are currently inspected by licensed electricians. Restricting storage on docks is also an issue I disagree on. I would like to be able to store boating equipment on the dock.

I understand the need for meandering paths and low impact access to docks but as I get older it is harder to have safe access to the lake shore water line. If I were to have a disability it would be very hard to reach the dock I currently use near my home. There should be some avenue to have a disability accessible route to the dock.

I also do not think the corps should be able to shut down the lake arbitrarily. I do not think the lake will become overcrowded. Safe boating practices are in place.

We have been homeowners at Table Rock Lake for 22 years. We could not be more opposed to the proposed revisions to the Shoreline Management Plan. It is a solution in search of a problem. The solar power for the docks is unworkable, unreliable, and too costly. This had never been a problem at Table Rock Lake thanks to the good inspections by the Corp. The cost is prohibitive for installation and maintenance of solar power. A few cloudy days makes the lifts on the dock unusable. If too many boats are out at night, lifting capacity is impaired if not unworkable. Night boating is frequent for fireworks viewing, as just one example. This occurs regularly at the lake and not just on July 4. Furthermore, if a storm hits, too many boats come in at once, overwhelm the solar power, and make the lifts unworkable.



Dear Corps of Engineers,

We are full-time waterfront home owners on the main channel of the White River upstream from Shell Knob, MO. We have camped and boated on Table Rock Lake since 1987, have been property owners since 2008 and full-time residents since January 1st 2016. We own a boat slip in a 20 slip community dock and have a vegetative permit.

We have chosen to vacation and now retire full-time to Table Rock due to the natural beauty of the lake/area and the sound management of the same by the Corps of Engineers. We have reviewed the subject 60 page document and can support the vast majority of it. Our greatest fear is that Table Rock might become as "developed" as the Lake of the Ozarks.

Below are the issues that concern us most with the proposed 2017 SMP -

1) The removal of existing No-Wake buoys by December 31, 2020. We feel that this change should Not be made. It is a safety issue with fishermen, swimmers and with loading boats on boat lifts. If the real issue is drifting or improperly placed buoys, perhaps a better solution would be a system of warnings, fines and then loss of buoy privileges. The Water Patrol drives by most of the docks on a daily basis and could easily monitor the situation. Why punish all for the sins of a few?

2) The requirement for Alternative Power Sources on all docks by December 31, 2027. This makes sense for all new docks or those without existing electrical services, but for existing electrified docks it would be a major expense and a drop in reliability as well as not really a Green change. The SMP does not detail how this requirement would apply to community docks - One large solar array with a large bank of batteries and inverter to 120Vac to refeed the existing dock or a small solar array with a couple of batteries and a new DC boat lift for each slip as well as the same for the community dock lights, etc. As an example, we own a boat slip with a 120Vac lift in a 20 slip community dock. Our Utility Electrical Service is overhead from a power pole set in a large block of concrete way above the 937' elevation level. Since we bought the slip in early 2008 we have not had a single power failure due to a storm or lake flooding event. If we were required to convert to solar power, there would be no savings in money or environmental damage by removing the existing utility electrical service. Each slip owner would then need to purchase and install a solar power system as well as a new DC boat lift motor. This could result in 21 solar arrays and perhaps 30-40 batteries scattered around the dock. Not only would the dock look

less pleasing, it would require replacing the batteries every 5 years or so forever and also a number of boat lifts not working due to dead batteries at some point (many slip owners are seasonal or remote). It is very possible that many items might be dropped into the lake during the installation of all this new equipment and/or replacement of the batteries. Again, not a very Green situation. Perhaps this requirement could be phased in for all new docks now and for existing docks as they have utility power failures or just want to make the change.

3) No parking on Corps property in front of community docks. We do not know if this is an issue or not as the Corps line is very uneven and not well marked. We would like to see that any existing parking areas be allowed.

4) It has been reported in the Media that the 2017 SMP would no longer allow personal property such as fishing equipment, tubes, wake boards, etc to be stored in a personal dock locker. We do not find this requirement in the 2017 SMP, but would be opposed if it were. We would consider fishing equipment to be essential to the operation of a fishing boat and tubes, wake boards, skis, ropes, etc to be essential to the operation of a ski boat and this allowed.

Our concerns seem to be in tune with those expressed earlier in your customer input process and we trust you will consider them seriously as you finalize the 2017 SMP. Thank you for listening.

I received your contact info from my Husband, AJ Hefel. I wish to express my concerns regarding the proposed shoreline management plan for Tablerock Lake.

Solar power:

The new plan notes that all current electrical lines are to go away and we are to convert to Solar Power by December 2027. This will be a large expense to our Community Dock (Private) owners. I am trying to understand the reasoning. I cannot believe that the 20 slips located within our dock or any dock for that matter create that large of an environmental footprint in regards to units of power/hour to justify such implementation. The amount of power it takes to raise my slip has to be minimal. The batteries needed to utilize the solar charging systems would have more of an impact in environmental terms at time of replacement.

Vegetation Modification Permit:

The vegetation/weeds located in front of our dock are mowed regularly. The mowing does not create an erosion problem/issue, as the roots of the weeds provide substance for erosion control. What the mowing does do is to insure/create an environment whereby animals such as skunks, venomous snakes, etc are visible to the people using the dock. We are expected to "mow" our yards along the lake per our HOA requirements (similar to City/County requirements elsewhere), yet to mow the vegetation alongside the dock, we will now require a permit. I believe this is paperwork which is not needed and in turn creates more work for someone within the Core.

Private Floating - No Wake Buoys:

The language in the document notes that no longer will "No Wake Buoys" be permitted, but "No Wake signs" will/may be posted on docks. I believe people who are unfamiliar with this practice will miss the "caution" the no wake buoys provide. These type of buoys not only protect the shoreline from large, possibly detrimental wake action against the shore, but they provide a level of safety, especially in areas where by the lake is narrow with swim docks on both sides. These type of buoys are used at other lakes not only within Missouri but elsewhere thru out the US. I will say it is hard enough to enforce the no wake actions around those buoys, but by removing them and posting the notice on the docks, people from out of town or who are unfamiliar with this type of identification will miss the point. Swimmer safety by the use of these buoys or similar identification should be paramount.

Golf Cart Use:

The document discusses the use of golf carts for people to reach their dock and states that a person has to have a letter of permission (LOA) for such use. The LOA is based on the disability/physical impairment of the user. I believe that the use of golf carts in and around the dock areas actually creates a smaller environmental footprint than the cars that are driven to the docks. I don't understand the reasoning for the change. Many people use electric or gas golf carts for the purpose of driving to the dock to minimize the parking impact otherwise provided by the larger trucks and cars.

