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14 big waves -- if people are rushing by there, it damages
15 the docks, it damages boats. If anybody is out there
16 swimming or an old person is on the dock and it rocks it
17 around, it can throw them off in the water. The buoys
18 for safety need to stay.

19 You know, if they're worried about them not being
20 taken care of, just reissue the regulations and tell
21 people to keep them up. Because, like me, I only knew
22 less than half of what the regulations were. I thought
23 they were state maintained. I did not know they were
24 private. I did not know they had a permit. But I knew
25 that to get a buoy you had to go to the state and get

1 one, but I didn't know you had to maintain it. So, you
2 know, some education would be better than outlawing
3 them.

4 And the other thing, the changing all this to solar
5 power is the stupidest idea ever. You can't run a boat
6 lift on solar power. You can't maintain safety and
7 security lights on the dock with solar power all night
8 long, so you run the danger if the dock is dark of
9 somebody ramming into it and killing them self. And you
10 can't run a boat charger, you know, charge the battery
11 on your boat, none of that.

12 And the whole thing with safety is it's required
13 now that they just have a ground fault circuit breaker,
14 which they're mostly in the panels on the dock, not on
15 the pole. If they want to make it a little safer,
16 require them to have a ground fault breaker on the pole
17 and that's it. But if you look at Table Rock Lake, a
18 lot of the poles were underwater this spring. Ours was
19 underwater. Nobody got electrocuted. Nobody got hurt.
20 We had guys moving the dock, taking it in, everything
21 like that. Nobody got hurt.

22 Now, Osage Beach is a little bit different group of
23 people. I know -- the only people I can remember that
24 got electrocuted around a lake in the last few years is
25 over at Osage Beach, but not here. I can't remember in

1 the last 10 or 15 years at all anybody being
2 electrocuted around here. There's just no safety issue.

3 Even worse safety issue if they take the electric
4 out because you can't maintain power, lights and so
5 forth on there. And with all people -- you know, all
6 the high speed running around on the lake, you need to
7 be able to lift your boat out of the water to protect
8 it. Them things bouncing around in there just tears it
9 to pieces.

10 There shouldn't be a difference between the
11 commercial places, commercial docks and marinas, and the
12 individuals. They're putting all the burden of this on
13 private individuals and not changing the rules for the
14 commercial places. They still get to keep power, and
15 they're making all the individuals bear the cost. It
16 would be a huge cost to change to solar, and then you
17 still don't have enough power to do anything, but
18 they're going to leave all the commercial places still
19 having electric. That's a horrendous, you know,
20 prejudicial problem there. We're the least equipped to
21 afford all that compared to a commercial place.

22 MS. MARION WILSON: I guess I'm just -- I'm a
23 permittee on this Basin Hollow Boat Dock. I'm concerned
24 about the alternative electric power that they're asking
25 us to put in in 10 years or whatever it is. I'm just

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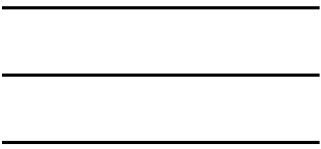

Our dock has complied with every regulation including encapsulated foam, no ice machine, and no party lights. The foam cost our dock about \$40,000, which we had to take a loan out for and have finally paid it off. We have been good stewards of the lake including picking up trash along the shore.

Your regulation to replace electricity with alternative energy will put a terrible hardship on us and every other dock to the point that we may cease to be. The cost for installing solar power will be prohibitive, to say nothing of its restrictions. One boatlift in operation at a time and no air-conditioners on the boats are ludicrous. The solar panels with batteries would probably sink our dock. So what is left? A windmill that birds, ducks and geese can fly through and be decapitated?

Table Rock Lake is a power lake, but it is also a recreation lake whether the Corps likes it or not. The economic impact of this requirement will be DEVASTATING to southwest Missouri.

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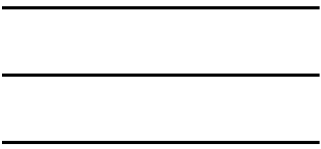

To Whom It May Concern:

I currently own the property across from Pizza Hut in Shell Knob. The property has approximately 900ft of lakefront access along the cove (Map 13 of 63, Plate 11, Sec. 15, approx. lat/lon of property is N 36.37.5, W 95.77.1). According to old plats, the property is zoned for "no docks" and is currently under a "vegetative permit" (#2926 Vegetative Permit) restriction.

Myself, visitors, and many others in the community, don't understand why a commercial property, in the recreational lake town of Shell Knob, located on a major highway, with over 900ft of lakefront, is restricted by a "no dock" and "vegetative permit" only limit. Meanwhile, the properties across the cove, with no business, and without highway or commercial access are Limited Development Areas (LDAs) with dock permits.

Not only this, but the Vegetative Permit at this location should be considered a safety concern. Myself and others have spotted several poisonous Water Moccasin (Cotton Mouth) snakes down around the water's edge along with other breeds in the woods. The snakes are living and breeding in the old logs and debris that has washed up on my "Vegetative Permit" only property. There are some safety concerns with the owners of the businesses, properties, docks and swim areas surrounding my property and across the cove. If my property were redesignated a Limited Development Area, I could limit my area bordering the lake of the safety concerns and still keep the area secure for other wildlife.


My property is located in a prime location for a commercial business with access to the lake, businesses, and transportation. The old owners of the property were planning on starting a business with access to the lake but were unable due to restrictions on the commercially located property. Updating the Corps of Engineer's Table Rock Lake master plan to redesignate my property a Limited Development Area (LDA) with the ability to obtain a dock permit would support the community to continue to grow and be a beneficial factor to the Table Rock Lake Master Plan, and the economic development of Shell Knob, and the surrounding communities. The Master Plan needs to be revised to include the progress of the 21st century.

For the betterment of the Shell Knob community and with the current projection of visitors to be 40 to 50 million annually for recreational activities, expansion for economic development in this area would be highly beneficial.

