

Before the Corp comes up with a SHORELINE (my emphasis) Management Plan, it must come to grips with the fact that Shoreline is Shoreline and Table Rock Lake (TRL) has 758 miles of it. Merriam-Webster defines shoreline as the "land along the edge of an area of water such as ocean, lake etc". If it's your policy to establish "guidelines for the protection and preservation of the desirable environmental characteristics of the shoreline", the policy must cover the whole shoreline, not carve out a distinction between the affluent and well-connected, that is Big Cedar Lodge owners, other Commercial Concessionaires, and the common man. "One size fits all" truly applies here. The regulations and all of the ramifications as they apply to the shoreline definition we just agreed to, must be consistently applied along ALL of the 758 miles of shoreline. An example of your logical conclusion is that the 200 foot maximum setback from habitable structures for mowing and under-brushing must apply to Big Cedar as well as myself.

Secondly, you must face up to the fact that while for the most part you have great staff at the TRL office, you are severely understaffed to the point that you cannot enforce the current regs with that staff. For example, your current staff is months behind in renewing existing Shoreline Use Permits for vegetation modification (mowing) and approving new applications. More regulation for the sake of regulation will do no one any good and will accomplish nothing when the staff cannot police clearcutting lots and cattle lolling in the water just West of the Long Creek Bridge (picture supplied to Ranger at Chateau meeting).

Thirdly, as you will conclude if you face facts with an open mind after reading my arguments, there should be NO change to the existing plan, except extending the existing regulation to all. Among many of the points you put forth for discussion that should be dismissed are your suggestions for Solar Power, Removal of Buoys, and Slip Size.

So let's begin with some details.

No Wake Buoys. Leave existing reg alone. No change. Again, what is good for the goose is good for the gander. The reasoning for a No Wake Buoy in front of my dock is no different than the reasoning for a No Wake Buoy in front of Big Cedar. If you are taking buoys away from private docks, your logic would also apply to Big Cedar. If your premise is that the law requires boats to operate 100 feet from a dock and therefore there is no need for the buoy, I'd like to tell you of the time a three year-old was slammed into my dock by the wake of a boat roaring very near my dock without regard of the 100 foot law, but before I was allowed to get a permitted No Wake Buoy. I still get wakes from the bigger boats that you have allowed at Commercial Concessionaires, but they are not running right next to my dock as they round Point 2 as they see the buoy. Most rental Boat operators and many boat owners are ignorant of the 100 foot law and need the visual reminder of a buoy even though they are going too fast to read it. They just know they should stay away. Removal of the buoys will put the private parties that you have established guidelines and policies to protect, at severe risk for bodily harm, and increase the likelihood of extensive wake damage to the docks themselves.

<u>Solar Power</u> The Trump Administration in February issued and Executive Order to all government agencies that requires them to justify any new regulation that would impose an



additional financial burden on the consumer and small business. For each new reg issued by an agency, two must be eliminated. Under separate cover I am asking my US Congressman and US Senator to investigate how the Corp of Engineers can impose a regulation demanding the removal of electrical power to all docks and install solar power at the cost of thousands of dollars in violation of the Executive Order.. Does the Corp have any idea of the cost of solar power on a 20-slip dock that will lift boats that weigh 5-10,000 pounds simultaneously? Then let's add in the cost of rebuilding the docks to handle the weight of the batteries. Is there a solar system designed with enough power to lift the boats at State Park Marina and Long Creek Marina? Now I would like you to answer the following question for me (brosna504@gmail .com). Under our present regulations at TRL, we have our docks inspected every five years by an electrician. How many deaths or severe injuries have there been at TRL (not Lake of the Ozarks!) in the last five years. Perhaps I have not looked in the proper places, but I have not found any. If you say overhead and/or underground power on private docks is dangerous, the same statement would have to apply to Big Cedar etc. Of course, you would apply the same regulation then to those Commercial Concessionaires: no underground or overhead powerlines. If you feel the number of electrocutions at TRL is excessive, might I suggest instead that all electrical service on Corp property be annually inspected and certified by a Licensed Electrician that the service meets all International Codes. He or she would lose their license if the document is not accurate.

Slip Size Again, please simplify the regulations. If Long Creek and State Park Marina can allow many fifty foot boat slips, the same rules should apply to me on my private dock. Actually, I agree with reducing the width allowed on private docks to 12 feet on private docks. But a 14% reduction in the width of private dock slips, should be accompanied by a 14% reduction in the width of size of future commercial concessionaire's slips and renewals. There seems to be an over-emphasis on Twin Island Estates mowing permits while a blind eye is being cast on the real culprits of erosion, the three and four foot wakes from very large boats dragging their stern as they plow along the shoreline, and also severe erosion done by the lake levels not being dropped fast enough after our many recent floods. Let me take you on a tour of the shoreline to show you the damage. The damage has not come from the landowners along the lake mowing 100-200 feet from the foundation of their homes. If you truly want to stop erosion of the shoreline, reduce the size of big boats on the lake. The way to do that is to control slip size. Control slip size you control boat size. Perhaps the Corp should send a representative to the state of Indiana where they are studying the effect of big boat wakes on the shoreline of Indiana lakes. One of the recommendations they have studied is to limit boats on the lake surface to either 300 feet or 500 feet from the shoreline! At your public hearing on July 31st, I picked up a handout entitled "Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Update". On the second page under Shoreline Zoning Discussion Points, you state "In accordance with (36 CFR 327.3) we will look at Commercial Marina Expansions as alternative to additional private or community docks". Again, your bias toward Johnny Morris et al shines through at the expense of the considerably more private stakeholders. Please excuse MY bias again but I would ask the author of the suggestion to call me, unless he is a commercial concessionaire. He or she should tell me where in that reg does the Corp feel it is mandated to look into further Commercial Expansion, which would lead to more big boats, more shoreline erosion, more inexperienced rental boat



owners, unlicensed under-aged wave runner drivers etc. That reg does NOT cover Commercial Marina expansion nor does it require you to look at commercial expansion at the expense of the 13,000 true stakeholders in the shoreline.

Shoreline Management Plans Developed from Flawed Focus Groups. Let's remember that the review we are participating in, is of the shoreline of TRL, not of tourism in the city of Branson. Having been a bank president of a bank in a large bank holding company, I've participated in many focus groups over the years. Results are almost always slanted when one writes the questions, and handles the interviews themselves. You need independence. In this case it is worse. It is my understanding that the focus group was made up of businessmen and women, attorneys, shop owners, architects and a few private citizens, mostly from Branson. This study is reviewing the TRL Shoreline, not tourism in Branson. Yes, perhaps one focus group should be composed like you did but SEVERAL groups should be comprised of real stakeholders in the Shoreline: owners of the 11,000 privately owned land parcels, 1900 active private facility permit holders, owners of the 13,000 slips owned by private parties and the 15 commercial concessionaires (the numbers are yours). Thinking about those numbers, do you really think your focus groups gave you valid data about what the 13,000 true stakeholders in the shoreline wanted? Of course not. Therefore, I would ask that you suspend the arbitrary dates you have established on your calendar, and hire an outside firm such as Fleishman Hilliard or some other such firm to prepare the questionnaire and conduct focus groups from the appropriate number of real stakeholders of the shoreline. At the completion of those focus groups please come back to me and say that all of the shareholders of all of the shoreline want smaller slips, no buoys, solar power on their docks, and further expansion of the commercial concessionaires.