Enforcement:

I would approximate that about 40% of Holiday Tablerock lake users are from out of town, and do not own a slip/dock on the lake. Some don't even own a home but bring their boats down for daily use and then leave at the end of the day. I believe the out of town visitors are likely not going to read the Shoreline Management Plan you have created or even know of its existence.

Most of the time the visitors "put in" at the Public boat launch locations around the lake and then go their merry way. These are the people who will not know of the restrictions to golf cart usage, as they bring/tow those as well. These are the people who will likely not know of the no wake changes.

How will visitors to the lake be made aware of the new plan and its associated guidelines?

I do appreciate your time and consideration in regards to my comments. I believe we are all wanting to secure the safe and environmental consideration of the lake for future generations.

Gentlemen:

We strongly disapprove (1) of the proposed changes to the current Shoreline Management Plan. The current plan has been in place for an extended period-of-time, and appears to need very little, if any changes. After attending a community comment meeting, and subsequently reading the more detailed information, we believe several of the proposed changes are directly a reflection of trying to increase the list of changes only as a means to validate the expenses incurred to hire the consultant(s) and prepare the report; clearly not with the safety of the public/property owners in mind.

1. *No-Wake buoys for private docks will not be allowed.* The removal of No-Wake buoys will have a direct impact on the safety of those not only in the water, but also those standing on, or attempting to get on or off of a boat. It is absolutely necessary to keep these buoys!! The newer boats used for surfing produce enormous waves; without the buffer the buoys currently provide, there is more likely to be damage to people, boats, docks, and shoreline.
2. *Only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) will be allowed.* The conversion to solar will cost prohibitive. The current requirement for certified inspections from a licensed electrical contractor seems more than sufficient. We would prefer to see this requirement required more often, than to mandate a solar alternative. Additionally, if you are requiring it of private docks, we believe it should be required for ALL public areas, including all Corps of Engineers facilities. If it is going to be mandatory, then it should be mandatory for EVERYONE.
3. *Elimination of golf cart parking and restriction of use* - This one will definitely “promote the safe and healthful use of these shorelines by the public while maintaining environmental safeguards to ensure a quality resource for use by the public” ~ (directly quoted from your policy, on page 5). Please help us understand how we are to get access to our docks? There is not enough parking for cars, we cannot carry our small children or grand-children, assist our elderly parents, carry batteries and/or fishing gear this entire distance, or walk up the steep grades when the temperature reaches 95+

with high humidity. Is this really an effort to consider safety in and around the shoreline? We would suggest the answer here is 'no'.

4. *Steps and walkways* – While many of us would certainly welcome the opportunity to have a safer option to reach our dock than scaling down a hill (loose rocks and dirt), that currently is our only option. Given our investment in Table Rock Lake (home, dock and boat) and the many businesses we support, it is unfathomable to us that the Corps of Engineers does not believe they can fairly access whether these steps/paths that were submitted and approved, however long ago (i.e. currently in place) are not worthy of review to remain or be improved. Additionally, how is it you would approve a new dock, yet would provide no provision/consideration regarding improved access, if necessary.

The Corps of Engineers has tirelessly and meticulously reviewed all of the permit requests for buoys, docks (construction/renovation/compliance), and stairs/paths. All of which were worthy of your approval. If the decision to change these is related to your manpower, then look to find increased revenue sources to offset the cost – please don't take away our opportunity to submit viable requests.

The proposed changes DO NOT “maintain environmental safeguards to ensure a quality resource for use by the public.” We respectfully request the Shoreline Management Plan NOT be approved as presented.

I also have a vegetative permit which allows me to mow a portion of the public lands and I really appreciate having that access.

I do have some comments regarding the proposed changes to the shoreline management plan...

1. I fully support having all docks switch to solar power. Having large electrical lines going to the dock is also a safety issue. So I am in support of this proposal.
2. No wake buoys...this is another safety issue. We just recently installed a no wake buoy for our dock. I have 6 grandchildren who love to swim in the lake off of the dock. The buoys were put in to limit fast boat traffic in front of our dock and I feel strongly that this should be maintained. All buoys have permit numbers on them and if they break off it is the dock that owns the buoys responsibility to retrieve and replace the buoy.
3. Equipment and chairs / swings on docks. Docks are certainly purposed for mooring a vessel and they perform that task extremely well. I am in support of allowing items like chairs, swings etc that will help make the experience of being on the dock more enjoyable. Without seats - my 92 year old mother would not be able to enjoy seeing her great grandchildren swim in the lake. 4. Golf carts being driven to dock...Without being able to drive my gator with balloon tires to the dock - again my 92 year old mother would not be able to enjoy being on the lake. I agree with not having roads over corps property - but having a golf cart or gator next to the dock for the purpose of transport of items like my mom, coolers, towels, etc - is limiting my ability to enjoy the lake. I strongly oppose this provision.
5. Vegetative management permits - I have had a great experience with the Army corps person who came to my property and renewed the permit. He told me what I could and could not do and we walked

I had priced and evaluated going to solar power a few years back. In discussing the

limitations with the largest provider of solar systems in the area, it became evident that solar was not a good option for us. At the time the provider made the statement that if the USACE were to mandate solar power, his fee would be dramatically higher.

The limitation of one modification per Permit every five years is bound to create huge issues among dock association members. If this limitation includes dock maintenance, then it could result in docks that are not as safe or structurally sound as they should be.

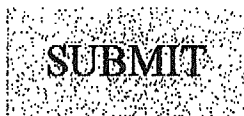

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on the Table Rock Lake Draft Shoreline Management Plan.

My house is on lakefront property near Tate Road. When lake is at target level (915 ft), there is only 25 feet of Corps property between my lot and the lake. I have owned the property since 2008, and witnessed three out of four of the highest historical lake levels. Each time the lake is high, the shoreline (and my back yard) is inundated with driftwood, dead trees, and assorted trash. It is up to the property owners to clean this mess up. The Corps should ENCOURAGE shoreline property owners to burn the resulting driftwood and debris instead of discouraging it. Any driftwood and debris left from high water will be right back in the lake next time it floods.

Whoever drafted the plan obviously does not have shoreline property and cannot witness first hand what really causes erosion and environmental issues. Each time the lake is flooded, much of the vegetation near the shoreline is destroyed. The wave action caused by wind and boats constantly erodes any soil at the shoreline, leaving only rock. As the lake is SLOWLY lowered, this erosion continues to whatever level the lake is at. It is NOT homeowners, golf carts or non-turf tires that cause the erosion! A golf cart will get stuck if using turf tires in loose gravel near the shoreline.

It appears many of the new draft regulations are geared towards commercial development of the the lake shore and against private and community dock owners. The commercial docks are able to pave parking lots, put in breakwater structures to limit wave damage, have unlimited electricity to power moored vessels, put in No Wake buoys across entire cove (near Big Cedar)

Private and community docks are not allowed to do these things. I would invite you to sit on my dock while large boats and wakeboard boats drive by, and experience the violent movement of the dock, boats and lifts. Yet you want to remove no wake buoys from all but commercial docks.