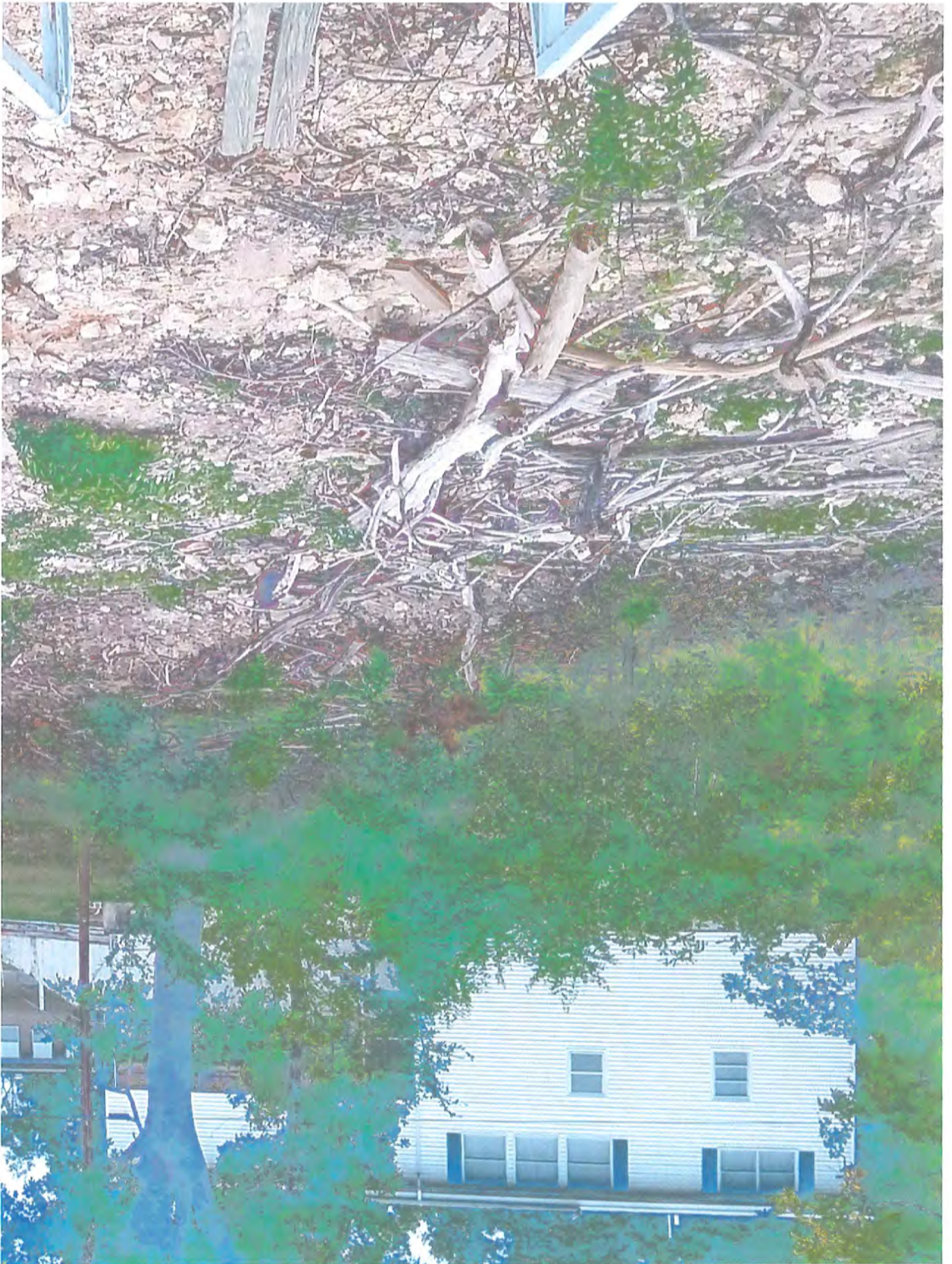

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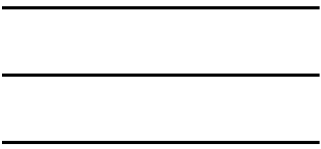

2 I just -- you're the first one I ran into. By the
3 time I walk around, I might come up with something else.

5 MS. SHEILA HASSELBRING: I have a vegetative
6 permit and I live in a buffer association. My husband
7 died and my permit expired and now they won't let me
8 renew it. So my question is why? Because my neighbor
9 got hers renewed. Of course it's -- it's past the time.
10 You know, since my husband died, I didn't realize it
11 died (sic). So it's been like a year or so, but I

13 they going to allow me to renew that since I live in a
14 buffer zone? I live out by Campbell's Point. That's my
15 main question.

16 MR. JIM STOKES: The proposal for the solar --
17 requiring people to have solar over electricity. My
18 feeling is it's rather expensive. And I have no problem
19 with new docks being required to do that because they
20 know that going in, but existing docks that's stayed up
21 to par and met all the requirements, I would like to see
22 those grandfathered under that clause.

23 MR. LARRY MANKINS: I'm very concerned about
24 the dock power clause in the Option Alternative 4.
25 I find -- and I've read through the documentation.

1 MR. MICKEY WILSON: The concern is with the
2 electricity on docks and grounding. I understand people
3 have been killed because the dock wasn't grounded.
4 Table Rock has a requirement of electrical inspection
5 every five years when your permit is renewed, thus the
6 push for solar to eliminate the electricity on the dock.
7 I understand that. There is a very simple tool now that
8 is available. It is a siren system that you can put on
9 your dock. If you have a grounding problem, the siren
10 will sound. Very inexpensive. Would solve the problem
11 rather than requiring everyone to go to solar.

12 Requiring everyone to go to solar is stupid and
13 awfully expensive for the individual lot. There's no
14 commonsense. You got a problem and there's an easy
15 solution. You can get a simple, inexpensive siren
16 system that will tell you -- automatically go off if
17 there is a grounding in water. That's it.

18 MR. ROY WHITLEY: My -- what my comment
19 relates to the next to the last bullet instead of me
20 reading it to you. Physical resources limit proper
21 management of the current program. If we have a
22 government that's not going to support the management of
23 the plan, whatever -- whatever the plan is, if it cannot
24 be enforced, then the plan is, in essence, limited. It
25 can only be a limited success. And since we never -- we

1 never get as much money as we need to manage what we're
2 managing in the government, we know before it's approved
3 that it cannot be managed properly or in accordance with
4 the plan. The reason I'm saying that: I'm retired
5 Army, and I spent 30 years being underfunded. That's
6 it.

7 MR. EARL HEGGEN: Earl the Pearl. There you
8 go. The Corps of Army Engineers doesn't own so much as
9 a square inch of Table Rock Lake or -- or the shoreline.
10 We the citizens pay them to manage it. All the money
11 from the electric that is produced by the dam is used to
12 maintain power generators and the dam. It don't go no
13 place else. That will get their attention. Not that it
14 will do anything about it, but that will get their
15 attention.

16 I've been around and around with them a couple of
17 times. I wanted to put a -- a solar on my boat dock and
18 they just about had a fit. Now they want you to put the
19 solar on. Either they're wrong now or they were wrong
20 then, but their engineers -- and they were wrong. So
21 much for engineers.

22 Well, if they want to say that the weeds will --
23 will filter out more impurities from the shoreline than
24 Kentucky tall fescue, I want to see a write-up from the
25 -- the Missouri College of Agriculture saying that, not

1 the last 10 or 15 years at all anybody being
2 electrocuted around here. There's just no safety issue.

3 Even worse safety issue if they take the electric
4 out because you can't maintain power, lights and so
5 forth on there. And with all people -- you know, all
6 the high speed running around on the lake, you need to
7 be able to lift your boat out of the water to protect
8 it. Them things bouncing around in there just tears it
9 to pieces.