Other Under your "Update, Major Items for consideration", you list as one of your ideas "only issue new dock permits/slips that are within 200 feet of parking on private property". In areas like Twin Island Estates 5 or 6 lots, all adjacent to TRL might be more than 200 feet from their dock/slip. You keep running this proposal out every year or two. I simply will not work and needs to be permanently put to bed by the Corp!! This would prevent some prospective homeowners from purchasing a slip and would severely impact some home values. Another idea was to "require applicant to obtain s registered land survey for private property adjacent to government land". I already have survey monuments installed by the US Government on my property. Now I have to do it again?? What, you don't believe your own survey teams? Sometimes I wonder who dreams these ideas up.

Thank you for requesting our opinions. We hope that you listen to them and leave the regs basically alone. Simply make them effective for everyone.



My comments regarding the proposed new Shoreline Management Plan are based on the information being presented to the public by SaveTableRock.com

Alternate power

Require any new docks and those that have never had power, to install an alternate source. You could also include docks that are being torn down and rebuilt.

Grandfather those with traditional power until such time as they do not pass electrical inspection at renewal time.

Giving a 10 year timeline to convert to alternate power could prove a financial hardship to many. Another drawback to alternate power is the potential to burn up small power tools, battery chargers, etc., as reported by those who use these items on solar powered docks.

Another concern, however it may be extreme, is the dumping of dead batteries into the water instead of hauling them off the dock and recycling.

Non-transferrable vegetation permits

Vegetation permits should be reviewed and inspected when a property is sold, even if it is to a family member. This ensures that the new owner is not blamed for actions of the previous owner. Being non-transferrable does not mean that a vegetation permit will not be issued.

I feel that the wording on this issue by this group, is being used as a scare tactic.

Dock modification

This is one area that I totally disagree with.

The sale/change of ownership of boat slips is a very common occurrence and more often than not, there needs to be some modification for the new owner. Only allowing 1 dock modification request per every 5 years, the loss of potential income to many of us doing business around the lake would be great. It would not only affect those of us that build and modify boat docks, but could very much discourage the sale of a home with a boat slip or dock included.

I realize that this change may have a lot to do with decreased manpower and trying to reduce paperwork, but there needs to be another solution.

One solution could be a call to the corps office with request. If request can be granted from the office by reviewing pictures and data in corps database, approval letter is then required from slip owners and email approval is then sent to the permittee. During physical dock renewal inspection all changes are noted and listed on renewal letter. Permit renewal is not granted until new stamped engineered plans are submitted with other renewal paperwork. This would force the slip owners in the dock to police themselves and make sure slip owners do not make changes without consulting the other owners. Risk losing permit or assessed a heavy fine if the rules are not followed.

Storing of items on a dock

I find this statement from this group to be ridiculous. I found nothing in the draft to indicate that this was not allowed. I did see in the section for Unauthorized Activities, that personal items could not be stored on corps property. However, the items listed were items that would be on corps property surrounding your home, not on the dock. It states in the boat dock section that the items this group has listed can be stored in dock lockers.

Boats with holding tanks

All existing boats of this type in private or community docks should be grandfathered.	Allow boats of
this type in a new dock if they are not longer than the slip they are going in to.	

No wake buoys

Most no wake buoys are not maintained as they are supposed to be and boaters seem to disregard them. A sign on the dock is not going to make any difference. Serious boaters should know the "rules of the road" and if they don't, get the boat numbers and turn them in to the water patrol.

Parking of golf carts, etc

I don't see where this rule has changed, so I really don't know what they are upset about.

Carrying capacity

I'm not sure I totally understand this proposal, but it sounds like right now it is something that is being monitored and not going to be implemented any time soon.

As a business owner, private dock owner and someone who lives lakefront with a vegetation permit, I find some of the items this group is posting to be a scare tactic.

We build boat docks and boat lifts for a living and have been in business for 25 years. I talk to many people daily regarding docks, lifts, the corps, etc., and the majority of the comments about the draft are regarding the alternate power, however, I'm amazed at all the misinformation and rumors that are being passed around.

I have been enjoying this lake for over 50 years, coming here for vacation every year from Illinois and now having lived here for 25 years. My parents passed on their love of this lake and area to us, as we have to our kids and grandkids.

While I may not always agree with some of the things that the corps does, I appreciate their hard work and commitment to keeping our lake a beautiful place.

My comments on the SMP are as follows:

Carrying Capacity – I've looked at the calculations that were presented for determining the carrying capacity of the lake and I'm baffled at how it was concluded that the threshold is 30,806 access opportunities. There is over extrapolation of the limited data included in the analysis and the methodology is suspect. There are a number of problems with the data used, which are beyond the scope of this discussion, including that the time period evaluated coincided with a recovery from an extreme economic recession. I'm not implying that the methodology overstates or understates the carrying capacity, simply that the data are not sufficient to be drawing a conclusion on an appropriate limit for the lake carrying capacity. I believe that at this point it should merely be identified as an issue that requires further study over additional time. [As an incidental issue, it would be of interest to know what figure was considered as the usable surface area of the lake, since the total boats in use at carrying capacity was determined to be 3,334, which doesn't seem to correlate well with the 10 acres of surface area criterion that was stated.]

Permits to Modify Docks – I don't understand the reason to limit permits for modifications to once every 5 years. I don't believe that there should be a limit established at all, but once every 5 years seems particularly overly restrictive for dock owners that may want to make modifications due to changing circumstances.

Alternative Power Sources – What is the rationale for wanting to change to alternative energy? Has a cost benefit study been done? I would expect power usage on a dock to represent a low capacity factor usage, so energy savings are not likely to justify the capital costs, particularly for existing docks with external services already provided. There will also be potential complications with weather and other reliability issues.

Vegetation Modification Permits – I recommend against the restriction on mowing or under brushing across any natural or manmade break.

No Wake Buoys – My experience with signs on docks is that they only result in drawing boats to the docks to see what the signs say.

Private Floating Facility Permits (Docks) – "Docks are approved for the mooring of the owner's vessel and the storage of gear essential to the vessel's operation. No other equipment or personal property is allowed to be stored on the dock." I don't understand what the Corps is trying to accomplish here. Boat

docks typically serve many purposes beyond simply mooring a vessel and storing gear. For example, fishing, swimming and other water related activities, picnicking, relaxing, etc. These other uses are integral to the lake experience. I don't believe the Corps should try to set any general limitations on use or storage, other than to prohibit specific activities that might be harmful to the lake or other users. Community Docks – "Shoreline Use Permits for community docks are issued to a community dock association." Do all community docks have (or are required to have) community dock associations? My impression when we were looking for property to purchase is that some community docks do not have formal dock owner associations.

Dock Access Requirements – With the change in dock size restrictions, there should be allowance for different access requirements. For example, the exclusion from a dedicated parking requirement for a single owner dock should also apply to a multiple owner dock where all owners are also adjacent landowners.

Storage Lockers — "Prior approval is not required for the installation of lockers; however, lockers must be shown on the engineer certified docks plans provided to the Table Rock Office." This requirement is unclear. Since prior approval is not required, in the case of the addition of a locker, the plans already on file would not show the locker. Surely it's not intended to require that engineer certified plans be prepared and submitted just to show the addition of a locker?

Personal Watercraft (PWC) Mooring – Similar comment to above for Storage Lockers Deck Over – Similar comment to above for Storage Lockers Exhibit B – Item 1, I believe the Exhibit reference was intended to be to "C" rather than "B."

Exhibit B – Item 14, As I indicated above, I don't understand the purpose of this item or the intent of the "limitation." Boat docks typically serve many purposes beyond simply mooring a vessel and storing equipment. I don't believe the Corps should try to set any general limitations on use or storage, other than to prohibit specific activities that might be harmful to the lake or other users.

I understand that the time frame for comments was extended until September 15, 2017. Accordingly, as a property owner and dock permitee on Tablerock Lake, I offer the following thoughts and suggestions.