Part of the fee our community dock pays is for "parking" near the dock at the end of Tate Road. This area is deteriorated asphalt and gravel which is not maintained by the Corps. On busy weekends, there is no room to park because locals who are not part of the community docks use this area as if it was a public park, to park, fish and swim. Also, some people who are not part of the community docks use this area to launch their bass boats, and their boat trailers use up more of the parking area. These people do not pay any parking fees. I would ask that this parking area be reserved for the community dock slip owners only.

In regards to the following matters:

1. Proposal to remove all private no wake buoys: The effect of removal is an environmental and safety concern -

Although the number of private docks is nominal in comparison to the large commercial docks and marinas, the environmental and safety issues are not. Removal of these buoys will allow boats to go unchecked as they cruise the shorelines trying to find calm water for cruising, only to erode the shorelines with the continual creation of waves eroding the shores. There is also little regard for swimmers in the water, kayaking, or canoeing; which will be ignored even more with the removal. Let's not forget the fisherman who have called this lake their home for the last 40 years, and continue to get walloped by waves as they fish the shorelines near these docks.

2. Proposal to require solar power for docks: The effect of implementation creates an unnecessary burden on users by creating costly and most likely ineffective implementation issues, as well as potential risks to the natural resources around the docks –

It seems that off-grid solar equipment and battery installations have made tremendous leaps in technology over the years, but this still requires significant knowledge and engineering expertise to insure proper availability, maintenance and operation. Which, currently these required skill sets are not likely to be readily available in a cost effective manner in the area surrounding Table Rock Lake. Installation of a solar array and battery system could also become cumbersome on docks with limited space allowances. Systems like this will require the allowance of additional levels of decking, storage space and insurance requirements to existing structures. This also could create additional environmental concerns with unnecessary battery waste deposited into the water. A more prudent course would be to have a goal to implement solar energy in 20 years when solar and battery back-up technology should be perfected, if not far more advanced and cost effective.

We are writing this letter to you to voice our concern and disapproval of the proposed changes to the SMP.

1) **Proposal to remove all private buoys: safety concern**

Many times we have sat on our boat dock and said to ourselves “thank God we have a NO WAKE BUOY!!” Our biggest concern with your proposal to remove all buoys from private slip owners is that of **SAFETY**. We also don’t understand why you say it is OK for the commercial docks to have buoys because of the traffic/number of boats going in and out at resorts/and because of it being a safety concern?? What about the rest of us? We are very concerned about safety, too! So many boaters who pass on the lake side of buoys already create huge waves and wakes that make swimming by the dock nearly impossible and extremely dangerous. An attorney friend of ours said if the Corp forces people to remove their buoys, it’s only a matter of time before some child or person is killed, decapitated or loses a limb because of boaters coming too close to docks at high speeds, which will likely lead to liability risk for the Corp. These buoys are the only deterrent we have to remind boaters to maintain their distance from docks and to slow their speeds when coming inside of the buoys. We haven’t counted the number of boat slips in our immediate cove, but know the number is large. We have several large docks with multiple slips right beside our dock, not to mention now the increased number of slips approved and added for the Aunts Creek Condo Association.

2) **Solar power for docks: costly, likely ineffective and risk to environment**

We have heard an engineer comment that the concept sounds like a good idea, but likely won’t work as the Corp thinks it will. Docks won’t be able to take the weight from these batteries and it will be extremely costly to install and replace the batteries. The batteries won’t be able to re-charge fast enough to handle boat lifts and other power needs on the dock. Also, if these batteries should leak, you will be looking at environmental and water contamination.

I like a lot of the changes being recommended for the revised shoreline management plan. I take issue with one LDA boat dock requirement that has not been modified and that is the requirement for parking on private property within 200 feet of the dock.

Our development, which is on the north shore above the 20 lake marker, was platted in 1961. No thought was given to providing parking for a potential boat dock and probably there was no requirement for such at that time. Our development is only 15 acres and we are surrounded by the USFS land. Most of our homeowners can walk to the boat dock. Those that choose not to walk drive golf carts to the end of the road and walk from there to the dock.

We have an easement for three parking places that are 20' X 10' and not much room for any more which limits us to no more than 9 slips. We can park a lot more than three golf carts in three 20' X 10' parking places.

I think the SMP should allow for exceptions to the parking space requirement when there is no need for such.

Thank you for allowing the residents to give feedback regarding the SMP for Table Rock Lake. It shows that you value the opinions of the area homeowners.

After reviewing the SMP, several questions came to mind. I hope that these questions will be addressed appropriately and have been taken into thoughtful consideration during the course of the revision.

Docks and Dock safety concerns.

.) Forcing existing dock owners to convert to solar power will be a financial burden. **If a resident dock owner cannot afford the conversion, what will happen? Will there be a federal reimbursement program available to every dock owner ?**

..... Research shows that solar cells are not as reliable as electrical power. If there is not adequate sunlight, there will be no illumination of the docks at night, posing a safety issue. Likewise, what is a dock owner to do without adequate sunlight (solar power) to raise and lower a boat lift?

.) The Army Corps of Engineers permitted and allowed "no-wake buoys" to insure boater safety and at the same time help prevent damage to docks from waves and wakes.

What is the purpose of removing "no wake buoys" ? Safety on the water should be one of the utmost priorities. Many vacationing boaters exhibit unsafe boating, unsafe skiing, unsafe wakeboarding.... We have witnessed this many times. No-wake buoys offer at least some sign to these boaters to take heed. Even with buoys in place, many boaters still ignore the buoy and come very close to docks at higher speeds, posing a danger not only to themselves, but to the property of others, and to anyone who might be on the dock or swimming close by a dock. No-Wake Signage on a dock will either be ignored or not seen at all. **What would the Corps implement and enforce to insure the safety on and around boat docks?**

Additional Development and Boat Docks

Table Rock Lake is not a zero entry lake ...much of the shoreline has areas of steep cliffs and rocky outcroppings. **When calculating the potential number of additional docks, gathered in particular areas, were low water and high water level events taken into consideration?** With the fluctuation of lake levels, specifically when water level is low, the linear footage of shoreline greatly decreases. Conversely, during high water/flooding events, docks become less stable and susceptible to damage.

Additional Development, Water Quality, Water Levels

There has been an explosion of development and population around Table Rock Lake and the surrounding areas. The once lush green hillsides have been replaced with rooftops of buildings and acres of parking lots. What might be good for commerce, produces a deterioration of the lake environment, with consequences at present and forever down the road. As hillsides are excavated for


development, the natural vegetation is removed as well as the natural absorption of rainwater. The run-off of all the non-permeable surfaces (rooftops and parking lots) enters the lake.