10 There shouldn't be a difference between the
11 commercial places, commercial docks and marinas, and the
12 individuals. They're putting all the burden of this on
13 private individuals and not changing the rules for the
14 commercial places. They still get to keep power, and
15 they're making all the individuals bear the cost. It
16 would be a huge cost to change to solar, and then you
17 still don't have enough power to do anything, but
18 they're going to leave all the commercial places still
19 having electric. That's a horrendous, you know,
20 prejudicial problem there. We're the least equipped to
21 afford all that compared to a commercial place.

22 MS. MARION WILSON: I guess I'm just -- I'm a
23 permittee on this Basin Hollow Boat Dock. I'm concerned
24 about the alternative electric power that they're asking
25 us to put in in 10 years or whatever it is. I'm just

1 concerned about the extra expense and the aesthetics of
2 solar panels on our roofs and extra weight on our docks,
3 batteries on our docks which may leak and cause
4 contamination to the lake. I think that one simple
5 power line coming to the dock is much better aesthetics
6 than all of the solar panels and the batteries on the
7 docks. I just like to, you know, do whatever we need to
8 do to get this rescinded and to get this reconsidered in
9 their proposal. I was not aware of this when we met,
10 you know, early on. Solar power was never mentioned
11 then that I remember. And I'd just like to see what we
12 could do to get this rescinded. So I guess that's about
13 all on the electric power.

14 There's -- there's other comments I could make
15 maybe at a later time, but I'll just put those in

- 1) Wake board boats and massive cruisers boats intended for use on the Great Lakes and Gulf States are causing safety issues and significant damage because of their huge wakes.

Damage to docks, damage to the shoreline/environment and the wakes produced make it dangerous to smaller boats while they are running.

During a normal day, it's impossible to fish because of the massive wakes.

Limiting the size of the boats allowed on Table Rock or forcing them to have idle speed only would be a way of stopping property damage and danger to other boater.

Table Rock is quickly turning into Lake of the Ozarks as far as out of control boaters and the Corps and Water Patrol should stop this from happening since Table Rock is a Corps run lake.

- 2) Environmental impact of the waves caused by wake boats and huge boats are causing shoreline damage and water clarity issues. We have witnessed the water clarity around the dock to be 1' to 2' in the morning (used to be 4' to 6') by early afternoon clarity goes to 6" to 8" at best because of the huge rollers hitting the bank.

- 3) The Water Patrol and Corps are proposing to remove buoys from dock owners. If buoys are removed the boats will get even closer to the docks and cause more damage. The buoys serve as a reminder to stay off the dock 100'. An 18" x 24" sign on a dock is ridiculous and frankly, stupid. Please do not remove the private buoys. Our buoy cost about \$800 total and we just put it out earlier this year.

After 20 years and still no erosion, GUESS WHAT? I was told to remove them or pay for a license. It made me so angry that money was the bottom line, at 77 years of age I removed all of them myself.

I'm no longer interested on steps, but I'm sure many are. Today, my interest is in the gulf cart. I don't have a doctor's recommendation of being handicapped, but I do have a birth certificate of old age—88. That is the worst handicap—there is no cure! I just don't have the stamina to run up and down that hill, or even walk.

Even if I were younger, there would be times I would need help moving things, such as batteries for my solar power. Yes, I was one of the first to have solar power.

To say I can only have a storage locker on the dock is very hostile. I now have an anchored bench. If I didn't at least have a bench to sit on, how could I spend time enjoying the lake?

Spending some time at your web site, brings me to the conclusion: it seem the corps is not interested in balancing the commercial and private areas but, wish the private would just go away.

Per our conversation on August 1 at the informational meeting in Shell Knob, I am writing to once again beg for positive consideration on my request to be zoned for LDA in the area of Table Rock Lake across the cove from Zone 336 on your lake map. I have informed you about the circumstances that currently exist with that particular LDA and I don't want anyone to think that this is about taking something away from a property owner who is fortunate enough to own the land that abuts this particular LDA area.

I would, however ask that you consider and grant me LDA approval based on using any existing zoning that was discovered to be obsolete, unusable, or otherwise outdated as referred to in your handout titled "Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revision" that was distributed at the meetings. Under the "Alternative 4" proposal (which seems to be your preferred option) it was stated that "unusable LDA and RLDA were relocated to correct errors". If other situations exist such as is the case with LDA 336, (where hundreds of feet of LDA are allocated to one private dock with no easement proposed or filed to grant parking for any additional docks) that seems to make the numbers that are used to determine usage of available LDA rather skewed and results in a perpetual state of under-utilization, which in turn does not allow for any future hope of others on Table Rock Lake being able to apply for LDA when we otherwise meet all of the necessary criteria to qualify to be zoned.

My understanding of the Corps' objectives was to look for circumstances where the current LDA was not being used and update that to better maximize usage of our shoreline availability, along with the other objectives described in the SMP mission statement. I have given one example of a case where 521 feet of zoning is being used to permit one 4-slip private dock, but that should not be construed as any jealousy or sense of privilege on my behalf and I quite frankly do not care one bit where the LDA that I am begging for is obtained from but two facts are important to point out!

1. There appears to have been LDA that was deemed unusable and was relocated according to your meeting handout.
2. A portion of that or other excess LDA could have been relocated to the area that I am requesting to be zoned, based on my meeting all of the other criteria to be eligible for LDA abutting my property. Please consider and grant my request to have some of your existing LDA relocated to the shoreline across the cove from existing LDA# 336 in John's Branch Cove on Table Rock Lake. The property owners of Eagle Bluff Estates and Harmony Hills Estate would then be able to have the ability to install a dock that services our needs and allows us to best utilize our beautiful lake.

Thank you for your continued consideration and putting up with my persistence on this matter.

The Shoreline Management Plan (SMP) for Table Rock Lake is the regulating policy for the placement of private boat docks on Table Rock Lake. Within the SMP, the shoreline has been evaluated and allocated into various zones. The shoreline zone for the placement of boat docks is called a "limited development area" in the SMP. This is the only allocation in which a private and community dock may be placed on the lake.


Mr. Featherston has requested to relocate a "protected" area to a "limited development" area on Table Rock Lake. Using our shoreline terminology, the Corps considers this action as a "rezoning" request. Unfortunately, this type of request is not considered a minor revision and would require full public involvement, environmental documentation, and approval by the Southwestern Division Commander in Dallas, Texas. These updates are very costly, time consuming and require extensive use of manpower and resources to complete. Also, if changes of shoreline locations are proposed, an environmental assessment (EA) would be required at a minimum to comply with National Environmental Policy Act (NEPA) documentation. Approval of this request would be contrary to the existing SMP for Table Rock Lake. For these reasons, I cannot give favorable consideration to his application. When a SMP update occurs at Table Rock Lake and rezoning requests are considered, he will be notified by the Operations Project Manager.