First of all, I can appreciate the complexity of managing this public resource in a responsible manner due to the multi-use nature which accompany these large reservoirs. While Tablerock Lake, along with other similar reservoirs, were initially built to help mitigate floods and generate hydro electric power, I am sure you will agree that Tablerock and other similar bodies of water create a huge economic, recreational and lifestyle opportunity for local communities, tourists and those of us who call Tablerock our home or home away from home.

First of all, I for one am all in favor of responsible management of this lake with emphasis placed upon preserving the natural community that was here long before this lake covered its valleys. There of course has to be "balance" and "compromise" by all parties, including the Corp of Engineers, in how the land surrounding this lake should be managed. I am sure you would agree that none of us want to create a situation like exists at the Lake of the Ozarks with wall to wall commercial development and dangerous waters created by irresponsible lake and shoreline management. However, from a common sense enduser perspective, there has to be some lieniency in some of the restrictions which are being proposed.

Regarding the Shoreline Power restrictions being proposed, if your concern is "safety", I fully understand the concern and would support more stringent requirements and inspections for permitted docks. I do not support, however, a moratorium which eliminates completely Shoreline Power in view of the current limitations inherent with Solar based systems. I have spoken with commercial entities which sell and service these types of systems, and they will be the first to tell you that these systems have very significant limitations and are not capable of keeping up with the electrical demands frequently found during heavy use periods or on docks where battery chargers are being used by fishermen to recharge deep cycle batteries.

Regarding prohibiting the use of golf carts or similar vehicles from accessing a dock is unnecessarily punitive to a great number of people who call Tablerock Lake their home or home away from home. I am sure that you understand that a good many of the Lake's residents and patrons are older individuals. While I recognize that the proposed regulations provide a process for acquiring a handicap permit for those who meet the definition of "handicap", simply being old, or very young, is not a recognized

handicap. Furthermore, even if such a provision were put in place, connecting a violation of this regulation to a potential revocation of a boat dock permit is not reasonable and impossible for a dock manager to effectively police. A more reasonable approach would be to continue the current practice of permitting reasonable access to docks in a manner which reduces shoreline erosion concerns.

I am not sure why there is a concern regarding "No Wake" buoys. I would be the first to agree that there are certainly boat owners and operators who fail to operate their vessels in a safe and responsible manner. While the "No Wake" buoys probably do little to slow down many of these operators, the Buoys at least keep the boats a safer distance from docks or other floating structures, not to mention help reduce dock and lift damage due to large waves. On a similar note, I am very much in favor of not increasing the size of boat slips allowed on permitted Tablerock docks; using Lake of the Ozarks again as an example of how not to manage a body of water, bigger boats translate into bigger problems for not only the lake but also the vast majority of people who use it.

I am all for keeping the current balance between permitted developed area around the lake and undeveloped "green" space. By doing so accomplishes many things that will help maintain the water quality and natural systems which would be put in jeopardy if a more commercially focused perspective were to be adopted. I can imagine that your agency is under regular and intense pressure from commercial developers and biased political officials whose only interest is in generating more revenue at the expense of putting at risk all of the qualities which makes this Lake special and worthy of our protection.

Thank you for the opportunity to voice my thoughts and opinions. I look forward to revisions in the proposed plan which factor these concerns into the final proposal.







To Table Rock Lake Shoreline Project Manager or Whom It May Concern:

The more I hear about some of the new regulations and penalties being proposed, the more alarmed and angry I am. I hope that you sincerely mean what you say about desiring public input into the revised draft of the Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management plan, and even more, that you will be open to changing some your plans if the 'public' pushes back. The 'public' has learned the hard way over many generations that "you can't fight city hall", and that government bureaucracies too often think of us as silly 'sheeple' to be sheared, taxed, herded, ignored, and otherwise exploited and controlled. So I'm going to assume that you really will read my comments, as well as the others coming in, and I will attempt to express my objections to some of your ideas as kindly as possible.

You are proposing a course that will make the lake very user-UN-friendly. There are people of all ages and socio-economic classes who enjoy the lake, but for example, 1) your idea for imposing solar docks will put undue financial strain on retired people on fixed incomes, and frankly, all but the more well-to-do. Money, and people, tend to go where they are treated well, and it won't be Table Rock Lake if you persist in making it expensive and difficult to access this lake. Longer term, your revised plan has the potential to wreak havoc on our entire regional economy. I'm truly hoping that this is not your desired outcome, a la Agenda 21 or some other nefarious globalist progressive social engineering scheme.

- 2) No parking on Corps property—Seriously?!?! Unless you are trying to chase people away from this lake, you need to re-think this. Contractors working on docks need reasonable access. And it's cruel to ask retired people, or handicapped people, or families with small children, or frankly **anyone**, to hike long distances to their docks and boats because they have to park some distance away, if they can even find parking at all. This is a do-over!!
- 3) One dock modification every 5 years—What is the purpose of this? Dock associations should be able to request modifications as often as needed. Enough said.
- 4) One boat every 10 acres—Who thinks this stuff up?! We don't need a one-size-fits-all for a lake this size. There are areas of the lake that don't have much boat traffic at all, and others that do, so why not figure something out that's reasonable for the more densely populated areas. And don't make your revisions based on boat traffic density of the 3-4 holiday weekends per year. A lot of those boaters don't live here, so don't make all of us suffer for patterns of use that don't apply year-round.
- 5) Size of slips to be down-sized Some people have houseboats—are they going to fit in a 12 x 30 slip? Are you trying to use this new regulation to ban certain types of boats? If so, why not be upfront about it?
- 6) No Wake Buoys—A lot of us dock owners want to keep these. We see it as a good safety feature for families using their docks for swimming etc., and it helps limit wear and tear on our docks. If you're going to ban something, ban those 'Big Wake Boats' (or whatever they're called) that create bigger-than-normal waves that slosh against the shore line.
- 7) Can't store fishing equipment, tubes, chairs, etc. on docks or even in a dock box—Why??? So now we can't park near our docks, plus we have to haul everything, every time, who knows what distance?!

I could go on...I further object to your tightening the vegetation management, and the draconian penalties being proposed for breaking your onerous proposed new rules. Please remember that we are your fellow citizens interested in having a clean, beautiful lake just as you are, so make us your partners with <u>reasonable</u> regulations. Do not alienate and abuse us!

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

Hello:

We have closely followed the recent discussions, and proposals with regard to the updated Shoreline Management Plan.

As long term Kimbering City residents, we are driectly impacted by decisions made by, and for the Corps of Engineers with respect to access, and enjoyment of Table Rock Lake.

We were supporters of the changes made to Shoreline Management guidelines which went into effect in 2014, as they needed some updating at that time.

These new proposals, however, seem to be a significant over-reach, and will negatively impact our lakefront property values, along with access to the lake.

Changing the guidelines for Vegetation Control from the staus quo, to the much more restrictive proposals will make it eminently more difficult for people to access docks, and shoreline. Walking on the rocky shore is challenging enough when you have a clear view of the rocks, and obstacles, but becomes dangerous if hidden by overgrown plants and weeds.

More importantly, the over abundance of ticks and chiggers endemic to the area represents a major health risk to those unfortunate enough to be bitten when walking through unkept vegetation. Lime disease, and the discomfit associated with chigger bites would be a mojor impediment to lake access.

These factors are compounded when considering elderly, or seniors living on, or near the lake. It would be a bad sitution, componded by uneccessarily restrictive regulation.

Lkewise, the proposal to entirely eliminate no-wake buoys seems counter-productive when viewed from both a safety, and property (dock) protection stance. The no-wake buoys certainly don't entirely deter, or eliminate dangerous and irresponsible wakes on the part of uninformed, or irresponsible boaters. But do you honestly believe eliminating the buoys would make things better, or safer? We think not!