.) Is there not a direct relationship between all the increased run-off and the occurrences of high water levels ? We have been homeowners on Table Rock Lake for 30 years. Only in the past five years have there been repeat occurrences of high water/flooding. With the Corps re-mapping of the original flood plain and now the additional run-off problem, great consideration needs to be taken when thinking about future development. High water events cause financial and emotional distress and damage to many people and in many areas. **Will the Corps insure that all future development/developers, recreational or otherwise, be required to create storm water runoff retention basins ?** With each high water event, more shoreline erosion occurs, more shoreline vegetation is destroyed, more wildlife is negatively affected, and environmental concerns are heightened.

.) What is the Corps plan for improving and then maintaining the quality of the water in Table Rock Lake? As homeowners for 30 years, we have surely enjoyed years of water activities. Over the past several years we have noticed a marked change in the clarity of the water. The water has become murky and very cloudy in many areas and it appears to be getting worse with each passing year. Increasing development and increasing the number of available dock space which increases the number of boats along the lake will most likely add to the further deterioration of the water quality. We request very thoughtful consideration of this important issue.

We have been very blessed to have enjoyed beautiful Table Rock Lake for many years. It is our hope that by working in conjunction with the Corps, the County and the residents, the future will offer the same controlled, clean, quiet, safe, and pristine environment for human and wildlife generations to come.

I am writing in response to the Lakeshore Revision of 2017. Firstly, let me thank you for your care of our beautiful Tablerock Lake. Like you, our family wants to maintain a balance between the preservation of wildlife and natural resources, the enjoyment of tourists and homeowners, and the desire for economic opportunity in the region.

My husband and I purchased a small cabin with a private boat dock and swim platform in the Shell Knob area 21 years ago. It has been the hub of our vacations ever since. We've loved sharing it with our three daughters and now with our six grandchildren. Our dream is to keep our cabin for future generations in our family.

After reading both the Master Plan of 2014 and the Revision, I would like to address two issues that directly impact us. Firstly, if I am reading the Revision correctly, it sounds as if no furniture is to be allowed on docks. Frankly, what an authoritarian and self-defeating policy!!! I will give a brief history of our boating life. We first got a ski boat 32 years ago and kept it in the High and Dry in Kimberling. Every weekend we would go to the lake in our boat and spend the day out. Next we joined a community dock. We knew no one there and, again spent the day out. Since buying our cabin, we spend hours on the dock, often not even going out in our boat. In our cove, there are six docks, all private - some with single owners and some with multiple owners. At least 4 of those docks have children constantly playing. We have a picnic table on our dock and have for twenty years. We eat on our dock, play cards on our dock, read on our dock, and, yes, drink some beer on our dock. This policy would destroy our favorite part of our lake house. And so self-defeating. Would you prefer everyone out on a pontoon using gas and churning the lake water. You recently



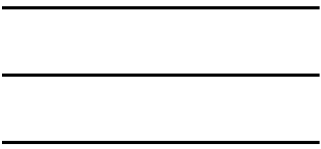

1. Removal of No Wake buoys - doing so creates a significant safety issue for people on docks, near docks, swimming near docks, boats coming and going from docks, etc. Not to mention the increased wear and tear on docks which will then require modifications more frequently than 5 years simply for general maintenance and upkeep.
2. Solar power - a more targeted plan to convert than an arbitrary time frame would seem appropriate, e.g., when electricity needs on a specific dock need attention. Does the cost truly outweigh the benefit?

First and foremost, thanks for letting us weigh in on the proposed changes to The Tablerock Shoreline Management Plan.

My husband and I own a home and shop on the second tier (lake view rather than lake front) in the Shell Knob, MO area. We bought and rehabbed a home that will be our retirement home in the near future. We love Tablerock and it is our intent for this home to be passed down to our son and his wife and after that to their children. The comments I would have for the new plan are based on the intention that we will be living at the lake full time in the near future AND how rules today will impact our son and his family in the future.

In reading the plan, I am given the total number of docks that are currently allowed but I am wondering if there is a "first come first served" policy or if there is a plan to distribute the docks evenly by either population via uniform distribution across the lake or?. We live on what, at least locally, is called "the quiet side of the lake". We like that but that is not to say we wouldn't be interested in our own dock (we use the marina currently) if one were conveniently located. However, we don't want Kimberling City or Branson type concentration either.

12' wide slip is pretty confining for a pontoon boat. I hope this size is designed to mitigate the number of large boats on the lake as this is a problem but we have a tritoon and this could have an impact on people like us with "old people boats".

Having been involved in multiple, whole house remodeling projects, I am aware that sometimes one project creates a need for adjustment in another area that was unforeseen when the project commenced. I would like to know the reasoning for the rule of changes only every five years to see your side of the coin but I think a shorter time frame would be more reasonable.

There is a number of \$10,000,000 floating around out there for dock power conversion to solar. Given the number of electrocution deaths in Missouri lakes alone in the last few years, I am not necessarily opposed to solar powered docks but, before I could decide completely, I would need to know the average cost per slip/per slip with lift to convert for the dock owner. I would also want to see a grant program or government assistance program to offset the costs of the conversion for those who would struggle to achieve this conversion. There are many retirees on the lake. Certainly some are wealthy but some are not and struggle to keep what they have. For example, my mom is 85. Her house is too big for her to take care of. Due to a knee issue, she can't even access the bottom floor. Her yard is beyond reasonable for her abilities to maintain. However, this is her home and she is steadfast in her position she will only leave the house feet first. She has lived there since 1988. My father actually passed away in that house. This is her home. It is the same with some of the elderly on our lake. What happens when they are financially unable to convert? Is there a process for that?

I am opposed to removal of the grandfathering for vegetation permits. I would need to see evidence of significant negative impact to the lake to change my position on this item.

I want to know how you will satisfy the requirements of the ADA with the stairs/steps/tramways part of the changes. If there is an accommodation which would allow a disabled person access to the lake that would involve one of these assistance items - how will you justify not allowing it? Is there a provision for this type of situation?

The issue about which I feel the most passionate, however, are the no-wake buoys. I don't know how often the folks who are making these rules are on the lake on a weekend but - in a nutshell - people, in general, are ignorant of boating rules and safe boating conduct. Without these buoys I guarantee you will see a rise in loss of life and destruction of property. These are critical safety devices and it is absolutely imperative they stay in place.

I would also encourage you to add a regulation to the plan involving wake surf boats. These boats create such a huge wave (and that is what they are designed to do) that it impacts everyone else on the lake and the shoreline as well. The people driving these boats often bring them back into coves where people are swimming and where boats may be close together. Little people, even in life jackets, often have the water go over their heads. Boats that are close together or even tethered together are often damaged. I would love to see designated areas for this activity that give people the option of this recreation but in a manner that doesn't downgrade the experience of those enjoying other types of recreation on the lake.