A single shoreline permit request may seem "simple", but when added together with others, they may become a "huge" concern as we strive to balance both public and private interests. The Operations Project Manager has included a budget request to meet the costs of a SMP update. However, this update has not been funded due to higher priority maintenance requirements, facility upgrades and other services provided to the visiting public. The last major update to the SMP was completed in 1996. At an approximate cost of \$3.1 million, the Little Rock District has been unable to obtain necessary funding in our Operations and Maintenance (O&M) budget for this purpose. We will strive to place as much emphasis on this budget request as practicable.

Mr. Featherston may consider these options for his boat mooring needs: (1) obtain legal access to the existing limited development area shoreline, (2) locate an existing dock in a limited development area near your development and add slips to their existing dock, or (3) secure slips in a commercial marina.


F. I am right across the cove from LDA #336, which has 521' of LDA to service one private 4-slip dock.

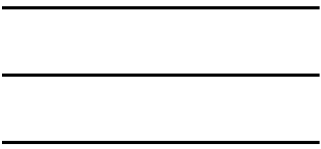

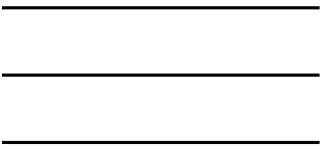

After attending your workshop on August 1, 2017 in Shell Knob, Mo, I would offer the following comments:

1> Buoys: Disallowing "No Wake" buoys after December 31, 2020 doesn't seem to have merit and should be withdrawn. Properly placed buoys provide safety to swimmers in the water around shoreline docks and further provide protection against structural damage to the docks. It's apparent today that many individuals who own and operate boats, no matter the age, seem to not understand property curtesy and safety rules when operating their boats. One only has to observe how boat operators don't understand the current regulations concerning the use of "ski flags" when pulling skiers, tubes, or wakeboarding to realize how much education is lacking on the lake. Unless, the Missouri Water Patrol implements a required Boat Operators License, or provides additional education opportunities, or increases their presence on the lake these unsafe acts will only grow in numbers. Boat operators continually disrespect the rights of others and no one operating a boat is going to read or pay attention to a sign on a dock regarding a "No Wake" zone around the dock.

2> Change of slip size. I have no issue with changing the slip size from 14' x 30' to 12' x 30". Larger boats should be docked in a marina.

3> Alternative power: I realize that great advances have been made with the use of alternative power. However, I would see no reason to require existing docks to change to alternative power. As you know, Table Rock Lake is not like the Lake of the Ozarks and you as the Corps approves and limits the number of docks on Table Rock Lake. Each dock has to renew their permit every five years and one of the requirements is to have the dock inspected by a licensed electrician. In the previous licensing renewal of our dock, the Corps required a different disconnect on the dock and at the last renewal, the Corps required a disconnect on the "drop pole" adjacent to the dock. Additionally, most, if not all docks have Ground Fault Interrupters on each slip and also on the main power panel. Solar is likely the only "alternative" power that currently is feasible and even that technology has issues with durability and the ability to provide adequate power for docks especially on periods of continuous rainy and cloudy days. Many individuals use the power on their dock to charge their batteries on their fishing boats and have found that this is not always possible during these periods of non-sunny days. In addition to the cost of

the "alternative" power, there will be a cost associated with removing the existing "drop pole" as well as the power lines from the "drop pole" to the dock and to the meter pole.

4> Access to Docks: I know there is a proposal to limit access to docks thru Corps property, however, if this were to be implemented, it would mean that people would have to trespass thru private property to access their docks as many of these docks are located in front of private individuals properties. I understood one of the reasons that the Corps designed "zones" for docks was to provide access to the individuals who owned and used the docks and I believe that this should continue.

5> Permits to Modify Docks: I understand that the Corps only wants to deal with the "Permittee" when making changes, modifying or building new docks and that is understandable. However, the "permittee" should be required to seek written permission of each slip owner on that particular dock and provide that documentation to the Corps when requesting changes to ensure that the "permittee" is acting in the best interests of ALL slip owners. If this proposal were to be implemented, it would be possible for the "permittee" to submit plans for changes, modifications or for a new dock that all of the slip owners did not approve and weren't interested in paying. This is Very Important that all slip owners are in agreement with Major modification or new dock construction that would impact all slip owners. Annual renewal is a different matter unless the Corps Inspection mandates major changes to the existing dock.

I appreciate the opportunity to comment and only hope that the Corps will take my comments as well as other individuals comments in account as you work to update this Master Plan.

Below is my concern and objection to No Wake buoy plans outlined in the Table Rock Lake U.S Army Corp of Engineers revision of the Shoreline Management Plan.

One of the new proposed rule changes on Table Rock Lake is the removal of “No Wake Buoys”. I realize State law states no wake zones within 100 feet from any boat docks. However, the U.S Army Corp of Engineers is proposing removing the buoys by the end of 2020. A person’s perception of 100 feet is by no means an exact science. The safety of citizens and damage to property is at risk if the buoys are forced to be removed. No wake/idle speed buoys are good reminders to boaters; particularly wake boats and large watercraft, to remain away from docks. Idle speeds are much safer for boats to navigate around structures. The damage caused by wakes to docks is substantial. Do your homework and contact dock and lift builders to verify. More importantly, the risk for injury to swimmers is one the Corp should consider. Buoys offer a friendly reminder to occasional boaters to stay a safe distance from docks and maintain safe speeds. I do not support removing no wake/idle speed buoys on Table Rock Lake.

I feel this is not in the best interest of slip owners on community docks as the cost will be excessive if it is a mandatory conversion. Certified electricians and sellers of solar power will be all to happy to cash in on this issue. There is also the problem of where the equipment and related items will be housed. Will we need to submit plans to the Corps of Engineers for additional space to store equipment? I realize that all fingers on a community dock are accessible to all slip owners but the additional equipment will require several square feet of available finger space and possibly eliminate an entire finger. Will there be allowances for back up power if the weather prohibits the solar power from providing adequate voltage to boat lifts? I am also concerned with the size of slips allowed. I would very much like to see the size of boats and slips limited to a size suitable for a lake no larger than Table Rock. These two factors create real problems for those who own property at Lake of the Ozarks. Friends of mine at Lake of the Ozarks have had to build seawalls to protect their docks and property. And they do NOT feel safe on the lake, especially on the weekends in high traffic areas. So let's not let that happen at Table Rock! Certain travel websites now warn travelers not to go out on the lake on the weekends, citing safety concerns.

I own land and docks slips at Table Rock and have for the past 25 years. The reason Table Rock is so popular and valued is that it's a Corp of Engineers lake. That means lots of rules and restrictions - and while we might occasionally grumble about some of those rules - they are precisely what has kept the lake so pristine and attractive to Missourians and people from out of state. So thank you Corp of Engineers!! Now is not the time to relax those rules.