Also, and this is a big point, a regulation to eliminate the storage of fishing and boating gear on docks, or in dock lockers is beyond ludicrous! The enourmous draw of lake recreation involves fishing/boating/tubing/paddling/swimming with a float, and enjoying this resource whose construction was funded by taxpayer monies.

The economies of lake communities would suffer a major blow if these activities were "eliminated", or curtailed.

Also, the proposal to limit the number of folks using the lake at any one time simply boggles the mind! How would anyone hope to know some "magic number" which delineates between "just enough users", or "too many"?

If things are too congested in any one area, that will most likely take care of itself by boaters seeking solace in less crowded locations. It certainly does not rise to the level of beuraocratic micromanagement, which rarely works anyway.

This entire plan seems to be a solution in search of a problem! We suspect it was heavily influenced by input from commercial operators at the lake in an attempt to further protect their exclusive "franchise" over resources.

In short, please don't implement these new rules. They will not likely help the lake environment, but will defintiley hurt those who have protected, and enjoyed this aquatic jewel for many years.



My Name is Joe Garza and for 40 Years I have had a lake house on Rock Creek on Tablerock Lake. I have seen a lot of changes over these years. Rock Creek use to be full of trees which made it good for fishing, somewhere along the way the trees were cut down when the water was low or were knocked down by boats. When I first came to the lake there were 5 docks on Rock Creek, two were covered docks with 4 slips the other 3 were 2 slip open docks for a total of 14 docks. About 10 years ago Big M Marina put aSatellite dock in at the end of the road on Rock Creek. It must have 20 or 30 slips then another dock with 20 slips went in then another dock with 20 or more slips. The docks are not the problem, its the people, they never leave the creek and go out on the main lake which means we have sometimes 10 or more boats, wave runners, and wake boats, you name it, its out there. They all go round and round in an area probable no bigger than 40 acres. A few years ago they Life Flighted 2 people out who had ran into each other on wave runners.

We have people who have Big Wake Boats which make Big Wakes going back and forth in this small area. They have Big Radio Speakers on their boats turned up really loud and they never leave the area.

I own 2 slips on a 4 slip dock all up to code, I have repaired this dock almost yearly due to boats coming to close.

Another issue is the Big Power Boats with open Exhaust, they go round and round and never leave the area. I would like to see the Lake Patrol come up the Creek more often, it is beginning to look more like The Lake of The Ozarks. I would also like to see a Noise Ordinance go into effect and a no wake zone Starting at the Big M Satellite Dock. That would fix a lot of Problems. On the weekends the Shoreline water looks like Mud after the weekend when all the boats leave it is again Clear and Beautiful.

Objections to the Shoreline Management Plan Attachment to Master Plan Comment Form

Table Rock Lake Mission – among the five missions authorized for Table Rock Lake is "... recreational development...". I fail to see how these additional restrictions can be viewed as fulfilling that mission.

No Wake Buoys – the proposed ban on private No Wake markers is completely without merit. No wake markers serve several important functions, including providing a "safe zone" for persons swimming near docks. Furthermore, it provides notice to inexperienced boat operators (especially rental boat operators) to slow down near boat docks.

Requirement for Alternative Electric Power for Docks – the proposal to require alternative (presumably solar) power for docks should be abandoned. For the small amount of power used by most docks, the pay-back period for recovering the initial cost of installation is <u>never</u>. The Corp already requires electrical inspections as a condition of permit renewal. I believe a requirement for more frequent electrical inspections would be a better option rather than forcing all dock owners to spend significant sums of money installing solar power. In addition to the cost, the weight of solar panels added to the roof of existing docks will increase the likelihood of roof failures, especially in the event of a snow or ice storm. Finally, since the docks were not designed for battery storage, the location and weight of those batteries will also present problems.

Also related to the issue of docks is the proposed requirement that requests for modification would only be considered once during the 5-year permit period. A more common-sense approach would be to allow for one free request during a 5-year permit period and charge a user fee for review of additional requests.

On the issue of golf cart or turf tire vehicle usage, I do not believe the current rules need to be changed. The current policies provide adequate protection for Corp property without unnecessarily limiting access to boat docks.

Thank you for the opportunity to provide comment on the proposed plan. First let me state, I so appreciate the work of the Corp and dedicated staff on protecting the lake, shoreline and homes. I have never felt the need to comment on prior proposal as I believe you know what you are doing. I'm simply a homeowner and not a researcher or engineer.

With that being said, I oppose part of the plan that mandates the removal of No-Wake buoys for private docks by 2020. I believe it was about 10 years ago when my parents first received the permit to place a No-Wake Buoy by our dock. Prior to that, it quite frankly it wasn't safe to swim beyond the dock due to the fast-moving wave runners coming out of Big M and the onset of much faster and bigger boats coming to our end of the lake creating huge wakes and it being an ideal location for boats to swing in and turn around. It is also an ideal fishing location and while the fishermen only idle speed while they are fishing.... however, if the fish aren't biting, they are the first one to shove their boats into high gear regardless of the size of the boat to move onto the next location. Again, creating large wakes, and not always with the respect of the buoy and location.

The buoys mitigate the traffic and dangerous situations off our boat dock.

Because of the location of my parents' home, which we now own, it is an ideal location for boats to speed up, wave runners to play and fishermen to zoom in and out of the small inlet and big boat with BIG Wakes to bring skiers. We have maintained and replaced the buoy though the rise of the water and flooding, is critical for our safety and to keep our dock from succumbing to wave damage. The buoy provides confidence that boater respect...well for the most part.

I recommend that current Private No Wake Buoys be grandfatherd in to the plan or for the Corp to simply provide oversight if there is a problem. There is no justification in the plan to support the change of practice and policy. A sign on the boat dock as presented wouldn't be seen by boaters, skiers, wave runners or fisherman until they were upon the boat dock. Basically, what good is that going to do? I would further recommend if the problem is that that owners are not taking care of them, then more closely monitor them as you do everything else on the lake like the trees. I would even go so far as to propose a fine or removal after warning.... if they are not being care for by the owner.

Please reconsider your proposal on the Private No Wake Buoys. I actually think there are probably bigger fish to fry...so to speak in this proposal than the simple line about the removal of the buoys.

If you are leaning toward moving forward with keeping this provision, please contact me directly so that we can discuss next steps.

Again, thank you for allowing input. I wish I had the opportunity to be at one of the hearing because of distance and other commitments I cannot. It would be great if there was live streaming or the availability to do a meet me meeting through an app or other electronic connection.

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

I have owned a slip since 2014 on table rock in a 6 slip community dock. I look forward to retiring down at the lake within the next 10 years. When I read of the recent changes to the Shore line Management Plan, a few of the items in the plan I totally disagree with and I understand you want to hear our comments so here is what my comments/concerns are regarding these items:

- 1. Solar power by 2027. The impact of this would be big as many of the owners of these docks are retired and don't have the income that they once did to have to pay this money out to do this. The other thing is it is an ongoing expense as I understand the batteries would have to be replaced after so long. The Corps has "good" regulations as it pertains to having these docks inspected by a certified electrician every 5 years at permit time. I understand the concern regarding the safety of everyone with electricity and water, but make everyone convert to Solar is going to the extreme. There are others things that could be done that would be less expensive and would provide a measure of safety, example, change electrical inspection to every 3 years. I'm sure there are other things as well but solar is NOT the answer.
- 2. Removing No Wake Buoys by 2020. I don't understand this at ALL. This is a huge safety issue. We are located in little aunt's creek with a buoy and on Saturdays, it is crazy with the wake board boats and cruisers. Not all boaters adhere to the buoys that are in place so if we remove them they will be much closer to the docks creating a very UNSAFE area for kids to be swimming, kayaking, paddle boarding, etc. And the condition of the docks all over the lake will go down due to the increase in wake in close proximity to the dock.
- 3. Cedar trees can be removed up to 3". If I read this part correctly, this was a change from 2" to 3" for those who have a shoreline permit. I feel that should be increase to at least 5" as cedar trees are very plentiful and it would not hurt to remove some of the bigger ones as well.