Dear Sir or Madam: we wanted to express our strong objection to changes that could further restrict our access to our community dock than what we presently have. As a disabled Army veteran of 28 years and a retired Department of the Army civilian, we respectfully request that you do not restrict our access to our dock by changes to golf cart use or parking on Corps property. Our dock is hard enough to get to based on the shoreline terrain where it is located and we have to reconstruct our meandering (and very steep) pathway to our dock ramp after each instance of flooding or high water, of which there have been several since we retired in 2007 and moved permanently to our lakefront home in Shell Knob.

Regarding burning, we ask that the Corps rules are sufficient to allow clean up of the shoreline to prevent safety or hazard issues on or near the shoreline. Our dock is located such that moving the trees, large limbs, etc that wash up on our shoreline is impossible. They present damage issues to the dock and safety issues to slipowners. Request that your burn policy be reasonable to allow us to clean our shoreline and keep it clean.

We are concerned about the requirement to go to alternate power sources. Our dock doesn't have electricity and our use of a generator to raise our lift works very well. We don't want to lose that capability and the expense of going to solar, notwithstanding the ancillary equipment required to support a solar power system, is staggering. We request to be able to continue using generators on our dock.

We are writing to express our concern regarding the requirement for all docks to convert to total solar energy. This requirement is not feasible, as solar energy will not provide the needed energy for boat lifts; especially, on holiday weekends when use of lifts is particularly heavy. This energy source is also lacking in the evenings when boaters come in after dark or are leaving to go have dinner or have an evening cruise on the lake. Additionally, we are not confident that lifts would operate as needed in the event of any emergency requiring the transportation of someone in need of help. We have elderly and handicapped members that require a reliable means of egress. We appreciate the concern for electrical safety and our dock has addressed this by installing an alarm to alert members if an electrical current is present in the water. Further, we require members to unplug their lifts from the electrical source when not in use.

Secondly, we strongly disagree with the removal of buoys from the lake. Our cove has three docks and the present buoy alerts boaters to slow to "no wake" speed when approaching the area. This buoy helps keep swimmers and others on or around the docks safe. Also, with all the rentals on Table Rock Lake, buoys help alert inexperienced boaters or those unfamiliar with the lake to changes in conditions.

We strongly oppose both the proposed solar energy requirement, and the removal of buoys from the lake.

Vegetation Management

The vegetation management policy in the current state needs to be revamped. A clear, concise, comprehensive set of rules applicable to ALL with no "grandfather" exception would be an asset toward the protection of the natural beauty of the lake and to the overall management of such by the Army Corps of Engineers. However, the current policy is too restrictive and I would recommend the following:

- Reduce the amount of "park protected" zone on the perimeter of Table Rock Lake. The current zones do not adequately reflect a realistically needed area of protection. Perhaps zone ONLY that area encompassed by the park with a minimal protection or buffer zone.
- Discard the requirement to obtain a permit to remove vegetation, ie brush, trees of a certain diameter, etc to allow ANY property owner to mow and remove underbrush, trees/bushes 2" diameter and cedar trees 3" diameter. Remove the "grandfather" exemption - period. This mixed set of rules only creates confusion.

I would ask that the Shoreline Management Plan NOT be changed. At the very least, please do not allow the changes noted above to go into effect. It would have a devastating economic impact and would be detrimental to the public's right to use and enjoy our lake.

Lake Carrying Capacity

Restricting the carrying capacity of the lake does not appear to be necessary now, however, the Corps of Engineers could reserve the right to limit this later. I cannot imagine how every boat access point could be monitored to even begin to enforce such a restriction. Also, would this perhaps target the lower end

of the socioeconomic tier that can afford neither a private nor a commercial slip for their boats and can only launch their boats from public ramps?

Vegetation Management

The vegetation management policy in current state needs to be revamped. A clear, concise, comprehensive set of rules applicable to ALL with no “grandfather” exception would be an asset toward the protection of the natural beauty of the lake and to the overall management of such by the Army Corps of Engineers. However, the current policy is too restrictive and I would recommend the following:

- Reduce the amount of “park protected” zone on the perimeter of Table Rock Lake. The current zones do not adequately reflect a realistic needed area of protection. Perhaps zone ONLY that area encompassed by the park with a minimal protection or buffer zone.
- Discard the requirement to obtain a permit to remove vegetation, ie brush, trees of a certain diameter, etc to allow ANY property owner to mow and remove underbrush, trees/bushes 2” diameter and cedar trees 3” diameter. Remove the “grandfather” exemption - period. This mixed set of rules only creates confusion and resentment of property owners who are not grandfathered seeing what their neighbors who are can do with their property.
- Establish a permitting process for anything exceeding the standard requirement.

Removing Electricity from the Lake/Dock Modifications Regarding removing electricity from the lake, I think the real issue here is safety. Removing electricity may be a noble goal, but I suggest making the safety of the slip incumbent upon the slip owners, ie, a periodic inspection by a certified electrician that the electrical system is in safe working order. To enforce this, require a permit to own a dock and revoke the permit if the owner fails to comply. Offer incentives in the form of free or significantly reduced dock permit fees to any slip owner who converts to 100% solar. I also recommend doing away with the 5-year limit for dock modification requests. This would be extremely cumbersome to dock owners to make necessary improvements, and many may make modifications anyway. Unpermitted modifications could be hazardous to the safety of the lake.

I am encouraged that the public's comments during the process have been acknowledged by the Corps. Thank you for listening. Please continue to help us protect our rights to use and enjoy our beautiful lake.

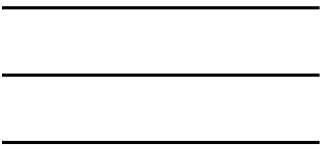

Malcolm, thank you for replying to my email. The reference number for my property appears to be 2031-3-3. I'm taking that from a copy of the Corps map showing the color coding (light blue) for a dock in front of my property located on Wandering Trail Road. The map also indicates another number as being 163.5, which seems to reference the limited development area in front of my property. I also have a copy of the March 7, 1996 letter from Kenneth Foersterling, Acting Resident Engineer at the Little Rock office, confirming the zoning at this location as a "limited development area". As I look at the current redrawn shoreline map, I note that the area where my zoning existed is labeled as "neutral Change. Alt 4 Preferred". However, the description has been changed to "protected", thereby eliminating the Limited Development Area designation that was in place. Perhaps the new plan is in error, given the fact it does say it's intended to be a 'neutral change'. Assuming that to be the case, it would be appropriate to correct the new map and description to reflect how it has been since 1996.

Again, thank you for looking into this, and I look forward to hearing back from you.