Specifically, I want to comment on removal of BUOYS. Buoys are there to protect docks and people! Removing them makes about as much sense as removing stop or yield signs on our streets and highways and replacing them with a "law" that says where you must stop. Why don't we do that? Because the general public and drivers need reminders when others safety is at risk!

Before we had a buoy at the front of our small cove (about 200 feet across), boats used to race into and through the cove at full speed. This was very dangerous and created unnecessary waves for our docks and the wildlife around the cove. It certainly was not safe for people swimming or good for docks (property). AFTER the BUOY was installed, this just doesn't happen anymore. It's like a stop sign - BOATERS NEED THE REMINDER - or people and property will be at risk.

If maintenance of the buoys is a resource issue, then set up whatever regulations are necessary and those of us who are property owners will take responsibility for maintenance of the buoys. Without the buoys you will be creating very real safety hazards (for those swimming in coves) and for Table Rock residents' property. Please do not remove the buoys that protect us at Table Rock. I have not talked to one property owner at Table Rock who believes buoy removal is a good idea.

Please feel free to contact me. And thanks to the Corps for making Table Rock what it is today.

Like many other owners of slips and docks on Table Rock Lake (TRL) I am very concerned with the proposed plan to eliminate all electrical from docks and require the use of solar energy only. Are owners in TRL the first to have to meet this requirement? If so, has it been thoroughly researched and considered? Is the US Army Corps of Engineers aware of the proposed cost for slip owners? To place total dependence on solar will be extremely expensive for many who might struggle to meet current dock fees.

Is there a true reason for this proposed change? To my knowledge, we have not faced large numbers of electrocution deaths. Requirement for a dock to be checked periodically by a licensed person can avert the concerns you may have. With that in mind, if each of the 5,474 slips are required to make slip modifications of just \$1,000 each, the total cost will be in excess of \$5,000,000. After doing some preliminary research, it appears that the cost of conversion to a system that has sufficient energy for a boat lift can cost up to \$3,000 - \$4,000 dollars. At a per-slip cost of \$3,000, the total cost of such a change will be in excess of \$16,000,000. This is NOT an insignificant amount of money for many owners.

Clearly, if there is sufficient evidence that this move to an energy alternative is being done with the public interest, and at reasonable cost, perhaps it could be justified. However, the report from the 2015 meetings indicated overwhelming opposition to requiring solar alternatives and I am certain that such a vote today would be very similar, absent a Corp ability to demonstrate an absolute need for the change.

Likewise, the requirement to remove all no-wake buoys by the end of 2020 may also be making change for the sake of change, rather than for the good of those who use the lake. Signs attached to docks cannot be as effective as the buoys and I have not read of injuries or lives lost from hitting the buoys. I believe that those no-wake buoys play an important role in keeping TRL safe for everyone.

As a concerned slip owner and boat owner, the proposed changes have a direct impact on my family, but they also may have a devastating effect of all slip owners and boaters at TRL.

We strongly disapprove of the draft documents. The following are our concerns:

We believe there is a problem with having solar power on all private and community docks. The price of installing solar power is too expensive. It is too expensive to maintain. Insurance rates will be higher. Then you have the issue of batteries all over the lake on docks and the possibility of leakage into the lake. If there is bad weather – tornado, straight-line winds, or heavy snow, the docks could be under water. This could cause an environmental issue for fish, birds, and wild life on the lake. Right now all new docks on the lake are to have solar power. We have been on Table Rock Lake since 1985 and feel our community dock should be “grandfathered in.” It is not right to have commercial docks not required to change to solar but private and community docks are required to change. Commercial docks have more money and can write off their expenses!

It is our understanding the main reason to make the change to solar power on the docks is to avoid electrocution. We are under the impression that there have been very few people electrocuted mainly because of the dock inspections every five years. If the existing electric-powered docks are grandfathered in, maybe the inspections could be changed to every two years.

In the management plan under Foot Paths, it is stated to use natural colored wood mulch or wood bark. In the past river rock was allowed. We feel the rocks need to be added since they look more natural to the surrounding area. The rocks stick in the ground and are less likely to wash away like mulch.

Also, the plan wants to remove all no-wake buoys by 2020 by private docks, and replace them with signs on the docks. Does this include community docks? If it does, no one out in a boat going faster than wake speed is going to read any signs on a dock. There are many people vacationing on Table Rock Lake that don't know the rules. If they see a no-wake buoy, there is more of a chance for them to slow down.

Please find below comments on the new SMP for Tablerock.

The COE is doing a great job with limited funding and laws to administer within the confinements of those legislative barriers, below are solutions to help.

1) Removal of no wake buoys will create major additional safety and environmental issues on Tablerock. Understand there is an existing law for boats to be no wake within 100 feet of a dock and a sign is allowed. The problem solved by the no wake buoy is to identify to boaters, how far is 100 feet? It is extremely hard to judge 100 feet when on the water and moving at speed. New and young boaters can not judge 100 feet without a visual clue to help and remind them of the law. Some boaters have limited vision problems which buoys help to alert and there are circumstances such as night boating and fog where docks can't be seen and the buoys help. Some boaters can't read or read English, buoys help. Also, there are numerous people in the water around their docks swimming and the buoys help to alert that people may be in the water behind the buoy, removal will endanger the safety of swimmers and risk for potential collisions will be increased greatly. Further erosion of shoreline will be increased as boaters come closer to shorelines and docks if the buoys are removed, creating an environmental issue for Tablerock.

Solution: Grant every dock with 6 or more slips and docks with less than 6 slips whom may have 6 or more combined with other docks in a geographical area-- one no wake buoy per dock that meets minimum slips. Charge \$30.00 per buoy each year as fee, money goes to COE or MSHP to administer program. Any docks with buoys not meeting regulations, such as having more than one per dock, must be removed. This will keep the law and administer easy to apply and fund. If the COE or MSHP can't monitor the program for any reason, outsource to a contractor and use fees to fund third party.

2) Vegetation permits should not be grandfathered in. Grandfathering creates confusing rules which do not benefit the majority public. Grandfathering only benefits a small minority and is an out dated solution. Mowing down to lake creates erosion of shoreline and leaching of soil/contaminates into lake. Many older septic tanks around lake that are leaching into lake and a shoreline with more vegetation would help to absorb the leaching. Many paved and non paved parking lots on COE land for vehicles exist in mowed shoreline. More vegetation would help to absorb the contaminants from vehicles. Electric golf carts were the primary use and now 20 years later, gas powered off road XUVs of all sizes

dot the shorelines. Increased vegetation would help to filter the contaminates of these gas powered personal use vehicles.

All vegetation permits should be the same, homeowners can apply and receive under brushing per COE regulations, mowing to shoreline should be prohibited to increase water quality and further promote environmental fisheries and beauty of lake. Admin of a program that is universal to all around lake will be more efficient for the COE and less costly to COE. Charge an annual fee of \$30 for vegetation permit to fund this program.