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Addendum: Comments on the 2014 Master Plan

We offer the following for your consideration:

Re-educate the COE on the local community. Most are here because we want to be. We want to enjoy it. We will defend it against environmental mistreatment and other abuses. We don't believe that the Lake is any more "ours" than anyone that has the same love for it. Some of us have invested everything we have to be here.

Adopt and enforce boating safety standards: Every boater that wants to use TRL must pass a test that includes what the little red and green lights mean, no-wake requirements, liability for financial loss or injury caused by your boat's wake, etc. (Then we can get rid of the no-wake bouy's as proposed in the SMP.)

Adopt and enforce electrical safety standards: The Table Rock COE requires only 1990 / 1993 NEC compliance. There have been 8 revisions since then including 2017 in which Article 555 now (again) includes community and private docks.

Quit trying to defend "cedar" trees. There should be a bounty on them not protection. They are technically, if not statutorily, invasive. The University of Missouri documents that they take resources from other trees and <u>reduce</u> habitat and should be mowed down. This issue is very harmful to the COE credibility.

Allow thoughtful management of trees and vegetation. If there is a landowner that adjoins the Corp property that wishes to thin trees or replace them with another indigenous specie, let them work with an approved arborist and present a plan. The COE wouldn't even need to visit – just work from photos and drawings. Note: Some of the nicest looking places along the Lake are where the adjoining property has a mow-to-the-water permit. Some of the seediest / disconcerting looking areas are those where the trees and vegetation have grown to obscure the view.

Stop micro-designing docks and local community access. If it is not the objective to impose difficult and costly regulations on slip owners so as to drive them away, there are a number of requirements that don't seem to add value to SMP but do require a lot of valuable COE to manage / enforce.

Slip / dock dimensions: The overall requirements for spacing, extension across the cove, etc, address safety and navigation issues. The width of the dock, number of slips, etc, don't add anything but work to oversee and enforce.

Dock Storage: You described an example of a dock owner added living quarters. I would address this directly rather than falling back to a 1939 (?) regulation that allows only the oar. Most docks are difficult to get to. Having to take fishing gear or boating toys back and forth each time would be more difficult. Unless that is the objective?

Dock Revisions limited to 5 year minimum: This is to limit COE workload or slip / dock ownership? If, for example, one slip owner wanted to try alternative energy. Then, if the association allowed it and the COE approved it, no one else could implement it for 5 years?

No Wake Buoys: As I understand your concern, there are a number of buoys that were placed in the water and either are not looked after properly or have been abandoned. This would seem to be an easy fix if that is really the issue. Require registration of the buoys and anchoring with a system that will keep them in place at the normal range of lake level. Once the TRL Boating Safety license has been in place several years and boaters demonstrate proficiency at recognizing the safe distance to keep from docks, swimming areas, and other boats, the buoys can be phased out.

Alternative Energy: I'm not sure that this isn't a red-herring. I don't even agree that "new" docks should be required to use alternative energy as the application is still developing. But requiring a change-out of all electrical service in the next 10 years would be quite costly and without offsetting benefit.

Shoreline Access: A small dock has a, say, 35' x 35' footprint. Most bigger than 2-slip can be 65' wide x the number of slips. A small opening through the Corp ground, say 20' in width, that runs from the dock's walkway to access areas is neither a distraction from the natural beauty or a claim of ownership. The Corp needs to grant reasonable access without burdening restrictions. If the dock owners wish to improve the access for safety reasons, this should be encouraged rather than blocked.

Miscellaneous: A number of requirements with unclear purpose permeate this SMP proposal as well as previous Plans. The SMP is a target-rich opportunity to reduce bureaucracy as is our President's mandate and the voter's desire.

Thank you for your respectful discussion Wednesday evening, August 1", at Reeds Spring HS as well as your invitation to contact you directly through email. Hopefully with this dialog, we can provide feedback and comments more useful to the process.

We've given quite a bit of time to try to understand the COE's mandate and perspectives on the SMP. You may recall that you joined a conversation that included several neighbors with homes "on" Table Rock and Jacqueline Bouchard.

While you suggested that with better understanding and dialog we could improve the design and operation of SMP, prior to you joining Jacqueline made it known that the COE is "coming from the complete 180 degree perspective [than ours]". In her understanding, the answer to all questions, input, suggestions, and challenges is "the Lake is 'our' [COE's | Lake, 'you' [community] only have privileges that we grant and, as such, we do not have to defend our decisions or consider your view".

It was also an extension of a conversation that one of our neighbors had with Jacqueline in Shell knob the night before. I do not know anyone that is not aware of the right of public access to Corp property. I don't doubt that there may be instances of locals involved in something illicit (e.g. methilab) that may have chased away a "threat" as there are roads that the Sheriffs Department have advised emergency response personnel fire, ambulance) not to enter without UEO accompanient.

As to the "park in your stip" litmus test, I would think most people would react the same as if "someone from New York", set up house in the back or their pickup while parked at the Old Mill Campground. While it is true that they are there only by permit and it is on public property, the truck itself wouldn't customarily be considered a public use apportunity.

Ms Bouchard advised as at the mosting that assuing a slip didn't mean that the owner could have access in it. "Even the ADA doesn't require access in every circumstance" she said. I believe, though, that the COE should not have any objection if an owner that is capable of getting in or out of a host wanted to pay for his her own safe access.

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





The COE has not explained that I can find why it wants to remove shore power from the docks and clearly have not seriously considered the high cost to dock owners to remove it and replace with the "alternative" power that you will allow. Nor have the COE considered how limited those options are to provide reliable electrical power for typical dock needs. Any system dependent on batteries is a finite system and current state of the art dock solar systems are only designed/recommended for brief intermittent power usage. It would provide only a finite amount of power versus the unlimited power availability of the present system. That finite amount of power is determined by the size of the system and various weather and other effects that impact solar panel power production. In addition it is the most electrically complex and as such the least robust against external electrical surge damage, the least robust against environmental component damage, the most expensive option to implement and expensive to maintain and repair. Battery chargers, associated with any engine powered watercraft, are considered a continuous power usage item by dock solar power system providers and are typically not designed to support because of the exponential increase in the cost and size of the solar power system that would be required is prohibitive in most real would situations. Recharging large capacity deep cycle trolling motor batteries in bass boats, usually two per boat, would easily drain the solar power storage batteries of a typical system. There are numerous other shortcomings with solar systems as well. On dock wind power suggestion is inappropriate for this lake location. If the reason to remove shore power service is reducing the carbon foot print where is that requirement in the authorizing legislation? If it is restoring the natural look of the shoreline how is that possible when electric lines are buried? If it is safety there are better solutions such as 1.] Class A (5ma) GFIC Ground Fault Interruption Circuit breaker protection on docks and 30 ma GFIC protection for service lines.. Isolation transformer(s) could be installed on the dock with GFIC protection added to the shore power line to the dock or Isolation transformer(s) could be installed at the shore power pole that supplies the dock. Provid+es an ever present in your face reminder/red flag of no wake beyond this point. Boats used on lake keep getting bigger and bigger so wakes are bigger and boats now often are designed deliberately to make bigger and bigger waves for wake boarding and surfing. Boat operators generally seek out quieter coves for their tubing and water sport activities which is where most docks are located. Whatever the COE has against no wake buoys there must be a better way to deal with it.