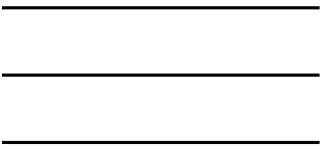

I am opposed to the electric requirement. Our dock has existing electric service that works well and is inspected regularly. I believe that the alternative source requirement puts heavy burden on dock owners. If this is implemented, it should be required for all docks, including commercial docks. There should be no exemptions.

Current vegetation regulations work, maybe some increased enforcement would help

The modification of docks limits is unnecessary. I'm not sure of the reason for this.

The lake is busy, limits on new slips are needed. In my area (Little Indian) we sometimes look like Lake of the Ozark's. In the last 15 years the Chalets at the Lake have expanded a 8 slip open dock to 2 20 slip covered docks. Being a resort, this dock generates more activity than a private dock. Also, it seems Kanakuk Camps seems to be able to do whatever they want. They have docks that generate so much traffic that it monopolizes the Little and Big Indian. They place buoys wherever they please. They clear vegetation at will.

I am opposed to any new docks on the Little Indian.

I am very concerned about the proposed changes to the Shoreline Management Plan in the following ways:

1. I object to the requirement of converting all docks to solar power only. This is unnecessary and cost prohibitive. This should be a choice but not mandatory.
2. I object to the more restrictive rules on vegetation modification permits. The current rules are restrictive enough already. Cedar trees are a fire hazard.
3. I object to the proposed rule of only one request per dock for any modification in a five year period. I feel one every five years is too restrictive.
4. I object to the proposal that does not allow equipment or personal property to be stored on a dock.

I do believe good rules protect everyone's safety and property values. I do agree some rules may need to be updated but I feel the four comments stated above are adequate the way they are currently. I also agree there needs to be limits put on development and growth so Table Rock Lake does not become an overcrowded mess like Lake of the Ozarks. I support limiting the number and size of dock slips and allowing smaller two slip private docks to help slow the growth.

I have several concerns with the SMP proposal.

1. Biggest concern is the conversion to solar power. We have two docks, each for 14 boats, that are currently powered with AC. There is one electric meter and we never reach the minimum billing, which is \$30 per month. Very minimal amount of electricity required. The amount of energy that would be spent on a conversion could never be offset by solar power. Batteries would also be another type of contamination if something would cause, such as a tornado, them to get knocked into the lake. Solar powered docks would have the same possibility of electrical shock if solar was inverted to AC. Current GFI protection on AC is very safe.
2. Warning bouys are very important. Unfortunately there are many boat operators that wouldn't know about the 100 ft rule on docks but surely would know to steer clear of bouys.
3. Huge overreach to be concerned what is being kept in a dock locker.
4. Access to docks via a golf cart or UTV is a great concern. Many are not to the point of getting a doctor's handicap for a permit but are close. Many have guests that would need to have easy access that wouldn't have a handicap permit. Currently there doesn't appear to be a large problem across the lake on access being abused so regulating it more just causes problems. We bought the slip on our dock, paid a little extra, because we do have easy access. Making a change of no access changes the value of the slip.

I have other concerns but these are the most important. Please don't take away our enjoyment of a wonderful lake.

There are 3 major concerns I have in the proposed revisions for Table Rock Lake. We have had a lake cabin on Table Rock Lake since 1997 and have had a boat since 1992 that we have used on Table Rock Lake.

1. Solar powered docks off the grid seem entirely not feasible. With our present electric service, Whiter River Electric monitors the electric service 24/7. If our power goes off, their service staff is there almost immediately without us making a phone call to tell them the power is off. With an off the grid solar powered system no one will be monitoring. Many people who have docks with boat lifts do not live there and issues with dock power could be dangerous. Boaters depend on the lights on docks to find their docks when out in the lake at night. What if a person is out boating on a cloudy day, returns to the dock expecting to put their boat on the lift to lift the boat out of the water, and there is not enough power to lift the boat out of the water? The expense of putting solar panels on the docks would prohibit many good people from being able to have a boat and a slip with a lift on a dock. If solar collectors were put on land they could not be put on Corps of Engineers' flood land. Does that mean the Corps would want to purchase adjoining land to install solar collectors on privately owned land? Are there batteries to store solar collected power? Where would those batteries be installed? How much would that cost and who would pay for it? Would the docks be structurally safe for the added weight of solar panels and batteries? Who would be picking up the tab for designing and checking all the safety criteria? All of these added expenses will drive many boat owners off of the lake. Not everyone who owns a boat has boat loads of money! It is a good thing to have safe, reliable and economical power.

2. Vegetation. I support keeping in place the "grandfathered" mowing permits. I want it to stay the same. I do not wish to have tall grass and weeds near my property where my grandchildren play in and near the water. It is a safety issue.

3. No Wake Buoys. Why? The No Wake Buoys are a reminder to boaters who have no regard for the safety of swimmers. Big wakes up close to docks are not good for docks and lifts and are dangerous. I cannot think of 1 good reason to implement such a proposal.

I have been living on or visiting Table Rock Lake since 1968. I love this lake, it has been sad to see the changes to the water. But the changes in the plan do not seem to be changes to improve the quality of the water. Only to make hardships for those who use the lake.

1. Compliance with the proposed regulations concerning alternative energy sources for docks will be cost prohibitive and unattractive. Generation of sufficient electricity to operate boat lifts, dock lighting, charge trolling motor batteries or provide other necessary electrical services to the docks will not be possible through alternative sources of energy at any reasonable cost or expense.
2. Eliminating golf cart parking areas and restricting golf cart use will virtually make it impossible for small children and the elderly to reach docks, transport coolers, batteries, water and boat equipment, food and other property for dock use.
3. Steps provide access and use to the property, safety and without any impact to the surrounding.
4. Buoys protect both docks and shorelines from large waves and destruction and provide safe areas for swimming. We have a no wake buoy in front of our dock (with permit). Unfortunately so many boaters disregard these buoys and this make it so dangerous. So I can only imagine how much worse it will be without the buoy.
5. Burning logs and brush protects the lake from pollution and boat damage as

well as beautifies the area. If we could not remove the logs after each of the floods we would not even be able to walk to our dock.

The current rules sufficiently safeguard the lake property and provide a balance between the public use of Table Rock Lake and the need to protect and preserve the lake's beauty. The cost and environmental benefit of the proposed rules are out of proportion, unnecessary, provide little if no real benefit at a huge cost and expense to adjacent property owners.

I hope you will not go through with these changes.

As full-time residents on Table Rock Lake, co-owners of a community dock and vegetative management permittee, we have a vested interest in your updated Table Rock Management Plan.