If the COE can't monitor the program for any reason, outsource to a contractor and use fees to fund third party.

New regulations would require all docks to convert to solar power within 10 years at an estimated cost burden to the public of over \$10,000,000. All docks are already required to be inspected by a licensed electrician at each renewal. The inspection at renewal seems reasonable. 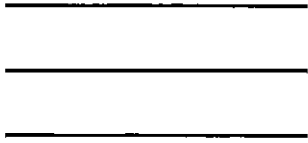

I am a homeowner and dock owner at Table Rock lake. I have three issues that I am concerned with in this new plan.

1. No Wake Buoys: these buoys are there to provide safety and security for boaters, swimmers and dock owners. If these are taken away I am concerned that there will be increased accidents for all involved. If the problem is the disrepair of these buoys then enforce a rule concerning that. But to take them all away is to allow danger to the lake enthusiasts. Please reconsider this change.
2. The second issue that I would like to see revisited is the change to an alternate source of power to the docks. Although I would like to be as green as possible I believe that this change would be a financial burden to most of the dock owners. If one of the goals/ philosophies of Table Rock lake is recreation to the residents of Missouri then I feel that this change is prohibitive to that goal. Some of the dock owners would not be able to afford this burden and then it would be impossible for those boaters to enjoy the lake. I am also concerned about the R and D on solar power and wind power for the ability to sustain power at all times to the docks. To Whom it May Concern,

Thank you for taking the time to consider the concerns and comments regarding the Table Rock Lake shoreline management plan revision. My family has been visiting Table Rock Lake since I was born and owns a house near Blue Eye, Missouri. We spend most of our summer weekends on the water and appreciate the natural beauty of Table Rock Lake and the surrounding shoreline. With that being said, my wife and I do have two issues we would like to address.

1. The plan would not allow for no-wake buoys for private docks and would only allow no wake signs on the docks. Existing no wake buoys would have to be removed by 2020. We disagree with this part of the plan as no wake buoys offer safety and calm water near the private docks. The presence of a no wake buoy is infinitely more effective than a sign on the dock that might only be seen once a vessel is already too close to the dock. The no wake buoys can also provide safety to swimmers who may be near a dock and would prevent injuries resulting from vessels with excessive wakes too close to a dock. Finally, the no wake buoys provide protection of the boats within the docks and prevents damage due to excessive wakes. We do not believe that there are an excessive number of no wake buoys on the lake and there is plenty of room for boats to travel at all speeds throughout the lake.

2. The plan would require alternative power sources on docks beginning in 2028. While we can appreciate the environmental impact of "going green", this creates an undue burden on dock owners related to cost and construction. The ultimate cost of installing alternative energy on a private dock is unknown and almost impossible to predict ten years into the future. The tri-lakes area may not even have enough contractors who are qualified to perform these conversions. The cost of removing existing electrical lines both on the shore and dock would be difficult for many private dock owners to fund. As our country continues to move towards renewable energy sources, would it not be better to keep the existing electrical lines and move towards replacing existing coal fired power plants that supply them with other sources such as nuclear or wind? By 2027, the power plants that supply electricity to the lake should be much more environmentally friendly and the installation of alternative energy on a dock should be a moot point.



Dear Friends:

My wife Vicki and I own a home at #6 Little Dove Circle, Branson West, Missouri 65737, and we have a boat slip in the boat dock located at 110 Little Dove Circle, Branson West, Missouri 65737.

I write to you with my concerns about two issues in the Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revision. They are both important to me, so in no particular order, they are as follows.

SHORE POWER vs. SOLAR POWER

It is my understanding that shore power for our dock would sunset in 10 years, in 2027.

I am concerned that this part of the plan should be deleted so that Little Dove Subdivision can keep shore power as opposed to solar power.

Solar power has its limitations, especially for a 20-slip dock such as we have at Little Dove. Only one lift can be used at a time, and there are many times during the busy season when multiple boat lifts are being operated on our 20-slip dock. This is especially problematic during pop-up storms when multiple boat owners are trying to dock their boats at the same and get them lifted out of the water.

Many boat slip owners at Little Dove operate their boats at night when solar charging is not possible. I am concerned that we will be unable to utilize the boat lifts during night time hours or at the least, use will be limited.

We at Table Rock Lake have experienced no problems with electrocutions on docks. At Little Dove we are very careful to be sure that we are in compliance with shore power safety

protocols. I suggest that the Plan Revision attempts to fix something that is not broken as concerns shore power. I strongly oppose the switch to solar power.

NO WAKE BUOYS – A SAFETY CONCERN

The second concern is the removal of “no wake” buoys.

The Little Dove boat dock is located adjacent point 5 and is fairly near the main channel. There is a swimming dock at Little Dove. Our families, including young children, swim in the cove. We have a “no wake” buoy, which slows or substantially eliminates swift boat traffic in the cove which threatens the safety of our families and creates dangerous wakes. We want to safely swim near our swim dock and not worry about high speed boat traffic endangering the lives of our children.


Further, operation of boats at high speed will damage the shoreline. One of the goals of the Plan Revision is to sustainably manage the lake’s resources for future generations. Creating a situation where boats can enter and exit a small cove at high speed, sending wakes at swimmers by the boat dock and into the shore, does not do anything to help manage the lake’s resources for future generations. It has the opposite effect by unnecessarily increasing shoreline erosion.

The Plan is at cross-purposes with reality on the subject of lakeshore erosion.

Those are my two main concerns. I urge the US Army Corp of Engineers to abandon the mandate of solar power by 2027, and abandon the requirement that “no wake” buoys be removed from our cove.

Additional comment details from Edward Wammack:

I'm not an expert on Solar Power but have done a little research and have some significant concerns related to the proposal to mandate retrofitting existing docks to 100% solar power.

It is my understanding that the break-even point for most residential solar power systems is in the 10 to 15-year range (particularly in areas with lower utility power cost, such as ours). Those systems are designed to work in conjunction with utility power. A stand-alone dock system would need to be sized for peak capacity and include battery storage if there is no utility power available. That adds cost and would materially extend the payback period.

We must also consider the additional costs to re-engineer docks to support installation of solar power, additional dock security systems to protect the investment in solar power equipment and batteries, and removal of existing utility poles, lines, terminals, etc.

While I support efforts to reduce dependencies on carbon based fuels, we need to consider the environmental impact of manufacturing and future disposition of the panels, electronics, and batteries required to implement solar power systems. In addition, it is my belief that overall efficiency would be better if the utility providers implement alternative "green" sources of power rather than individual solar production due to the efficiency of scale and their ability to balance power usage across sources based on supply (i.e. shift from solar to wind or hydro during periods of low solar production).