I have several comments for your consideration:

Dock Modification Approvals: please consider additional revisions for modifications due to storm damage or other similar matters beyond the once/five year proposal

No Wake Buoys: I have boated in a number of different locations around the country, both rivers and lakes. The physical presence of a visible float in the water is far more recognizable and apt to be responded to than a sign on the side of a dock that will only be seen if the boater looks to the side of his direction of travel. Our dock is on the inside of a 180 degree turn on the Kings River and I continually witness boats on full plane running 50' from the edge of our dock with no idea or concern for their wake. Once the buoy went out after this summer's flooding, no boats violated the 100' space created by the buoy. There was no stated reason for this recommendation and I wish you would consider placement of buoys to be a strong protector of the safety of swimmers and prevention of damage to boats in slips. Alternatively, make every dock put it's permit number on a buoy if the concern is that they float away and provide a graduated fine for them not being anchored properly if that is your concern. Again, I feel very strongly that there is far more downside than upside to this proposed provision.

Golf Carts on Corps property: Perhaps this is something that needs to be clarified, but as I read the proposal, no golf cart can be on Corps property unless it has a "handicap sticker". I get that this makes sense for vegetated areas, but I saw nothing addressing use of golf carts on grandfathered paved areas. There is a paved loop which accesses at least four community docks where I live. Please consider a clarification/provision for use of golf carts on the many hard surface areas providing access to community docks.

Thank you for giving extended time to make comments. I just learned of this through Park Ranger Malcolm Fortson with USACE. I trust my comments will be helpful as you finalize your plans.

I have two comments on the Proposed Table Rock Shoreline Management Plan.

COMMENT #1

I am a landowner at Latitude (LAT) 36.687491 Longitude (LONG) -93.483397, just 285' due east of the USACE property line.

There is an extreme lack of Red Line Dock Zoning around here. There is virtually no Red Line Dock Zoning in our cove. We need more Red Line Dock Zoning at approximately 760 feet south/southwest of LDA 163, from LAT 36.687542 LONG -93.484985 to LAT 36.687022 LONG -93.484733. Lake Channel width at the narrowest point is approximately 260' and increases from there. With proper Red Line Dock Zoning, we could build a much-needed community dock there. I would be willing to provide a permanent parking easement on my property, and slip owners could have access via the permanent public fire road that is due west of my property that runs all the way to the USACE property.

COMMENT #2

I believe that the proposal to RETROFIT EXISTING docks with SOLAR is very expensive, and unnecessary.

- a) Safety is not an issue as USACE already has excellent safeguards in place.
- b) SOLAR RETROFITTING would create MORE safety hazards because people will try to bypass solar retrofits and will resort to using unsafe temporary means to get power to docks to utilize their existing lighting, existing air pumps for lifts, etc.
- c) Cumulative costs would be in the many millions of dollars for all dock and dock slip owners to retrofit.
- d) NEW docks would benefit by being all solar and being environmentally friendly.

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Before imposing 2027 requirements for all docks to be powered by alternate power source you could include with your new SMP what exactly will be approved as the power is inverted back to 120 volts which requires significant battery size and large inverters to power existing boat lifts. How these batteries and inverters are stored and protected will be important or are you even going to allow inverters. It is a known fact inverters and batteries can get extremely hot when over run or used. You need to set some guidelines as to what will be acceptable and allowed on each slip or does the entire dock have to run on one solar power source. This information would be nice to have prior to pricing for solar equipment.

No Wake Buoys 2020. These buoys are the only defense we have against unruly & drunken boat drivers trying to see how close they can drive past the buoy. Take them away and these same jerks will see how close they can drive fast past the front of the dock where our swim platform/deck is and our slip owner's children and grandchildren are swimming. "If you cannot see the danger in this" please take another approach to getting control of your NoWakeBuoys. I have sent this to the Missouri State Highway Water Patrol since I was told at the USACE Workshop in Shell Knob that NoWakeBuoys section of the SMP was their jurisdiction.

You could make it a little easier to get a LOP permit for golf cart use to get elderly people down & back to & from their dock. Maybe an age requirement of over 70. I have four people who use a golf cart now and are not capable of walking up hill from the dock to their homes but are not incapacitated enough to meet a medical permanent disability criteria nor would they want to be classified as permanently disabled.

Two Concerns:

The first is the **No-Wake buoys** for private docks. You state in the plan objectives "promoting safe use of the lake and shoreline". Removing the buoys would be the most disastrous change you could make for safety of swimmers, canoes, kayaks and property, especially in lake coves & end of creek arms. I can tell you from over 20 years of experience of being a property & private dock owner the boaters either don't know the rules or don't abide by them, especially without some type of physical warning, like a buoy, not a sign. (tried that) A 18" X 24" sign will not be affective as a means to keep boaters 100 feet from docks. A neighbor tried a 4' X 8' sheet of plywood sign, to no affect.

I will speak to one specific area, Aunts Creek, however I'm sure this applies to many other areas. Your 2010 "Recreational Boating Use Study for Table Rock Lake", which was done before wake board boats became so prevalent on the lake, listed Aunts Creek area in the highest category of 20 - 46 "Accident/Incident Locations on Table Rock Lake". It was also the 3rd highest of 8 regions in boat count. It was rated UNSAFE by Marina, slip, and land owners, and ramp users on Table Rock lake. It was also rated 5th among areas boaters avoided. The two main reasons given were, (1) "Crowding: too many boats, people, or traffic" (2) "Rough water, too many wakes. It was stated in the study "Many visitors desired restrictions on personal watercrafts and rule enforcement.

From the section **4.2 KEY FINDINGS FOR MANAGEMENT**, "To mitigate the negative attributes cited by boaters for why they avoid these locations (Aunts Creek), management will need to consider increasing law enforcement strategies to curb unsafe boating behavior, illegal behaviors associated with alcohol consumption, enforce <u>or post speed limits</u>, and remove debris hazards from the water." "To manage for these qualities, it appears that these favorite locations should contain low speed or no wake zones to allow for calmer water, better fishing, and quieter solitude for relaxing. AND YOU WANT TO DO AWAY WITH NO WAKE BUOYS? Makes no common safety sense. Again, to restate this Study was done before the high volume of wake board boats!

At the public workshop I was told by a Corps person that one reason for the decision on the buoys was because of the poor maintenance of buoys by permittee, damaged and keeping the correct 100 feet distance from dock, almost all more than 100 feet from dock. Instead of arbitrarily pulling buoys; ask why so many not complying? Solve that and solve the maintenance problem and keep everyone safer. ANSWER: Safety concerns for swimmers and private docks are getting beat to death by wake board boats. (True story, my float was knocked completely off my walkway, and laying on shore this past 4th of July weekend) The wake board boats are putting out waves the size of 35' cruisers and go into backs of creeks & coves where cruisers can't.

I know you can't ban these boats, however you sure can control their wakes by speed limits, no wake coves, no skiing areas or coves, and no wake buoys. This is a problem that absolutely needs to be addressed Now!!! We all have a right to naturally calm water for swimming & fishing without being ruined by wake board boats. If you are on the main lake, or beginning of large creeks, you should expect rougher water when fishing or swimming, but not in every naturally calm area of the lake.

One last thing mention by the Corps person was not moving buoys in & out as lake level fluctuates. This can't be a big problem if buoys are set correctly at 100 feet at the 915 lake level. Under normal circumstances small changes in lake levels either way doesn't affect distance that much. When there are big changes up there aren't a lot of boats on the water because of debris and down there are too many obstacle's like trees showing in water that keep boating down.

Please consider these factors when evaluating the no wake buoy change!