Overdevelopment on our part of the lake has led to a serious reduction in water quality, overuse by boaters and jet skiers, harmful effects on wildlife, and a reduction in the quality of life that we sought when we retired here over 14 years ago. We believe the revised Shoreline Management Plan allows for too much additional development and dock construction in areas that are already overdeveloped and overused during the busy summer season. We are providing the following comments for your consideration in the final version of the Shoreline Management Plan:

- An increase of roughly 50% in the number of “access opportunities” is far too many, as the majority of those increases will almost certainly take place in the Kimberling City and Indian Point-Long Creek parts of the lake. These areas are already crowded and suffer from hazardous boating and jet skiing activity during the summer months.
- The Corps should place and maintain “no wake” buoys in areas of high dock density, as the 100' no wake limit is frequently misunderstood and/or ignored.
- COE should carefully monitor plans for development near the shoreline to ensure that hydrologic considerations regarding runoff are adequate. We have seen long periods of muddy runoff into our cove from erosion due to earthmoving during the Top of the Rock development. Water quality has deteriorated significantly over the last few years.
- Provision should be made for a guest of a private/community dock slip owner to temporarily moor a boat in the owner's slip while visiting for short periods of time (e.g., two weeks or less).
- Page 29, line 39 should be changed **from** “Trees and shrubs up to two (2) inches in diameter (measured at ground level) may be removed.” **to** “Trees and shrubs up to two (2) inches in diameter (measured at breast height - DBH) may be removed.” Two inches at ground level is unnecessarily restrictive.
- Dock owners should have wide latitude in moving/relocating docks during flood and low-water events, which have occurred with regularity over the last six years.
- Solar and/or wind power is a commendable goal for future dock construction, but owners with existing power lines should be “grandfathered” for a period greater than 10 years.

Thank you for the opportunity to comment on your Management Plan Update.

My opinion of the draft document is best described as a 5.

As the US Army Corps of Engineers, Little Rock District, I'm not sure my concerns matter much to those making the rules. Government does what it thinks is best, often despite what the people tell them they want. I hope the decisions made for Table Rock Lake are made with the least amount of environmental impact and the fewest regulations needed to make that happen, with the safety of the public being paramount for the entire plan.

The most important factor which affects my opinion of the draft Revised Shoreline Management Plan as presented is the ambiguous wording. The plan appears to contradict itself in several areas and offers no direction in others.

As an example; Page 19, Lines 40-41 and Page 20, Line 1, "If LDA is available, docks may need to move to increase the current spacing. In no case will the distance between docks decrease if the current distance is 100 feet or less." Does this mean docks which are currently approved where they are may need to move? Who pays for that?

I also find the "point of contact" descriptions very confusing. On Page 13, Lines 20-23, "Being listed as a trustee or point of contact for any slip will be construed as owning one as it applies to the maximum ownership of two slips on the lake." The next paragraph continues, Page 13, Lines 30-32, "Being listed as an owner or point of contact for any slip interest will be construed as owning one slip as it applies to the maximum ownership of two slips on the lake." However, Page 24, Lines 24-32, allow for one person to

be the “point of contact” for more than one dock. These same lines confuse the issue even more, and appear to allow one person to “own” multiple docks as the “point of contact”, which could result in such an individual speculating in the market of available slips, raising the price to outrageous amounts just because they can.

I also believe the current Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan and Master Plan, including the revisions and all alternatives under consideration, discriminates against married couples. Unmarried people, whether at the same address or with the same last name, are allowed two slips per person. However, those of us who comply with the rules are limited by the restriction. I think not only is the ruling unfair, it sets the Corps up to policing the bedroom, imposing itself into the private lives of those using the lake.

The most important factor affecting my opinion of the draft Environmental Assessment and draft Finding of No Significant Impact prepared for the Shoreline Management Plan Revision is the flawed process used to gather the information. Projections are based on preconceived numbers, not the unexpected growth expected in the area. I believe the use of Table Rock Lake will grow faster than anticipated, and the Corps, as well as those using the lake, will be overwhelmed and unable to provide a safe and environmentally proactive future for the area.

I applauded the move to renewable power sources for docks at Table Rock Lake. However, the arbitrary deadline I believe could result in shoddy workmanship and price gouging by unscrupulous contractors as dock owners scramble to meet the requirements. It may also result in a glut of inspections required at an inopportune time for the Corps. As technology advances, new and safer alternatives may become available. A deadline set for 10 years past a current “boat dock permit” renew date or Dec. 31, 2027, whichever is longer, might be a better timeline all around.

The removal of “No Wake” buoys for private docks is very concerning to me. But is this another one of those confusing wording areas? A dock owned by a single person is a private dock, where a dock with multiple slips and more than one owner is a community dock, hence the wording on Page 9, Lines 20-23, is not applicable? The proposed changes which allow for the “No Wake” wording on the boat dock only is troublesome. Impaired vision, from sun glare, low-light, weather, or other conditions present a very dangerous hazard. Boaters have a difficult time “seeing” the notification buoys now. I would think the Corps would endorse even greater notification when the public safety is involved.

Although I do not believe boat docks should be used as storage sheds, not allowing personal property on the docks except that which is “needed for the essential vessel operation,” is extremely restrictive, in my opinion. Fishing tackle, skis, towropes, and other sundry items are used with many vessels, but are not “essential” to the operation. Consequently, dock throw rings, boat hooks, ladders, as well as seating out of the weather are important items for the safe operation of vessels on Table Rock Lake. Proper hydration would suggest ice chests be allowed. Nowhere did I find the storage of canoes, paddle boats, kayaks, paddle boards, or other small vessels used on the lake addressed in the plan. Did I miss that?

Although I have many other concerns, I implore the Corps to make the best possible choices for the protection of the environment, safety of the boating public, while implementing the least amount of regulations to accomplish these goals. Your mission is daunting, as whatever your decisions, someone will be unhappy. It is a Herculean task, I thank you for your efforts.

If anyone reads this far, I am truly surprised. And I thank you.

For the most part the new Regulations are good. However I have problems with the removal of NO WAKE buoys. Prior to installing our buoy we had ski boats and wave runners within 10-20 foot of the dock. This created a fear of swimmers at the dock being run over. I know that 100 foot from structures is the law, but people have a very poor knowledge of laws and almost no idea how far 100 foot is.

We set our Buoy at the 100 foot mark when the lake is at normal level. As the level changes almost daily it is almost imposable to maintain an exact distance. However, the buoy gives the boaters a point to stay outside of. It also gives the swimmers from the dock a point to stay inside of.

I feel it is a safety problem removing these buoys. It also cuts down on maintenance cost from big waves from the surf boats make.

Page 8, line 28. Reference Docks located outside of LDA an.... Have been placed in LDA, thereby relieving the grandfather status for these docks. Nonconcur. I don't know the Corps rationale for doing this other than as the Corps stated, it removes grandfathering of docks. In my opinion this is just one step towards removing these docks from the lake. It appears from looking at the map of new LDAs that certain docks were specifically targeted by the Corp. The area directly adjacent to the dock is designated as an LDA, however, adjacent shore line to the left and right of the dock is not identified as LDA.