I view this proposed requirement as a "tax" on existing dock owners. It is a government mandate which requires payment for the implementation of products not otherwise desired by the individual for the potential benefit of the masses. This "tax" is in addition to the inevitable reduction in dock values which will occur as additional docks are approved and installed (simple supply and demand).

It seems likely that this proposal is being promoted by manufacturers and/or installers of solar power systems for their own selfish goals, not necessarily the good of the dock owners or the environment.

All that said, I would accept a requirement for new docks to be implemented with only solar power. That would be a known cost at the time of build and could eliminate the need for additional power poles and lines to support new docks.

Most Important Factors of Opinion: Positive -- Shoreline Allocation Alternative #4 as preferred; organization of the document, Links to the updated Master Plan and Title 32 (Exhibit B)

Negative - Overly-restrictive access to docks; No new requests for stairs/steps to be approved; Elimination of "No Wake" Buoys, Mandate for docks to convert to alternative power (solar, wind)

Requested Changes to the Draft TRL SMP:

1. Foot Paths (pg. 30) - Set this wording as a general guideline, but allow alternatives (e.g. width greater than 6 ft., use of other environmentally-safe materials for the paths, use of stairs/steps) dependent upon the actual distance and slope to the dock. Many private docks on the lake are accessed by steep and rocky paths that are dangerous to people of all ages and abilities. The USACE should be more flexible on this dependent upon the unique characteristics of the accesses. "One size" does not fit all and dock owners should be allowed to request different alternatives that balance safety with long-term environmental protection.
2. Eliminate the requirement to convert existing dock power sources to alternative sources (pg. 36). If existing power lines (above or underground) are not being maintained in accordance with USACE

requirements, then do not renew the dock permits until they are in compliance. Renewals require dock inspections, so this would be the appropriate time to enforce correction of any deficiencies. While this could be an appropriate requirement for new docks, the required conversion of existing power sources would be prohibitively expensive, disrupt the landscape in the removal of existing lines, and not warranted for existing docks where the lines and electrical services are being properly maintained and regularly inspected.

3. Continue to allow the permitting of "No Wake Buoys" (pg. 31) - We have observed many boaters (especially rental boats) on TRL apparently unaware of USCG regulations governing wakes in dock areas as well as unsafe boating operations in close proximity to people swimming from the docks. We further understand that this new change would only apply to private docks and not to marinas and/or commercial operations, creating a conflict in the application of this new rule. For those instances where such buoys will overly restrict navigation in a narrow cove, then the authority to install could be denied. We also believe that the installation of no wake signs on docks will be much less effective than the buoys because boaters are unlikely to see the signs until they are too close to the docks. This is both a safety and damage issue.

Thank you for your sponsorship of the public workshops in the revisions to the SMP (we attended the workshop at Reeds Springs HS on 8/2) and your consideration for adopting the changes we've recommended.

* This allow boats to speed into the coves where families are playing in the water. I have seen boats speed into coves where people are enjoying playing in the water where there isn't no wake buoys. During fishing tournaments the fisherman hate to slowdown.

* I believe it would be a big safety issue to elimanate the buoys next to boat docks along the main channel of the lake. The buoys keep the boats farther away from the docks, which makes it safer for boats leaving their docks and people playing in the water.

Proposal #2

I think it will be a major problem to eliminate electrical power on large community boat docks because of not having enough power to run the boat lifts especially when it is cloudy and there isn't enough solar power to recharge the batteries. There is lot of power used on docks on weekends and especially holiday weekends.

* Not having enough battery power to raise their boat lifts or charge the boat trolling batteries will cause people to bring portable generators on the dock, which will create some electrical safety issues if they drop an electrical cord into the water without the extra safety of a ground fault circuit that is required for a boat docks.

There are several of us who have gotten older and need your consideration. Please take this into account. Having steps or a larger access ramp will not destroy the beauty of our lake since it is hidden from view by the dock and not seen from those on the lake. Also, unless the restrictions on the SMP are modified I think property values will be affected in a significant way. To say that another way, the property we invested in and have used will not be the same. Thanks.

We hoped to have attended one of the meetings earlier this month, but were not able to do so. This email is being provided to express our thoughts and concerns regarding a change to the plan that has to do with power/electrical services to a private floating facility (dock). We were disheartened to learn that by 12/31/27 the Army Corp of Engineers will no longer renew permits for electrical services as noted below.

"MAJOR CHANGES FROM THE PREVIOUS PLAN

* Only alternative power sources (e.g. solar) will be allowed. Existing licenses for 9 overhead and underground electric service to private floating facilities will not be 10 renewed after December 31, 2027."

We acquired our dock/slips approximately 10 years ago and to this best of our knowledge our dock has had electrical service for several years prior to this. We have complied with the electrical inspections and spent a sum of money to assure the electrical connection is safe. We also in the last couple of years spent money to fix a light on the pole that we also now understand has to be removed. The light is not regularly on and is only used 2-3 times for brief periods in the summer when accessing the dock at night. Not sure of the logic behind having to remove it, but will be complying this fall in order to get our permit. Understandably, we are not happy about removing the light.

However, on a larger note, we are really concerned about not being able to maintain our electrical service. When we purchased our slips, we had certain criteria that we were looking for, one of which was electrical service. Again, don't understand the rationale behind this decision. We are not asking for something that we have not previously been approved and really wish the Army Corp of Engineers would reconsider this change to grandfather in those who have an existing electrical service. Would be happy to discuss this further and our contact information is below.

Appreciate your reconsidering this.