Second concern is alternative power source. What will be the cost to covert all docks on Table Rock lake to solar? 10 million plus. Why not commercial docks? A shore line without power lines sounds good, but is it really practical for "all" existing docks by one date. What companies are approved to do this & to what specs, will specs change later? Much more info needed from you rather just date to really evaluate change.

Dear Sir or Madam;

My comments are set forth below.

Golf Carts. The proposal for Letters of Permission (LOP) and a doctor's report or other documentation of physical impairment to operate a golf cart is discriminatory and will not solve what is only a perceived issue. Be prepared for thousands of medical reports from individuals. This requirement will limit elderly guests, pregnant mothers, children, parents with babies and countless others access to the lake that cannot obtain such LOP. Limiting this type of access will result in countless injuries, heart attacks, falls, etc. caused by carrying coolers and other items to the docks. Golf carts only affect a minuscule fraction of the shoreline area. Please leave this alone. Why deny or limit access to land that has been here for 4.5 billion years? I do not think that a few people driving on it will hurt this land. The Corps inability to control flooding has done more damage to the shoreline, especially in the last 7 years, than what thousands of dock owners could do.

Alternative Power on the docks. This is an ill-advised solution searching for a problem. Solar conversion will be an extreme cost to thousands. One dock owner paid over \$4,000 to convert to solar power. Millions of dollars will have to be spent for no good reason. This discriminates against the poor and elderly. The replacement of back up batteries every 4-5 years will be a continuous financial burden on property owners. Thousands of old batteries will absolutely be thrown into the lake every year, causing pollution and substantial harm to the eco system. It will be very difficult for the elderly to replace batteries. Electricity is clean and safe. In the alternative, the Corps could require annual or frequent inspections by reputable vendors approved by the Corps. Table Rock does not have the issues as does Lake of the Ozarks in which every death I researched was caused by egregious electrical code violations that do not exist at TR, and would not with inspections. Solar energy is neither constant nor reliable. Safety lights at the end of docks would go out resulting in dangerous conditions for boaters. The Corps will be sued when these foreseeable accidents occur. We will not have the availability of reliable,

dependable electricity. Will we have safety lights for dock use at night? Will the lifts work reliably at night? Will we have power to operate medical devices and emergency equipment? Many dock or boat repairs by vendors will require them to bring a generator, resulting in more danger and pollution.

Buoys. This is inexplicable. I thought these protect the shoreline and private property. Buoy use is not excessive.


Controlling vegetation. Again this is a solution looking for a problem. This lake has a terrible snake problem.

Limiting lake use. Also this is not an issue, but if it ever does become one it will solve itself. People will move. Maybe it's time to build another lake.

Modifications. The 5 year restriction for modifications of docks is arbitrary and unreasonable and only limits the Corps work. These docks are so overly regulated that there should not be this type of restriction. This is most likely a moot issue as many will not be able to afford modifications if solar power is required.



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

Points to consider before migrating from GRID provided electricity to SOLAR:

Grid Electricity is simple, reliable, and almost maintenance free. Utility companies provide and maintain the infrastructure to deliver the electricity to the end-user. The end-user panels, fuses, wiring and GFI protected outlets are easy to install and maintain by licensed electricians. These items contain no hazardous materials! Replacement components of the end-user infrastructure are easy to obtain and at low-cost. Grounding is easily solved. The applicable National Electric Codes (NEC) are established and easy to implement by electricians.

SOLAR Generated Electricity is "GREEN ENERGY", but not simple or maintenance free. The components include panels, batteries, racks, charging controllers, fuse boxes, shut-offs, inverters, wiring, and monitoring systems. Some components contain hazardous materials that could end up in the lake or for sure in landfills. The components must be protected from the elements of nature. Special enclosures that limit dust, dirt, and moisture are a must. Grounding and Ground Fault Detection issues are paramount and must be properly addressed. Fans are needed to allow for air flow and ventilation within the enclosures to help with cooling, humidity and removal of noxious gases. Offsite monitoring provides assurance that all systems are operating correctly for remote SOLAR locations. Maintenance agreements can include a preventive maintenance routine. The complex system requires record keeping and documentation that must be kept up to date. Hostile environments add issues for installation, maintenance, and can cause premature component failures. Replacement components can become an issue with respect to availability. Spare parts on-site are recommended, in some cases. The components will require increases to insurance coverage. Warranty coverage for failed components can become challenging. The National Renewable Energy Laboratory (NREL) document, "Best Practices in Photovoltaic System Operation and Maintenance, 2nd Edition, dated December 2016 - (NREL/TP-7A40-67553)", provides a comprehensive review of operation and maintenance issues for SOLAR Systems. NREL is a national laboratory of the United States Department of Energy. Following the best practices will allow for a safe and reliable SOLAR System. If the best practices are not followed, then performance and safety issues could result.

The Windy Bluff Boat Dock (20 slips) obtains electric power from the Ozark Electric Cooperative mainly for the operation of lights (CFL and LED) and boat lifts. This co-op and many others obtain electric power from a number of sources, which include solar, wind and hydro. The Dam at Table Rock Lake is one of these sources, and it generates 640,000 MWh/year of GREEN ENERGY. Thus, one could say GREEN ENERGY is now being used.

The mentioned Boat Dock is located in an area that is not closely supervised on a day to day basis. Thus, a SOLAR System could be vandalized or components stolen. If this happens, then unprotected live wires could result in safety issues for those on the dock or near it in the water!

It is the consensus of the Windy Bluff Boat Dock Officers', that a SOLAR/WIND mandate for private docks on Table Rock Lake is unreasonable.



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- 1. "No Wake" Buoys- Feel that if they were removed it would result in excessive damage to docks and boats. With the Buoys, the boats slow down when they come to them. If they were not there most would not slow down until they get to the dock and by then it is too late.
- 2. Requirement to convert to Solar poor- Dock owners should not be forced to incur the expense of converting to Solar. If it was beneficial economically they would be wanting to do it voluntarily.
- 3. Walk ways and lockers- plan says that lockers are permissible on the docks but also say that there has to be 30" of walkway clearance. Most docks have 48 in. wide stringers and most lockers are 18" to 21" in depth with many being at the 21" depth. Most of the lockers are at the end of the fingers and the fingers are closed at the end so having something less than the 30" is not a problem anyways. Having at 30" clearance will mean having to move or change out many of the lockers.

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

- 2. While going solar for power at the docks is, in concept, a great idea, the proposed time frame is not practical and the costs involved would be excessive. A better goal would be to have all new docks and replacement docks be required to be solar. Existing docks that are not being replaced should be grandfathered in and required to change upon replacement.
- 3. The proposed requirement to allow only one request for dock maintenance/repairs/upgrades once every 5 years is ridiculous. Implementing this change of only one request every 5 years would result in a significant increase in the number of unsafe docks across the lake since the owners would be unable keep maintenance and upgrades current. If the Corps' feels there must be some type of restriction then it should be something on the order of one every 6 months at the very maximum. There should also be a SIMPLE process to address emergency repairs outside of any time frame restriction.

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

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



This letter is in response to the proposed changes to Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan. So far everyone I know connected to Table Rock believes these changes are NOT good for our lake. The matter of dock permits the current rules should be kept in place. By issuing dock permits for more private docks and for small community docks will turn Table Rock Lake into another Lake Of The Ozarks! Every single spot zoned for docks will fill up with tiny docks and ruin the shoreline. The main goal should be to try to keep Table Rock Lake as beautiful as it is and to keep it a FAMILY SAFE Lake. The people who have bought or built homes here came here because they did NOT want to be on a nightmare lake such as Lake Of The Ozarks! WE DO NOT WANT THIS LAKE CLUTTERED WITH SMALL DOCKS POKED IN EVERY SPOT POSSIBLE. Also by issuing small dock permits it will limit the number of slips available for future growth. I am not sure what the limit is now but a dock with 10 or 12 slips seems to be the perfect size. PLEASE DO NOT ISSUE ANY MORE PRIVATE DOCK PERMITS!