Page 9, line 1. Does repair or replacement of the dock or parts of the dock due to storms, wind, rain, river (logs) fall into this one permit in five years?

Page 12, line 18. If a person has multiple homes on the lake, is that person still restricted to two slips? There are cases where persons own multiple homes. They may or may not be used as rental property or vacation homes. In cases where the property is being rented, can the renters use the owners boat slip?

Page 13, line 9. What is meant by "essential" operation of the vessel? Recommend that it also include used for maintenance of the dock. As stated we could not keep a broom used to clean otter poop or spiders off the dock or boat in the locker.

Non concur with the elimination of the no-wake buoys being removed by December 2020. Recommend this change be eliminated and no-wake buoys be retained for private docks. While there appears to be no enforcement to boats for violating a no-wake buoy, they do serve a vital purpose. From my observation and my actual practice, boats do slow down when they are within the no-wake area between the buoy and the dock. If there were no buoy, boats would not slow down and cause big waves next to the dock/swim platform. I was recently floating off our dock. A wake boat passed, the wake was so big and powerful, I saw a 1 to 2 foot space under the floatation under our swim platform and the swell from the wake boat. It would have been worse .

Page 32, line 20, The plan states no golf carts on Corps land because of erosion. Their appears to be more erosion caused to the shore line and damage to docks caused by wake boats. I am not

recommending that wake boats be prohibited, because I know that is not a reasonable request. Recommend that specific wake boat use areas be established in areas where there may be less impact to erosion.

Reference to Only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) will be allowed. Existing licenses for overhead and underground electricwill not be renewed after December er 31, 2017. Has there been any discussion as to where the "solar" panels and equipment will be mounted on the dock. Can the Corps approve an addition to the dock that the equipment and equipment housing cabinet can sit on. Is the Corp going to issue minimum equipment standards?

Table Rock Lake SMP/MP/EA Project Manager,

This is a request for your consideration to retain already installed no wake buoys which are near private boat docks on Table Rock Lake.

Our dock (Permit #3679) is located on a large cove near the public swimming area in Aunt's Creek. It is a common place for boaters to pull water skiers because it's a large enough area and usually fairly smooth because of the wind break.

In the past couple of years we have seen a large increase in the number of boats that are designed to fill the bilge with water to create an extra large wake behind the boat for surfing. As I'm sure you know, these create an unusually large wake that causes a great deal of stress on the retaining cables of the boat dock.

Currently with the no wake buoy in place they are directed to stay approximately 100 feet from the boat dock which decreases the severity of the wake before it arrives at the dock.

As an active flight paramedic with 40 years of EMS experience, I have a bigger concern than this. The swim platform off the dock is an area where kids routinely swim in their life jackets. Without the no wake buoy in place, a boat (which is stern low/bow high because of the filled water ballast) with decreased forward visibility and their attention focused to the person behind their boat may be too close.

Thank you for all that you do to keep Table Rock Lake safe.

I admit that I did not attend any of your public workshops, but have read the proposals and am concerned as a homeowner who has been coming to this area all of my life and am now in my 60's.

1. Not allowing golf carts or requiring proof of need is ridiculous. I broke my hip this Spring and had we not been able to use the golf cart, my ability to get to our dock would have been extremely limited. People retire to this area and as we get older we have health issues. This would just restrict ability of dock owners to enjoy the lake.
2. Not allowing buoys around our docks is also ridiculous and a safety hazard. Boats are getting larger, waves are getting bigger, and boat drivers are often stupid (per my observation). Without our buoy, they would be driving way too close to our dock and safety would be compromised for not just swimmers, but also our dock. I realize that there are laws around how far a watercraft can be from a dock, but I assure you that many, many boat drivers do not understand or follow the laws.
3. Converting all old docks to solar power - I understand the premise, but isn't it possible that this could be cost prohibitive for some? Also, isn't there risk with this in cases where boats can't be put on the lift because the solar power storage is empty? I agree with all new docks only having solar power.
4. It's not clear to me that there is a process for allowing exceptions to these regulations should it be appropriate. There are always situations that arise that may require something outside of the guidelines, but I don't see that there is a process for that.

* I object to changing the Maximum size slip has changed from 14' x 30' to 12' x 30. Many boats will require 14' wide slips in the near future and I've already made investments according to the current width limit of 14'.

* I object to " When a slip is registered to a trust, boats using the slip must also be registered in the name of the trust." - This completely negates one of the primary reasons for placing assets in the trust. By placing my boats within the same trust as my land or slip assets, then my entire trust becomes liable for suit should my boat(s) prove liable to injury to others. My attorney strongly advises against placing any motorized vehicle in my trust. Typically a trust can be named similar enough to allow the corps a reasonable expectation that my boat is titled in a way that is easy to match my trust's name. You are rendering trusts liable beyond your jurisdiction.

* Creating solar / battery powered docks is worse environmentally and for safety. The DC current is much more dangerous. The batteries will end up in the water. Safety concerns are not addressed, prior safety issue occurrences with the power on the dock have not been documented from issues with how the power got to the dock, but rather with the wiring on the dock itself. Secondly the maintenance expense of the batteries and solar panels are significant compared to typical electricity. Other lakes do not have this requirement, and in fact this will lower the value in my home as others will refuse to come to this lake due to this issue. In fact, if this passes, i'm leaving.

* I object to the discontinuance of no wake bouy's for private docks. Without drawing boaters attention to slowing down, it is extremely dangerous and likely accidents will occur with boat and people traffic entering and exiting the slips/ docks.

* I object to " No other equipment or personal property is allowed to be stored on the dock. " Again, ridiculously limiting and difficult to enforce.. and reduces the value of my property as potential new residents will go to other lakes that don't have such stringent rules.

We agree with the LDA changes

We disagree with the limit of one dock modification every five years, as that is too long a period and could prevent dock owners from making positive changes in Year 1 because they know that's the only change they'll be able to make for the balance of five years.

We agree with the slip size reduction, 12' by 30' is more than adequate for boats on this lake.

Eliminating power lines to docks and moving to alternative power sources for boat docks no later than 2027 is too soon and will be financially and logistically burdensome for many dock owners. Perhaps providing information to dock owners about solar options, and the cost of solar installations declining, will drive dockowners that direction.

The elimination of no wake buoys is nonsensical. That would be a safety hazard as they clearly designate areas that may have people swimming near docks. Boat drivers should always be on the alert but the buoys provide a clear line for the swimmers not to cross and the boats to be very careful.

I've never understood the Take Line boundaries, and wonder if they could be improved now with new technology, so that they better follow the contours of the lake and allow for more efficient use of land.