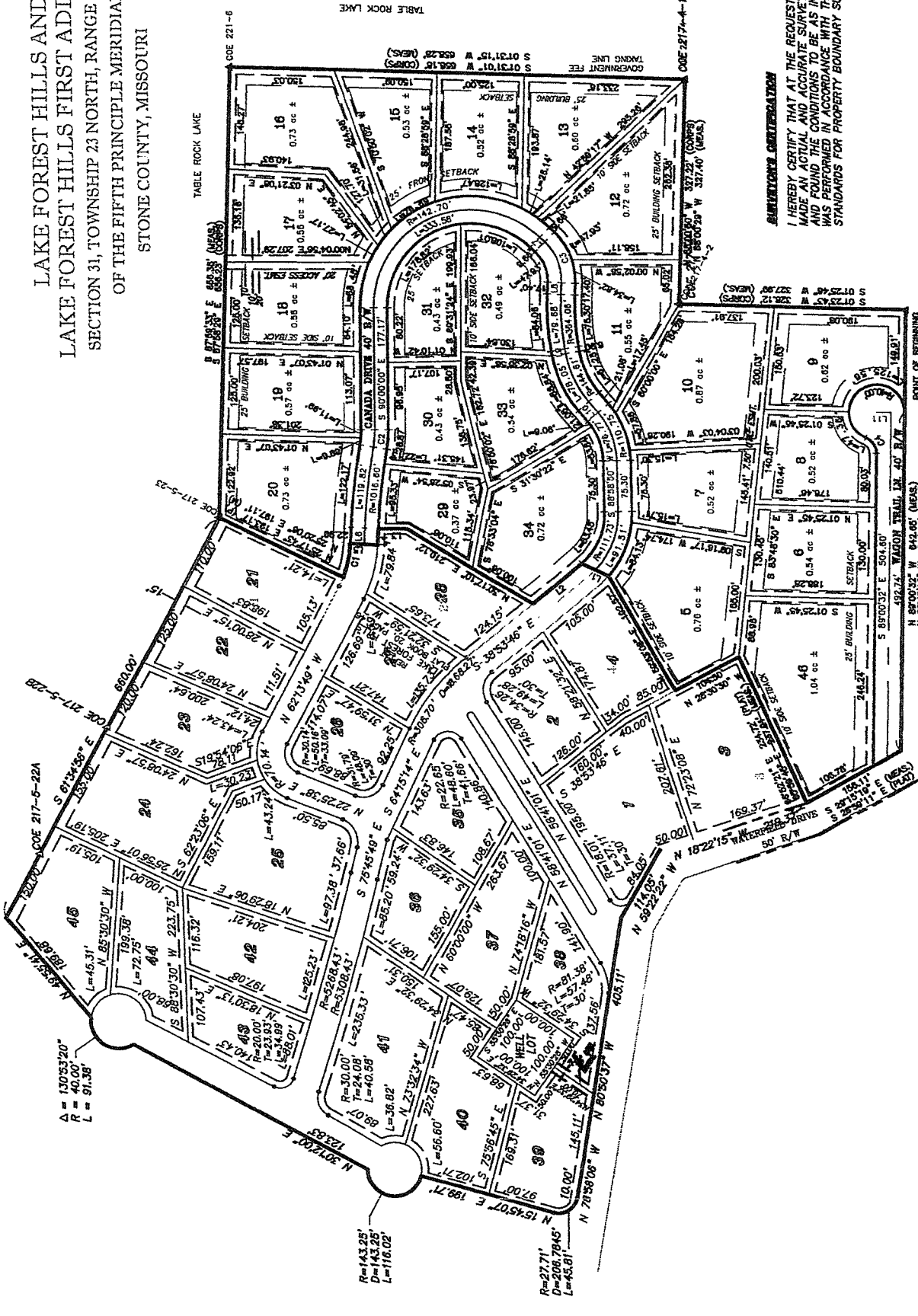

I have one big objection with the current Shoreline Management Plan Revision. It is the requirement for all private boat docks to go to alternative energy.

The Corps requires an electrical inspection each time our dock permit is renewed. This electrical inspection is the reason there is not a problem with electrocutions on Table Rock Lake.

I feel very strongly that all existing docks on electricity should be grandfathered and allowed to remain on electricity. The cost to the public would be millions of dollars to go to alternative energy and it is just not needed.

On the Master Plan, I will repeat a comment I made during that comment period. All existing adjacent homes should be treated equally and allowed to have a vegetation permit. Some existing homes adjacent to Corps land are called environmentally sensitive but there is no good reason one home can have a vegetation permit and another home cannot. There is no logical reason other than it has been that way in the past. At a minimum ALL homes should be allowed to keep brush and weeds away from their home for fire safety for at least 50' from the foundation whether they have a vegetation permit or not.

We've asked many times for NO CHANGE to be made to the Plan, but there are several items of major concern:

- I object to the carrying capacity as it limits the right to use the lake.
- I object to tighter restrictions placed upon vegetative management permits.
- I object to the new non-transferable grandfathered vegetative management permit rule.

Subject: Comments on Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan Revisions

I recently attended one of your public workshops providing information regarding the proposed revisions to the current Shoreline Management Plan for Table Rock Lake. Thank you for the opportunity to speak with Corps representatives to gain an understanding about the proposed changes and submit comments.

I have been on Table Rock Lake for recreational purposes for well over 50 years, boating, fishing, swimming, and enjoying nature, and expect to do so for many more years. I do have concerns with some of the proposed SMP changes and strongly disapprove of three of the changes.

The requirement that all existing private/community docks be converted to solar/alternative power and the current land based electric service be phased out within ten years is impractical and would be very costly to implement. Our dock currently receives electrical power from White River Valley Electric, whom I would assume is receiving some or all of its power from what is generated by the Table Rock dam, which is one of the missions of the Corps project. I consider this source to be just as green as using solar. According to the Missouri Department of Energy, in our area there is an expected 200 days of sunny weather per year. I have a concern with the ability to generate sufficient power from solar on those remaining 165 days that have only partial sunlight or no sunlight at all. Additionally, many docks are located such that due to the hilly terrain the afternoon sunlight is somewhat limited during the summer months and particularly during winter.

Another concern is the weight of several solar panels being installed on the roof of a dock that was not designed or structurally built to hold the additional weight of these panels. The extra weight from panels on the roof might also raise the center of gravity of a dock that could make them unstable and increase the risk of turning over due to ice or snow accumulation.

I understand the safety issue with electricity and water but each dock is inspected every five years during the permit renewal process and we regularly check all our GFI circuits for proper operation. Would solar power wired through an inverter to change to AC be any safer?


The cost to install a solar power system would be extremely cost prohibitive for a dock of our size. Information I have gathered from the Missouri Department of Energy indicates \$5.00 per watt for a solar installation, which, as an example, would be \$10,000 for a 2 Kw system. My calculation is that we would require at least 6 Kw or a total of \$30,000 plus another \$8,000 to \$10,000 for storage batteries. Net metering would help to offset some of this enormous cost but would require a dock to still be connected to the land based service system. Would this be allowed?

The second proposed revision I disagree with is the requirement that all boats with Marine Sanitation Devices (MSD) be moored in commercial marinas. My understanding is that overboard discharge is already illegal therefore I see no reason for this change. When our holding tank is close to being full we motor to a commercial marina to pump out, a practice I think all Table Rock boaters are doing. Forcing all boats with MSD systems into only commercial marinas seems extreme and unfair. The proposal indicates boats in existing docks would be grandfathered however what happens should a boat owner sell and buy a different boat or sell their slip to another person with a different boat? Discussion with a Corps representative at the public workshop indicated that an existing dock would be grandfathered as a whole not just an existing boat but that is not how the proposed revision reads in your literature. This needs to be clarified.

The final proposed change I disapprove of is the elimination of outgrants for stairs/steps. Many docks are located along shorelines that are very steep with unstable footing that creates a safety concern for persons accessing private docks. This is particularly important for those dock owners/visitors who are of an advanced age, very young children, persons with physical limitations, or someone wanting to carry heavy and/or bulky items to and from their dock.

Thank you for taking into consideration these comments as you work toward finalization of the update to the Table Rock Lake Shoreline Management Plan. Please feel free to contact me should you have any questions.