Also small or private boat docks will probably create a nightmare with parking, launching and other problems.

The issue of no wake buoys brings many questions to my mind. I wish you would have explained the reasons the Corps thinks these changes will be of benefit to the people connected to the lake or for the good of the lake.

No wake signs on the docks is a ridiculous idea. By the time the sign can be read it will be too late. NO one is going to be looking for signs and therefore will NOT see the signs. The goal should be to keep wakes away from docks and small coves where families are anchored while floating and otherwise enjoying the water. Now that paddle boards, kayaks, canoes and other floating devices have become so popular their safety needs to be addressed. The small cove we live on has been protected from MOST of the dangers of jet skis and boats running over children, paddle boards etc. with the help of NO WAKE BUOYS! IF you restrict the no wake buoys you will be making a more dangerous situation for the people on the lake but not in a boat. REMEMBER BOATS DO NOT HAVE BRAKES! AND NOT ALL PEOPLE HAVE GOOD SENSE!! The biggest problem with safety boils down to jet skis and wake boats. Jet skis ripping around each other racing and spinning NOT paying attention to other people on the lake. The same thing is true of the big wake boats. Half of the time the driver is too busy watching behind the boat rather than paying attention to the dangers in front or to the side of themselves.

Large wakes cause children floating by the dock to be slammed into the side of them thus making the children afraid to get in the water. Also large wakes cause docks and the people sitting on them or the boats in the slips to be rocked and rolled around to the point of making it miserable to be on the dock and even making some people sea sick.

There is more than enough water surface area for water craft to go as fast as they like out in the open while restricting the speed in coves and around docks. That is the way it should be. SAFE AND STILL FUN! I do agree with the solar energy. It is too rocky and very expensive to go underground and electricity and water do not mix well. Overhead wires are not attractive.

The next question I have is why can a dock owner only make changes 1 time in 5 years? If it is too expensive to do all of the improvements at one time then why can't improvements be made as owners can afford? In a community dock not everyone has the money at the same time to make improvements.

6. Against not allowing private entities to cut dead wood on corps property.

7. Against the prohibition of parking golf

carts or ATV's on corps property.

Dear Sirs, I am writing this letter to express my comments to you regarding the proposals you are considering for Table Rock Lake. I reside in Stone County and own a boat slip on a Community Dock on Little Aunts Creek.

After having read your proposals, I am deeply disturbed about your plan on the following issues:

- 1. It is my understanding that you propose to increase access on Table Rock Lake from approximately 19,000 to 31,000 sites. This is a 60% increase. If **you** were a resident and had access to the lake, would **you** be in favor of turning Table Rock into something resembling Lake of the Ozarks? People there have difficulty even getting on the water at times because of the boat traffic. I, as well as my friends and neighbors do not want to see Table Rock go in that direction.
- 2. It is my understanding that you want to remove all the NO WAKE buoys from the lake and replace them with NO WAKE signs on the docks. One of your rangers expressed concerns about the distance between the buoys and the docks. Apparently he had no idea that the docks are moved in and out with changes in lake levels while the position of the buoys remains fixed. That would mean at times the buoys might be closer or farther from the ends of the docks. That shouldn't be an issue.

The issues that we have are because of the large boats and wake boats traveling up and down in the smaller creeks and coves and creating massive wakes that put severe strain on the dock cables and eventually cause damage to the docks.

If you think that boaters traveling at high speeds are going to see and even read a NO WAKE sign on a boat dock, believe me, that is NOT going to happen.

If the buoys are removed then boaters can come very close to the docks, which will endanger lives and property.

On July 30, 2017 I was supervising my two grandchildren while they were swimming off the end of our dock. A Bass boat, towing a water skier came roaring up the creek and passed between the NO WAKE buoy and the dock, endangering my grandchildren.

The boat went on down past the three NO SKIING BEYOND THIS POINT buoys in Little Aunts Creek.

I called Water Patrol and they were on the scene within 15 minutes but the offenders were nowhere to be found.

Before you tell me this is proof that the buoys do not work, ask yourself, how many other boats would do the same IF the NO WAKE BUOYS were removed?

I believe this incident was not the norm and that most boaters and skiers do indeed pay attention to the buoys, but again, they would not see or could not see a NO WAKE sign on a boat dock.

PLEASE PLEASE re-consider this proposal for the lives and safety of all concerned.

3. It is my understanding is that you are proposing eliminating the use of electricity on the docks via shore cables either overhead or underwater. You are proposing the use of solar panels to produce the electricity needed on the docks.

I must ask if you have really thought this through.

How many solar panels would be needed for a 20 slip dock and how much weight would solar panels exert on the roofs of the docks?

What would the cost be to a Community Dock to purchase the panels and to have them installed?

What will happen to the solar panels if we have a severe hailstorm? (and we DO get them here in Stone County)

How much will our dock insurance increase to cover these solar panels?

What method would be used to 'store' the electricity generated from the solar panels until needed?

How much electricity can be generated by solar panels?

Is it enough to charge boat batteries, run boat lifts and provide lighting on the docks? One of the older docks nearby has a solar panel which only runs the dock lighting for a few slips. It requires NINE 8-volt batteries for *just the lighting*.

So if a bank of batteries is used to store the electricity until needed, how many batteries are we talking about?

Where will these batteries be placed on the docks? They cannot be placed on the walkways or on a swim deck because that would endanger the people walking on the dock.

How much weight will the batteries have? Will the excess weight have and adverse effects on the dock and its structure?

Why a undermine one of the very purposes of Table Rock Dam? Wasn't it built to generate electricity? We are consumers of electricity via White River Electric.

As I understand it, every dock permit renewal requires a complete inspection by a licensed electrician before the permit can be renewed.

We have fully operational GFCI's on every slip on our dock.

Please consider these facts before you make every dock on the Lake go 'solar'.

I am sure you have had many comments by the residents around Table Rock Lake regarding your Shoreline Improvement Plan.

It is my hope that you will go back to the table and re-evaluate these issues.



At the VERY LEAST NO MORE RENTAL BOATS Amount) should be allowed-Please.



Dear Congressman Long:

I am a dock owner on Table Rock Lake and have concerns about several items in the proposed Corps of Engineer's Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan to the point that I think it is a good example of government over reach.

The first item is to remove No Wake buoys by December 31, 2020. We have had problems with wake damaging docks on the lake. In fact, I have had to have repairs made to our dock this last month due to damage caused by wake. They say we can post No Wake signs on our dock. The problem is, by the time a person gets close enough to read the sign he has created a wake. We do not need boats coming closer to our docks and swim platforms. This is a bad idea.

The second item is to remove all shoreline power lines to the docks by December 31, 2027 and replace power with solar power. It sounds to me like a solar power lobbyist got to someone in the Corps. Table Rock Lake has over fifteen hundred docks and some are not designed to support solar panel loads. The Corps is concerned about how the shoreline looks. Can you imagine what the shoreline will look like with huge mirrors on every dock? I cannot imagine what the marinas and resorts will look like with their multiple docks many of them containing large house boats. Our annual power cost is approximately \$300 a year. To install solar power would cost approximately ten to twenty thousand dollars, and with annual maintenance costs added we will not be able to recoup costs and paying more for our electrical costs. The Corps maintains that this will stop deaths from shocks in the water. This it will do, but how many such deaths have we had on Table Rock Lake? There is circuit breaker equipment available to prevent this.

I appreciate you looking into this matter.
